## USF TAKES ON SYRACUSE IN KEY SENIOR DAY CONTEST

The University of South Florida football team (6-3, 2-2 BIG EAST) looks to win its second straight game on Saturday when it faces Syracuse (3-6, 0-4 BIG EAST) in the final home game of the 2006 season for the Bulls ... USF will also honor 11 seniors prior to the game in Senior Day festivities ... The game can be seen as part of the BIG EAST Conference Game of the Week package (seen locally on ABC-28 WFTS) - the second consecutive week that the Bulls will be featured - with Dave Sims (play-by-play), John Congemi (color analyst) and Quint Kessenich (sideline) ... The game can also be heard live on the Bulls' Network, in addition to the internet at [www.GoUSFBulls.com](http://www.GoUSFBulls.com), with Jim Louk (play-by-play), Mark Robinson (color analyst) and Mike Pepper (sideline) ... The contest can also be heard live on SIRIUS Satellite Radio channel 147 ... Following this weekend's home finale USF will hit the road for its final two games against Louisville (Nov. 18) and West Virginia (Nov. 25) ... The Bulls are coming off one their most impressive wins of the year last weekend with a 22-12 victory over Pittsburgh at Raymond James Stadium ... The victory made USF bowl eligible for the second straight year and the third time in the program's 10-year history (the first was conditional in 2002 when the Bulls were 9-2) ... It is also the earliest that USF has ever become bowl eligible ... The Bulls did it last season on Nov. 19 with a 31-16 win over Cincinnati, also at RJS ... USF recorded 377 yards in total offense last weekend against the Panthers (190 rushing, 187 passing), a drastic difference from its 219 yards of total offense (127 yards passing and 92 yards rushing) against the Bearcats on Oct. 22 in a 23-6 loss ... Matt Grothe threw for 180 yards on 19-of-25 passing and one touchdown for the Bulls in addition to leading the team on the ground as well with 51 yards on 12 carries and one score ... Amarri Jackson hauled in three catches for 46 yards and one TD, while Ean Randolph had six catches for 46 yards and S.J. Green brought in three for 45 yards

Bulls hold a 1-0 series lead defeating the Orange last season, 27-0, in the Carrier Dome ... The setback for SU was its worst loss of the year and its only shutout ... In addition, the shutout, for the Orange, was the first since Purdue held Syracuse scoreless, 51-0 on Sept. 5, 2004, in the season opener - a span of 19 games - and only the third shutout since 2001 when Miami (Fla.) defeated the Orange 59-0 ... The following are the all-time series results between USF and Syracuse:

A LOOK AT SYRACUSE

-Syracuse comes into Saturday's game with a 3-6 record and an 0-4 mark in the BIG EAST Conference ... The Orange last took the field in a 17-3 loss at Cincinnati on Oct. 28 ... SU started the season 0-2, however won three straight games - over Illinois (31-21), Miami (Ohio) (34-21), and Wyoming (40-34, 2ot) - before dropping its last four straight entering this weekend ... The Orange have dropped 11 straight BIG EAST Conference games with their last league victory coming against Boston College, 43-17, on Nov. 27, 2004 in the Carrier Dome.

-Quarterback Perry Patterson leads the Syracuse offense having thrown for 1,499 yards this year on 127-of-237 passing and 10 touchdowns ... Tom Ferron has been Patterson's main target, catching a team high 26 passes for 311 yards and two touchdowns ... Mike Williams, however, leads the team in receiving yards with 373 on 18 attempts and three TDs.

-Delone Carter paces the SU ground attack, rushing for 487 yards on 119 carries and four touchdowns ... Curtis Brinkley is the team's second leading rusher logging 419 yards on the year on 96 carries and one TD ... After Brinkley, no other player has rushed for more than 68 yards on the year (Taj Smith).

-Kelvin Smith is Syracuse's top defender pacing the team in tackles with 86 (40 solo) ... Jameel McClain - second on the team in tackles with 58 (27 solo) - is second in the BIG EAST in tackles for a loss with 12 ... He trails Pittsburgh defensive lineman - and Tampa native - Joe Clermond by just one-half of a tackle.

-Syracuse boasts just two players from the state of Florida, with neither coming from the immediate Tampa Bay area ... Senior cornerback Terrell Lemon played his scholastic ball at Miami's Carol City High School, while junior center Marvin McCall played at St. Augustine High School in North Florida.

**LAST TIME OUT**

• USF got back on the winning track last weekend with an impressive 22-12 win over Pittsburgh at Raymond James Stadium ... The win - which raised the Bulls' record in their Homecoming games to 7-3 - more importantly made them bowl eligible for the second straight year ... It is also the earliest that USF has become bowl eligible.

