Bulls Conclude Regular Season With Trip To New York

TAMPA, Fla. (October 18, 2006) - The University of South Florida women's soccer team will (6-8-1, 3-6-0 BIG EAST) conclude the 2006 regular season with two games in New York as the Bulls travel to Jamaica, Queens, to play St. John's on Friday, Oct. 20, then to Syracuse on Oct. 22. Kickoff against the Red Storm is at 7 p.m. and the Bulls will take the field against the Orange at noon on Sunday.

Junior Lindsay Brauer continues to lead the Bulls offensively this season, recording 22 points from nine goals and four assists. Freshman Jaleesa Scott and junior Autumn Browning have matching stat columns with three goals and one assist apiece. Senior goalkeeper Casey Garrett made her 60th save of her senior season against Cincinnati (Oct. 15), recording three in the game. She has registered four shutouts this season and allowed 21 goals in 1312 minutes in net.

On Sunday USF takes the field in Syracuse to play the 3-11-3 Orange. SU is just two points behind USF in the conference standings, as both teams are playing this weekend for a bid into the conference tournament. The Orange enter the weekend after picking up their second win in the BIG EAST, a 1-0 victory over Seton Hall on Oct. 15. Their other conference win came on Oct. 6 at Providence.

Syracuse has a well-balanced offensive attack as six players have scored goals and five have tallied assists. Tessa McDougall leads the team with five points (1g, 3a) and teammates Sarah Vansickle and Molly McManus have each registered two goals. Amanda Arcuri and Samantha Hawn have two points apiece, all coming from assists.

The Bulls are currently sitting fifth in the conference with nine points due to their 6-8-1 overall and 3-6-0 BIG EAST record. Pittsburgh and Syracuse are trailing the Bulls with eight and seven points, respectively. Points are awarded three for a win, one for a tie and zero for a loss.

Five teams from each division will be selected for the 2006 BIG EAST Women's Soccer Championship. Four teams have already clinched an American Division BIG EAST Conference berth, including West Virginia (first-round bye), Marquette, Connecticut and St. John's. USF, Pittsburgh, Syracuse and Providence are all playing this weekend for the final bid into the tournament.

Bulls Recognize Accomplishments Of Five Players On Senior Day

TAMPA, Fla. (October 15, 2006) - The University of South Florida concluded its 2006 home schedule with a 1-0 loss to Cincinnati on Sunday, Oct. 15 at the USF Soccer Stadium.

The Bulls are now 6-8-1 overall and 3-6-0 in the BIG EAST conference while the Bearcats are 7-6-2 with a 3-4-1 conference record.

Prior to the final home game of the season, Coach T. Logan Fleck recognized the accomplishments of his five seniors: Jenna Ball, Michelle Buskey, Erin Dafeldecker, Casey Garrett and Toni Johnson.

The Bulls' ninth conference game of 2006 began with an early shot from team point-leader (22 points) Lindsay Brauer. The attempt from the top of the box was stopped by Bearcat keeper Andrea Kaminski, one of her two first-half saves. In the 37th minute, Cincinnati's Becky Imhoff scored her fourth goal of the season off a Melissa Bigg assist. Bigg sent a ball from the top left of the 18-yard box, through a pack of USF defenders to Imhoff, who was six yards from Bulls goalkeeper Casey Garrett. Imhoff squeezed the ball past Garrett and into the top left corner of the net for the first and only tally of the game. Bigg earned her second career assist on the play.

At halftime, the Bearcats had outshot the Bulls 6-4 and led 4-1 in corner kicks.

In the second half, the Bulls stepped up their game, matching the Bearcats' six shots, but could not find the back of the net as Kaminski saved four attempts, including one each from Brauer, Paulina McIntosh, Melanie Sutherland and Michelle Buskey.

Brauer, McIntosh, Garrett, Jenna Ball and Jeannette Dyer each played all 90 minutes of the game as Garrett registered her 60th save of the season and allowed the 48th goal of her three-year career at USF in her final home game.

Thirty-three substitutions were made in the game, allowing 16 Bulls and 18 Bearcats to tally game-time minutes.

Women's Soccer Takes No. 17 Louisville To Overtime

TAMPA, Fla. (October 13, 2006) - The University of South Florida women's soccer team took the No. 17 Louisville Cardinals to overtime following a scoreless regulation game Friday night at the USF Soccer Stadium.

A free kick by Louisville in the final minute of the first overtime, however, deflected off of a USF defender and into the back of the net for a 1-0 Cardinal victory.

The Cardinals are now 11-2-1 overall and 6-2-0 in the BIG EAST while USF drops to 6-7-1 and 3-5-0 in the conference.

Louisville began the game eager to attack USF as the Cardinals took their first shot eight seconds into the game and another in the third minute.

USF's first shot came in the 15th minute as Michelle Buskey's attempt, her fourth of the season, was saved by UofL keeper Joanna Haig. USF attacked again just one minute later as Autumn Browning sent a header into the hands of Haig.

Freshman AnnaLea Crowe registered her first-career shot on goal attempt in the 31st minute, following a corner kick from Lindsay Brauer.

At the half, with no tallies on the scoreboard, the Bulls and Cardinals each had three corner kicks and the UofL had outshot USF 11-5.

Freshman Laura Engel, who made her USF debut in the first half of the game, took her first-career shot in the 50th minute of the conference match up, one of just two USF shots in the second half. Freshman Jaleesa Scott registered the other, an on-goal attempt in the 46th minute.

Scoreless after 90 minutes, USF stepped on the field for its third overtime game of the 2006 season. The Bulls had back-to-back scoring attempts in the 97th minute, but Brauer's shot was saved by Haig and Buskey's sailed wide left.

With 45 seconds remaining in the game, Louisville's Amy Seng sent a free kick into a pack of players, including two Cardinals and one Bull. The ball was deflected toward the goal, where Garrett got a hand on the shot, but could not corral the ball before it found the back of the net.

Garrett ended the game with seven saves while Louisville's Haig made six. The Cardinals outshot the Bulls 20-9 and had two more corner kicks (5-3).

USF is 1-1-1 in overtime games this season, including a win over Pittsburgh (Oct. 8) and a tie with Florida Atlantic on Sept. 3.

Junior forward Lindsay Brauer registered her 20th point of the 2006 season against Seton Hall on Sept. 29. Brauer has scored eight goals and made four assists.
