## USF FACES PITTSBURGH IN KEY HOMECOMING SHOWDOWN AT RJS

The University of South Florida football team (5-3, 1-2 BIG EAST) returns home for the first time since Oct. 7 to face Pittsburgh (6-2, 2-1 BIG EAST) in a key conference showdown for the Bulls ... This weekend's game also marks Homecoming 2006 for USF ... The contest will be seen as part of the BIG EAST Conference Game of the Week package (seen locally on ABC-28 WFTS) with Dave Sims (play-by-play), John Congemi (color analyst) and Sarah Kustok (sideline) ... The game can also be heard live on the Bulls' Network, in addition to the internet at [www.GoUSFBulls.com](http://www.GoUSFBulls.com), and on XM Satellite Radio with Jim Louk (play-by-play), Mark Robinson (color analyst) and Mike Pepper (sideline) ... Saturday's game is the first of USF's final two-game homestand ... Following the contest with the Panthers, the Bulls will take on Syracuse in their home finale next Saturday (time TBA) ... USF will close out the season at Louisville (Nov. 18) and at West Virginia (Nov. 25) ... This weekend's meeting will be just the second between the Bulls and Pittsburgh at Raymond James Stadium ... The last time Pitt visited RJS (Dec. 4, 2004) it left with a 43-14 win a berth to its first-ever Bowl Championship Series berth ... The Panthers would take part that season in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl ... Saturday will also be Pitt's second trip to the "Sunshine State" in the last three weeks ... The Panthers defeated UCF 52-7 on Oct. 13 in Orlando ... For the second straight game, the Bulls look for their sixth win of the season, which would make them bowl eligible ... It would mark the third year (first was conditional), in its 10 years of collegiate competition, that USF would be bowl eligible, and the earliest in the season ... Last year USF defeated Cincinnati, 31-16, on Nov. 19 to become bowl eligible ... The Bulls look to get back on the winning track this week following a disappointing 23-6 loss to the Bearcats on Oct. 22 in Cincinnati ... The setback ended a two-game winning streak for USF and was its third loss in its last five games ... The Bulls were held to just 219 yards of total offense (127 yards passing and 92 yards rushing) ... Matt Grothe threw for just 47 yards on 11-of-21 passing ... Amp Hill caught the Bulls only touchdown pass of the night on an 11-yard reception from Pat Julmiste with 50 seconds left in the contest.

A LOOK AT PITTSBURGH

• Pittsburgh comes into its game with USF with a 6-2 record and a 2-1 mark in BIG EAST Conference games ... The Panthers have won four of their last five games, with the one loss coming against Rutgers, 20-10, on Oct. 21 at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh ... Pitt's only other loss of the season came at the hands of Michigan State (38-23) at Heinz Field on Sept. 16.

• Of Pittsburgh's eight games this season, only three of them have come outside the "Steel City" ... The Panthers are 3-0 on the road this year with wins over Cincinnati, 33-15, on Sept. 8; Syracuse, 21-11, on Oct. 7; and UCF, 52-7, on Oct. 13.

• This weekend's game is the first of two straight on the road for the Panthers ... Following Saturday's meeting with the Bulls, they will face UConn in Storrs on Nov. 11 ... Pitt will then have the exact opposite games than USF to close the season when they host West Virginia - in the "Backyard Brawl" - on Nov. 16 and then Louisville on Nov. 25 ... The Bulls will travel to Louisville on Nov. 18 and then to West Virginia on Nov. 25.

• Coming into the 2006 season, Pittsburgh boasted 21 players from the state of Florida, including two from the Bay area ... Redshirt junior defensive lineman Joe Clermond played his scholastic ball at Tampa's Chamberlain High School while fellow D-lineman, and redshirt senior, Charles Sallet played at Armwood.

• The Panthers' defense has been quite stingy all season long, allowing just 133.6 yards per game rushing and 161.2 yards per outing in passing.

• Pittsburgh quarterback Tyler Palko continues to be the top quarterback in the BIG EAST Conference ... Palko leads the league in passing yards per game averaging 228.8 per outing ... He also is tops in the conference in passing efficiency - and is second in the nation - with a rating of 180.3 ... He comes into the game having thrown for 1,830 yards on 130-of-187 passing and just three interceptions ... He has also thrown for 18 touchdowns on the year and run for another.