• The Bulls rattled Pittsburgh quarterback Tyler Palko with constant pressure during the afternoon ... Widely regarded as one of the most consistent, and better QBs in the country, Palko threw three interceptions on the day after only throwing three all season coming into the contest.

• The Bulls scored on their opening drive to jump out to a quick 7-0 lead less than five minutes into the game ... The touchdown on the opening drive (11 plays, 65 yards, 4:48) was the third opening drive for USF this season that resulted in a score.

• USF quarterback Matt Grothe threw for 180 yards on 19-of-25 passing and one touchdown ... He also led the team in rushing carrying the ball 12 times for 51 yards and one touchdown.

• Grothe completed his 10th touchdown pass of the season with a 46-yard pass to Amarri Jackson with 3:58 left in the third quarter ... It marked the fourth time this season Grothe has thrown for and rushed for a touchdown in the same game ... The touchdown reception was the second of the season for Jackson ... The 46-yard completion was the second-longest TD pass of Grothe's USF career (47-yard completion to Marcus Edwards vs. McNeese State - Sept. 2).

• USF's defense was clicking on all cylinders holding the Pittsburgh running game to just 55 yards on 23 attempts ... The Panthers came into the game averaging 146.5 rushing yards per contest ... In addition, Palko threw for 159 yards (11-of-23, 3 Int., 1 TD) well below the team's 241.1 yards per game average.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST**

• Freshman Aaron Harris started in place of nose tackle Allen Cray marking the first time this season Cray has not started.

• Jeremy Burnett recorded his first-career interception early in the third quarter.

• Mike Jenkins registered his first interception of the season and the third of his career, picking off Pittsburgh QB Tyler Palko with time winding down in the third quarter.

• USF recorded the team's first safety of the season following Palko's intentional grounding of the ball with 10:55 left in the fourth quarter. Richard Clebert pressured Palko to cause the safety. It was the first safety recorded by USF since Nov. 16, 2002 vs. Bowling Green.

**GIVING THANKS FOR NOVEMBER**

• The month of November has been pretty good to the Bulls during its short 10-year history ... USF comes into Saturday's game with Syracuse with a 23-8 record all-time in November, and is 12-4 since 2002.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

• A win on Saturday against the Orange will raise USF's home record to 5-1 which would mark the second straight year that it lost just one game at Raymond James Stadium, and the eighth time in 10 years that the Bulls have either gone undefeated or lost just one game.

• USF is 48-13 all-time at home and 42-10 at Raymond James Stadium ... The Bulls were an impressive 19-0 at home from 2000-02 ... The following is USF's all-time home records coming into this weekend:

**RED-ZONE RECOVERY**

• In USF's first four games, the offense struggled with red-zone efficiency, scoring eight times in 15 trips inside the 20-yard line ... In the last five games, the Bulls are 15-for-18, with 13 touchdowns and two field goals.

**BACK-TO-BACK 100'S**

• With his 108-yard rushing outburst against Connecticut on Oct. 7, Benjamin Williams was the first USF player not named Andre Hall who had a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2003 when Vince Brewer had 105 vs. Charleston Southern.

• Now, in back-to-back games, the Bulls have had two players surpass the 100-yard mark when Ricky Ponton did it with 101 yards against North Carolina on Oct. 14.



• With Ricky Ponton's 101-yard rushing game at North Carolina on the heels of Benjamin Williams' 108-yard game, USF had two different players combine for back-to-back 100 yard games for the first time since September 2000, when Rafael Williams (122) and Marquel Blackwell (132) did so.

**A USF WIN WOULD ...**

- Guarantee USF a winning record for the seventh time in the program's 10 years, and a non-losing season for the eighth time in 10 seasons.
- Mark the Bulls' second win over Syracuse, in the two-game series, and their first at Raymond James Stadium
- Give USF a one-loss record at home for the second straight year ... The Bulls will also have recorded either a one-loss or undefeated season at home for the seventh year.
- Be USF's fourth win in its last five games.
- Bring USF's all-time record to 68-42.

**A USF LOSS WOULD ...**

- Be the first loss to Syracuse, evening the all-time series at 1-1 ... It would also drop the Bulls to 0-1 against the Orange at home.
- Drop USF's home record to 4-2 at home, just the second two-loss season ever for the Bulls.
- Be USF's fourth loss in its last seven games.
- Bring USF's all-time record to 67-43.

**BULLS ACHIEVE ANOTHER MILESTONE**

• USF achieved another milestone last weekend in becoming bowl eligible ... It was also the earliest that USF has ever become eligible ... It is the second straight year - and the third time ever - that the Bulls achieved the feat.