• The Panthers also boast's one of the top linebackers in the country in H.B. Blades ... Blades is the team's top tackler having recorded 97 stops on the year including 56 solo ... He was recently named a semifinalist for the Butkus Award which is given each year to the top linebacker in the nation, and a quarterfinalist for the Lott Trophy, given to the top defensive player in America.

LAST TIME OUT

• USF ended a two-game losing streak on Oct. 22 with a disappointing 23-6 loss to Cincinnati on national TV (ESPN) ... The Bulls' six points were the lowest point total this season, just one-point shy of the seven scored at Kansas (13-7) on Sept. 23 ... Had back-up quarterback Pat Julmiste not connected on an 11-yard pass play with Amp Hill with 50 seconds remaining, USF would have suffered its second shutout in its last nine games after having not been shutout in its first 99 collegiate contests' (the Bulls were handed a 14-0 loss by North Carolina State on Dec. 31, 2005 in the Meineke Car Care Bowl).

• The USF-Cincinnati game marked the second coldest temperature at kickoff that USF has played a game (45 degrees) ... The Bulls played at UConn November 26, 2006 with a temperature of 33 ... The temperature dipped into the 20s by the end of the game ... USF lost that game, but won two games with a temperature of 50 or below, including an October 28, 2000 win (21-13) at UConn when the Huskies still played in Storrs (48 degrees), and a 21-16 win at Memphis (46 degrees) November 29, 2003.

• The Bulls managed to record just 219 yards in total offense, including just 92 yards on 29 carries on the ground ... It was the second time this season that USF didn't reach 100 yards in rushing (92 yards on 25 carries vs. Rutgers Sept. 29).

• USF's scoreless first quarter was the fifth scoreless first quarter for the Bulls this season ... It is the second time this season USF has been scoreless for the entire first half ... The first time came at Kansas, Sept. 23.

• Cincinnati's safety in the first quarter was the first time USF allowed a safety since the game at Connecticut last season (Nov. 26, 2005).

• Matt Grothe had the roughest game of his collegiate career, throwing for just 47 yards on 11-of-21 passing and one interception ... The one pick that Grothe threw in the third quarter was his first since the Rutgers game Sept. 29 ... He did not throw an interception in the last two games - at North Carolina (Oct. 14) and against UConn (Oct. 7).

FIRST THINGS FIRST

• Defensive end Josh Julmiste made his first career start against the Bearcats in place of Jarriett Buie, who did not travel with the team.

• George Selvie's first quarter sack tied him for the team lead this season with 4.5 (also Alan Cray).

• USF did not open with a tight end, the first time it has done so this year. The Bulls opened with four wide receivers, including the first start this season for Taurus Johnson.

RED-ZONE RECOVERY

• In USF's first four games, the offense struggled with red-zone efficiency, scoring just eight times in 15 trips inside the 20-yard line ... In the last four games, the Bulls are 14-for-15, with 12 touchdowns and two field goals.

BACK-TO-BACK 100'S

• With his 108-yard rushing outburst against Connecticut on Oct. 7, Benjamin Williams was the first USF player not named Andre Hall who had a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2003 when Vince Brewer had 105 vs. Charleston Southern.

• Now, in back-to-back games, the Bulls have had two players surpass the 100-yard mark when Ricky Ponton did it with 101 yards against North Carolina on Oct. 14.

• With Ricky Ponton's 101-yard rushing game at North Carolina on the heels of Benjamin Williams' 108-yard game, USF had two different players combine for back-to-back 100 yard games for the first time since September 2000, when Rafael Williams (122) and Marquet Blackwell (132) did so.

A USF WIN WOULD ...

• Make USF bowl eligible for the second straight year and third time in its short 10-year history ... In addition, it would be the earliest that the Bulls have even been bowl eligible.

• Be the Bulls' first-ever win over Pittsburgh at Raymond James Stadium and end a two-game series winning streak by the Panthers.

• Even the series between USF and Pittsburgh at two games apiece and tie the series at RJS at 1-1.

• Be USF's third win in its last four games.

• Bring USF's all-time record to 67-42.

A USF LOSS WOULD ...

• Be the second straight loss for USF and also keep the Bulls winless against Pittsburgh at Raymond James Stadium.

• Be the third straight loss to the Panthers since USF's 35-26 upset of Pitt on Sept. 8, 2001 at Heinz Field.



- Be USF's fourth loss in its last six games.

- Bring USF's all-time record to 66-43.

**BULLS LOOK TO ACHIEVE ANOTHER MILESTONE**

- USF needs one victory in its final four games to become bowl eligible, and it would mark the third time USF has qualified for a bowl bid ... In 2002, a year before becoming a member of Conference USA, the Bulls finished 9-2 with the only losses coming at Oklahoma and at Arkansas ... But as an independent at the time, USF had few options and had to rely on a "conditional bid" to the Hawaii Bowl .. The "condition" was that Cincinnati needed to defeat East Carolina in the final game of the season, leaving C-USA one team short of filling its bowl commitments ... But East Carolina won, and the Bulls stayed home at 9-2.

- In 2005, as a member of the BIG EAST, USF became bowl eligible in its ninth game of the season, when a 31-16 win over Cincinnati on Nov. 19 pushed the Bulls' record to 6-3 ... After finishing 6-5, USF received its first-ever bowl bid to the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

- If the Bulls should win this week and become bowl eligible, it will match the earliest USF has clinched that status.

**QB BATTLE ENTERING 2006**

- USF's quarterback situation coming into the 2006 season had certainly been up in the air ... Pat Julmiste got the start against McNeese State, however gave way to redshirt freshman Matt Grothe in the second quarter ... Grothe played until the final series of the game when transfer Grant Gregory saw his first collegiate action.

- Of the three, Julmiste, Grothe, and Gregory, Julmiste is the only one that had collegiate experience entering this year's season opener against the Cowboys ... Through the McNeese State game, Julmiste started in 24 of 30 games for the Bulls including 22 of 24 over the past two years ... Currently, after playing in the final five minutes of the Cincinnati game on Oct. 22, Julmiste has thrown for 3,586 career yards and has completed 282-of-582 passes with 17 touchdowns and 23 interceptions.

- Grothe redshirted last season and served as a scout team QB, and Gregory transferred to USF after redshirting his freshman year at Indiana.

- Matt Grothe became the eighth USF quarterback to start a game in its 10-year history when he got the starting nod against Florida International on Sept. 9 ... Here is what other USF quarterbacks have done in their first career starts:

**▶ INSTANT RELPAY**

**THE OBJECTIVE**

The Big East's instant replay system is designed to allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed and corrected during all Conference and non-conference home games.

**THE STANDARD**

There must be indisputable video evidence for an officiating call to be changed by a Replay Official working from the press box. The replay system will not guarantee that all officiating mistakes are corrected.

**THE SOURCE**

During televised games, all reviewable video will come directly from the television network broadcasting the game (ABC Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN Plus Television, etc.). In non-televised games, all reviewable video will come directly from four in house video cameras. The review process will never use both television and in-house cameras in any one game.

**THE PROCESS**

The BIG EAST Conference Instant Replay System is not the NFL Model. A review can be triggered by the Replay Official in the press box, or the head coach on the field. The Replay Officials will have available to them the video coming directly from the television network broadcasting the game or from four in-house video cameras. The DVSPORT Digital Replay software will be used for all reviews. Unlike the NFL, there is no limit to the number of plays that can be reviewed by the replay official. Coaches, however, are limited to one challenge per game. A team is subject to a loss of timeout if the coaches' challenge is upheld.