• In 2002, a year before becoming a member of Conference USA, the Bulls finished 9-2 with the only losses coming at Oklahoma and at Arkansas ... But as an independent at the time, USF had few options and had to rely on a "conditional bid" to the Hawaii Bowl .. The "condition" was that Cincinnati needed to defeat East Carolina in the final game of the season, leaving C-USA one team short of filling its bowl commitments ... But East Carolina won, and the Bulls stayed home at 9-2.

• In 2005, as a member of the BIG EAST, USF became bowl eligible in its ninth game of the season, when a 31-16 win over Cincinnati on Nov. 19 pushed the Bulls' record to 6-3 ... After finishing 6-5, USF received its first-ever bowl bid to the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

• If the Bulls should win this week and become bowl eligible, it will match the earliest USF has clinched that status.

**QB BATTLE ENTERING 2006**

• USF's quarterback situation coming into the 2006 season had certainly been up in the air ... Pat Julmiste got the start against McNeese State, however gave way to redshirt freshman Matt Grothe in the second quarter ... Grothe played until the final series of the game when transfer Grant Gregory saw his first collegiate action.

• Of the three, Julmiste, Grothe, and Gregory, Julmiste is the only one that had collegiate experience entering this year's season opener against the Cowboys ... Through the McNeese State game, Julmiste started in 24 of 30 games for the Bulls including 22 of 24 over the past two years ... Currently, after playing most of the fourth quarter when Grothe went down with a right foot injury, Julmiste has thrown for 3,593 career yards and has completed 283-of-583 passes with 17 touchdowns and 23 interceptions.

• Grothe redshirted last season and served as a scout team QB, and Gregory transferred to USF after redshirting his freshman year at Indiana.

• Matt Grothe became the eighth USF quarterback to start a game in its 10-year history when he got the starting nod against Florida International on Sept. 9 ... Here is what other USF quarterbacks have done in their first career starts:

**▶ INSTANT RELPAY**

**THE OBJECTIVE**

The Big East's instant replay system is designed to allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed and corrected during all Conference and non-conference home games.

**THE STANDARD**

There must be indisputable video evidence for an officiating call to be changed by a Replay Official working from the press box. The replay system will not guarantee that all officiating mistakes are corrected.

**THE SOURCE**

During televised games, all reviewable video will come directly from the television network broadcasting the game (ABC Sports, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN Plus Television, etc.). In non-televised games, all reviewable video will come directly from four in house video cameras. The review process will never use both television and in-house cameras in any one game.

**THE PROCESS**

The BIG EAST Conference Instant Replay System is not the NFL Model. A review can be triggered by the Replay Official in the press box, or the head coach on the field. The Replay Officials will have available to them the video coming directly from the television network broadcasting the game or from four in-house video cameras. The DVSPORT Digital Replay software will be used for all reviews. Unlike the NFL, there is no limit to the number of plays that can be reviewed by the replay official. Coaches, however, are limited to one challenge per game. A team is subject to a loss of timeout if the coaches' challenge is upheld.

**THE PLAYS**

Reviewable

The following plays are subject to review under Big East instant replay:

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
  - a. Scoring Plays, including a runner breaking the plane of the goal line.
  - b. Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at side line, goal line and end line.
  - c. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds.
  - d. Recovery of loose ball in or out of bounds.
  - e. A loose ball touching a sideline, goal line or an end line.
2. Passing Plays:
  - a. Pass ruled complete/incomplete/intercepted in the field of play and end zones.
  - b. Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible receiver.
  - c. Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player.
  - d. Quarterback (Passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, the play is finalized).
  - e. Illegal forward pass beyond the line of scrimmage.
  - f. Illegal forward pass or illegal handling after change of possession.
  - g. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
3. Other Detectable Infractions:
  - a. Runner ruled not down.
  - b. Forward progress with respect to first down.
  - c. Touching of a kick.
  - d. Number of players on field.
  - e. Kicker beyond line of scrimmage on a kick.
  - f. Clock adjustments
  - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays

**THE GROWTH OF GROTHE**

• Freshman quarterback Matt Grothe has shown steady improvement in his nine collegiate games and his eight-straight starts ... He has also started to make steps establishing himself in USF's record books.

• Grothe's 302 passing yards at UCF on Sept. 16 established a new USF freshman record, eclipsing Marquel Blackwell's 239-yard game against New Haven in 1999 ... Blackwell also had a 238-yard game that same year against Liberty.

• Grothe also has the top-six rushing games by a freshman quarterback in USF history ... Grothe equaled the record mark he set for a freshmen QB with his 82 yards against Connecticut on Oct. 7 ... He also scampered for 82 yards against Florida International on Sept. 9 in his first career start ... Blackwell had held the record with 57 yards against Southwest Texas State in 1999 ... The following are Grothe's rushing performances of 50-plus yards this season:

• Grothe's 302 yards passing against UCF on Sept. 16 also marked the first time a USF QB has eclipsed 300 since Pat Julmiste - Grothe's current back-up - did it with 324 yards in a double overtime win at TCU on Sept. 25, 2004.