**THE PLAYS**

Reviewable

The following plays are subject to review under Big East instant replay:

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
  - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line.
  - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at side line, goal line and end line.
  - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds.
  - d. Recovery of loose ball in or out of bounds.
  - e. A loose ball touching a sideline, goal line or an end line.
2. Passing Plays:
  - a. Pass ruled complete/incomplete/intercepted in the field of play and end zones.
  - b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver.
  - c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player.
  - d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, the play is finalized).
  - e. Illegal forward pass beyond the line of scrimmage.
  - f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handling after change of possession.
  - g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
3. Other Detectable Infractions:
  - a. Runner ruled not down.
  - b. Forward progress with respect to first down.
  - c. Touching of a kick.
  - d. Number of players on field.
  - e. Kicker beyond line of scrimmage on a kick.
  - f. Clock adjustments
  - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays

**THE GROWTH OF GROTHE**

• Freshman quarterback Matt Grothe has shown steady improvement in his eight collegiate games and his seven-straight starts ... He has also started to make steps establishing himself in USF's record books.

• Grothe's 302 passing yards at UCF on Sept. 16 established a new USF freshman record, eclipsing Marquel Blackwell's 239-yard game against New Haven in 1999 ... Blackwell also had a 238-yard game that same year against Liberty.

• Grothe also has the top-six rushing games by a freshman quarterback in USF history ... Grothe equaled the record mark he set for a freshmen QB with his 82 yards against Connecticut on Oct. 7 ... He also scampered for 82 yards against Florida International on Sept. 9 in his first career start ... Blackwell had held the record with 57 yards against Southwest Texas State in 1999 ... The following are Grothe's rushing performances of 50-plus yards this season:

• Grothe's 302 yards passing against UCF on Sept. 16 also marked the first time a USF QB has eclipsed 300 since Pat Julmiste - Grothe's current back-up - did it with 324 yards in a double overtime win at TCU on Sept. 25, 2004.

• Grothe completed his ninth touchdown pass of the season with a 21-yard TD pass to S.J. Green with 12:03 left in the first half at North Carolina on Oct. 14 ... That completion surpassed USF's total number of TD passes last year (8).

• Grothe has led the Bulls from behind to win four games this season and nearly pulled off the feat in two others ... Trailing 13-7 against Kansas on Sept. 23, Grothe and USF got the ball back on its own 39-yard line with 1:06 left in the contest ... He would drive the Bulls to the Kansas 27-yard line before throwing an interception on third down as time expired ... One week later, on Sept. 29, USF would find themselves trailing 19-14 at the beginning of the fourth quarter and then 22-14 with 7:02 left ... The Bulls would move the ball 55 yards to the Rutgers' 31-yard line before Grothe would fumble with 5:26 remaining ... The rookie would get another shot, this time taking USF 66 yards in eight plays over 2:17 seconds and throwing a 16-yard TD strike to Ean Randolph ... The Bulls would go for the two-point conversion, however the attempt was no good.

**GROTHE GARNERS MIDSEASON KUDOS**

- ESPN.Com said this about Matt in it's BIG EAST Midseason Report on Oct. 11 ... *Biggest Surprise* - Nobody expected USF quarterback Matt Grothe to emerge as a dynamic two-way threat this soon. The redshirt freshman wasn't even the starter for the opener against McNeese State, but he replaced Pat Julmiste in that game and sparked the first of three straight comeback victories. Grothe ranks 12th in the country in total offense (264.0 yards per game). He has passed for 1,388 yards and nine touchdowns and run for 460 yards and seven touchdowns, accounting for more than 70 percent of the Bulls' offense. USF (5-2, 1-1) is only a few plays away from being unbeaten.

• Whether you measure by fewest seniors or most first-year USF players, the Bulls may have their youngest team ever ... The only one that compares is the 1997 team, USF's first-ever season ... In looking at the senior class, only seven of the 11 players arrived at USF with a scholarship, while the remaining five enrolled as walk-ons (This does not account for Tavarious Robinson, who may use a redshirt season) ... That ranks among the fewest scholarship players for a senior class in the nation.

• Looking at the USF roster from the first-time player perspective, it is noteworthy that 22 players saw their first-ever action for the Bulls in the season opener against McNeese State on Sept. 2 ... Nine players earned their first-ever collegiate start, including five on offense and four on defense.

**THED WATSON NAMED TO OUTLAND TROPHY WATCH LIST**

• Offensive tackle Thed Watson is the first player at USF to be named to the Outland Trophy Watch List which is given to the best interior lineman in college football ... Watson enters his second, and final year at USF - after transferring from Northwest Mississippi Community College prior to the 2005 season - had a stellar junior campaign en route to All-BIG EAST Conference honors ... He earned a starting job at left tackle with an impressive back-up effort in the season opener at Penn State on Sept. 3 ... The first of eight starts came a week later against Florida A&M.

The award is chosen by the Football Writers Association of America and is the third oldest trophy in college football behind the Heisman Trophy and the Maxwell Award ... Lee Roy Selmon, President, USF Foundation Partnership for Athletics, won the 1975 Outland Trophy at the conclusion of his senior year at the University of Oklahoma ... He was the No. 1 overall pick by the expansion Tampa Bay Buccaneers and would go on to be the only player in Bucs history to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

**NICHOLAS READY FOR A BIG, BIG EAST SEASON**

As planned Stephen Nicholas has been a force during his senior year on the defensive side of the ball ... He was third on the team last year in tackles with 79 (49 UT, 30 AT).

Nicholas also comes into the 2006 season after leading the team last season in tackles for losses ... He registered 15.5 for negative 69 yards ... He was one-half a tackle ahead of teammate Ben Moffitt (15 TFL, negative 47 yards) ... Nicholas was third in the BIG EAST in 2005 in TFL.

Nicholas had his best outing of the season, and the second best of his career at USF, in the loss to Kansas on Sept. 23 ... The senior logged a game-high 15 tackles, including 10 for a loss ... His tackle total was the second most of his career, just one behind the 16 he recorded against Memphis on Nov. 20, 2004.

Nicholas also paced the Bulls in tackles against McNeese State with seven, including six solo ... He also had one tackle for a loss and a pass broken up ... Nicholas also recorded seven stops against Rutgers on Sept. 29 and Connecticut last weekend.

**NICHOLAS NAMED TO BUTKUS AWARD WATCH LIST ...**

For the third consecutive year, Stephen Nicholas has been named to the Butkus Award Watch List compiled by the Downtown Athletic Club of Orlando ... Nicholas is one of just six players from the BIG EAST to be named to the list ... In addition to the Bulls' senior linebacker, H.B. Blades (Pittsburgh), Nate Harris (Louisville), Kevin McLee (West Virginia), Corey Smith (Cincinnati), and Kelvin Smith (Syracuse) from the BIG EAST were also included on the list.

Nicholas is the sixth USF player who has been a Butkus candidate ... Maurice Jones in 2003 and Kawika Mitchell - twice in 2001 and 2002 ... Demetrius Woods and Vassay Marc also made the list in 1998 and 2000 respectively.

The list was trimmed to 10 semifinalists finalists on Oct. 19, with that list being cut to three on Nov. 9 ... Nicholas was not among the 10 to make the semis, however Pittsburgh's H.B. Blades did make the list ... The three semifinalists will be announced via national teleconference that will include players, coaches, Butkus Award officials, and media members ... The winner will be announced on Dec. 9 at the Butkus Award Gala in Orlando.

**... AND ALSO THE NAGURSKI LIST**

Nicholas also became the first player at USF to be named to the preseason Bronco Nagurski Watch List ... The award, sponsored by the Charlotte Touchdown Club and chosen by the Football Writers Association of America, is given to the best defensive player in college football ... Ben Moffitt was added to the list last season after his play in the Bulls win over Louisville.

• Moffitt had a standout game against Florida International on Sept. 9 recording eight tackles, all solo, and two tackles for a loss of four yards ... In addition, Moffitt had eight stops, including five solo, and one tackle for a loss against Kansas.

• Against UConn on Oct. 7, the two combined for 13 tackles, three tackles for a loss (-13 yards), two passes broken up and a sack for 10 yards.

• Moffitt leads the team in tackles this season with 72 (45 solo) while Nicholas is second with 69 (50 solo).

### VERPAELE RETURNS TO LINE UP

• Danny Verpaele was a welcome sight to an already solid defensive secondary at the beginning of the season ... Verpaele was tabbed a third team freshman All-American by The Sporting News at the conclusion of his rookie campaign in 2004 ... He looked forward to a banner year as a sophomore, however suffered a broken foot in August 2005 which ended his season.

• Verpaele started in seven of 11 games as a freshman and finished fourth on the team in tackles with 57, including six for losses, and two sacks.

• Verpaele comes into Saturday's game against the Panthers tied for eighth on the team in tackles with 22, including 15 unassisted.

### THE HEIR APARENTS

• There have been some extremely big shoes to fill this season in the Bulls backfield with the loss of USF's all-time leading rusher Andre Hall ... Although Hall played just two seasons for the Bulls he amassed an impressive 2,731 career yards and 24 rushing touchdowns (27 career TD's) in just 23 collegiate games.

• Moise (pronounced Moses) Plancher came into the McNeese State game, on Sept. 2, No. 1 on the depth chart despite never taking a live snap in a game after redshirting the 2005 campaign ... He unfortunately left the game prior to the end of the Bulls' first series with a knee injury ... He had just carried the ball four times rushing for 26 yards, including a 16-yard scamper for his longest of the game ... Plancher would find out on Sept. 5 that he would likely miss the remainder of the 2006 season with a ACL tear in his right knee.

• The backfield, however stepped up after Plancher's exit as three other Bulls rushed for better than 50 yards against McNeese State ... USF also scored four of its six touchdowns by way of the ground attack.

• Walt Smith finished the McNeese State game leading the Bulls in rushing yards with 70 on seven carries and two TD's ... Smith was a late addition to the 2005 roster after a junior college career at Ellsworth Community College ... Smith saw action in all 12 games last year, mostly on special teams and some spot time at cornerback where he recorded five tackles on the year.

• Benjamin Williams and Keeley Dorsey also impressed ... Williams ran for 54 yards on nine carries ... Dorsey rushed for 53 yards on two carries and scored a touchdown on the final play of the game.

• Williams had the first breakout game - of all the running backs - when he recorded 108 yards on 22 carries against Connecticut on Oct. 7 ... He also logged his first career rushing touchdown against the Huskies.

• Matt Grothe rushed for 82 of the Bulls 123 yards against Florida International on Sept. 9 ... He carried the ball 16 times and scampered for 5.1 yards per carry ... Grothe's yardage is the most logged by a USF quarterback since Pat Julmiste ran for 90 yards on 20 carries against Army on Oct. 16, 2004 ... Grothe had another solid outing running the ball against UCF logging 73 yards on 21 carries.

• Ricky Ponton returned after a six-game suspension to rush for 101 yards on 17 carries and scored two touchdowns against North Carolina on Oct. 14 ... Ponton's 101 yard rushing against the Tar Heels - on the heels of Benjamin Williams 108-yard game against UConn on Oct. 7 - marked the first time that USF had two different players combine for back-to-back 100 yard games since September, 2000 when Rafael Williams (122) and Marquel Blackwell (132) did so.

### FOR THE RECORD

• USF is 51-28 in night games and has won 28 of the last 42 and 37 of the last 56 ... USF is 15-14 in day games and has won just eight of its last 17 ... USF is 2-2 in home day games.

• USF is 18-28 all-time on the road ... The Bulls lost their first three road games in 1997 (at The Citadel, 10-7, on Sept. 13 1997; at Western Kentucky, 31-3, on Sept. 27; and at Elon, 41-13, on Oct. 11) and are 15-18 since ... USF was 1-3 in 1997, 2-2 in 1998, 1-3 in 1999, 1-4 in 2000, 1-3 in 2001, 3-2 in 2002, 3-2 in 2003, 2-3 on the road during the 2004 season, and 2-4 away from home last year ... USF lost five straight road games - at Troy State (41-24) on Sept. 25, 1999, James Madison (13-3) on Oct. 30, 1999, Kentucky (27-9) on Sept. 9, 2000, Baylor (28-13) on Sept. 23, 2000, and Southern Miss (41-7) on Oct. 7, 2000 - prior to a win at UConn (21-13) on Oct. 28, 2000 ... Since then, Bulls have won 11 of their last 20 road games.

• USF is 26-12 when the temperature is 80 degrees or higher at kickoff ... USF is 22-3 at home when the temperature is 80 degrees or better ... The Bulls are 20-2 at Raymond James Stadium when it is 80 degrees, losing only to Southern Miss (30-27) on Oct. 2, 2004 and to No. 23/23 Rutgers (22-20) on Sept. 29 ... Only 12 of USF's 35 games played in 80-degree heat or better were played on the road ... The Bulls are 5-7 away from home in 80-plus degrees.

• USF is 48-13 all-time at home and 42-10 at Raymond James Stadium ... The Bulls have won 28 of the last 35, 36 of the last 44, and 41 of the last 50 at home ... Western Kentucky was the first team to defeat the Bulls at

Raymond James Stadium, handing USF a 31-24 loss on Oct. 17, 1998 ... The only other team's to defeat the Bulls at Raymond James Stadium were:

- USF is 27-14 all-time following a loss and 24-9 following a loss since losing at Hofstra (50-30) on Oct. 24, 1998.

- USF is 46-9 when it scores first ... The first two losses were to Western Kentucky (31-3) in 1997 and 1998 (31-24) ... The Bulls took a 7-0 lead in the loss at Baylor (28-13) in 2000 when Marquel Blackwell connected with Scott McCready for a 29-yard catch and run ... USF took a 7-0 lead at Northern Illinois in the first week of the 2001 season before falling 20-17 on a field goal as time expired ... USF opened the 2003 season with a 7-0 lead at Alabama but lost 40-17 and led UAB 3-0, Nov. 22, 2003, but fell 22-19 ... Last year USF scored on its first possession against Pittsburgh before the dropping the decision to the Panthers.

- USF is 41-7 when leading after the first quarter, 50-6 when leading at the half, and 54-5 when leading after the third quarter ... Rutgers is the most recent team to come back and defeat the Bulls overcoming a small 14-10 disadvantage at the half en route to the win on Sept. 29 ... Pittsburgh also came back and defeat the Bulls outscoring USF 31-7 from the second quarter on - on Oct. 15, 2005 - after USF led 10-0 following one quarter ... Army came back in the fourth quarter, on Oct. 16, 2004, rebounding from a 28-14 deficit to defeat the Bulls 42-35 ... Drake (23-22) on Sept. 20, 1997, and Northern Illinois (20-17) on Aug. 30, 2001 in the season opener are the only other two teams to do that against USF.

- USF is 15-27 when it trails after the first quarter, 16-33 when trailing at the half, and 6-35 when trailing after the third quarter ... The Bulls won two games in 2004 when trailing after three quarters - at TCU (45-44, 2ot) on Sept. 25 and at UAB (45-20) on Nov. 3 ... The remaining four wins when trailing after three quarters were at Connecticut (21-13) on Oct. 28, 2000, against Southern Miss (16-13) on Oct. 12, 2002, against Cincinnati (24-17, ot) on Oct. 31, 2003, and against Florida International (21-20) on Sept. 9, 2006 ... This season, USF has trailed in all three games against McNeese State, FIU, and UCF.

- USF is 48-10 when its offense outgains the opponent ... The Bulls are 45-6 when rushing for more yards and 38-18 when passing for more yards.

#### USF VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Of USF's 12 opponents this season, four are either ranked or receiving votes in this week's Associated Press or ESPN/USA Today Top 25 polls ... In the AP Top 25, West Virginia is No. 3, while Louisville is No. 5 and Rutgers is No. 15 respectively ... In the ESPN/USA Today poll, the Mountaineers are No. 3 with the Cardinals following at No. 5, and Rutgers at No. 15 ... Pittsburgh received six votes in the AP poll and nine votes in the ESPN/USA Today poll.

- Since 2000 (USF moved into I-A in 2001), the Bulls have played 10 ranked I-A teams and own a 2-8 record ... The Bulls pulled out a decisive 29-7 victory over No. 25 (ESPN/USA Today) Bowling Green on Oct. 10, 2003 when the Falcons were coached by Florida Gator head man Urban Meyer.