• Grothe completed his 10th touchdown pass of the season with a 46-yard pass to Amarri Jackson with 3:58 left in the third quarter last weekend against Pittsburgh ... Against North Carolina, on Oct. 14, Grothe's 21-yard connection with S.J. Green in the second quarter surpassed USF's total number of TD passes last year (8).

• Grothe has led the Bulls from behind to win four games this season and nearly pulled off the feat in two others ... Trailing 13-7 against Kansas on Sept. 23, Grothe and USF got the ball back on its own 39-yard line with 1:06 left in the contest ... He would drive the Bulls to the Kansas 27-yard line before throwing an interception

on third down as time expired ... One week later, on Sept. 29, USF would find themselves trailing 19-14 at the beginning of the fourth quarter and then 22-14 with 7:02 left ... The Bulls would move the ball 55 yards to the Rutgers' 31-yard line before Grothe would fumble with 5:26 remaining ... The rookie would get another shot, this time taking USF 66 yards in eight plays over 2:17 seconds and throwing a 16-yard TD strike to Ean Randolph ... The Bulls would go for the two-point conversion, however the attempt was no good.

GROTHE GARNERS MIDSEASON KUDOS

• ESPN.Com said this about Matt in it's BIG EAST Midseason Report on Oct. 11 ... *Biggest Surprise* - Nobody expected USF quarterback Matt Grothe to emerge as a dynamic two-way threat this soon. The redshirt freshman wasn't even the starter for the opener against McNeese State, but he replaced Pat Julmiste in that game and sparked the first of three straight comeback victories. Grothe ranks 12th in the country in total offense (264.0 yards per game). He has passed for 1,388 yards and nine touchdowns and run for 460 yards and seven touchdowns, accounting for more than 70 percent of the Bulls' offense. USF (5-2, 1-1) is only a few plays away from being unbeaten.

• Matt Grothe and Illinois wide receiver DaJuan Warren are the only two players in the country to have stats in passing, rushing, receiving and punting ... Grothe caught is first career pass against Rutgers on Sept. 29 after hauling in a 14-yard toss from S.J. Green ... On the year, he has thrown for 1,435 yards on 115-of-186 passing and nine touchdowns, rushed for 482 yards on 113 carries and seven TDs and has logged two punts for 53 yards.

PITCHING A SHUTOUT

• For the second time in as many seasons, the USF offensive line held the nation's individual sack leader without a sack ... The Bulls did it last year against Louisville's Elvis Dumervil and again on Sept. 9 against FIU's Antwan Barnes ... Barnes came into the USF game with four sacks in FIU's first game of the season at Middle Tennessee.

BRING IT BACK

• Ean Randolph enters Saturday's game seventh in the nation in punt returns (16.6 ypr), but the feat would be even more impressive if he didn't have THREE touchdowns called back by penalties in the first two games of the season ... The first came in the season opener vs. McNeese State on Sept. 2 and two more came vs. FIU on Sept. 9 ... He did get one TD without penalty (76 yards) in the FIU game, making him just the second player in USF history to return a punt for a TD ... DeAndrew Rubin did it four times between 1999-2002 ... He picked up his second interception of the game, also in the first quarter ... It was the first time Williams has had two interceptions in one game ... The last time a USF player had two interceptions in one game was Sidney Simpson vs. East Carolina on Nov. 13, 2004.

- Trae Williams' interception with time winding down in the game was his sixth of the season, tying J.R. Reed (2002) for second-most by a USF player in a single season.

- Williams comes into Saturday's game sixth on the team in tackles with 39, including 23 solo.

**A LACK OF SENIORITIS**

- Whether you measure by fewest seniors or most first-year USF players, the Bulls may have their youngest team ever ... The only one that compares is the 1997 team, USF's first-ever season ... In looking at the senior class, only seven of the 11 players arrived at USF with a scholarship, while the remaining five enrolled as walk-ons (This does not account for Tavarious Robinson, who may use a redshirt season) ... That ranks among the fewest scholarship players for a senior class in the nation.

- Looking at the USF roster from the first-time player perspective, it is noteworthy that 22 players saw their first-ever action for the Bulls in the season opener against McNeese State on Sept. 2 ... Nine players earned their first-ever collegiate start, including five on offense and four on defense.

- Offensive tackle Thed Watson is the first player at USF to be named to the Outland Trophy Watch List which is given to the best interior lineman in college football ... Watson enters his second, and final year at USF - after transferring from Northwest Mississippi Community College prior to the 2005 season - had a stellar junior campaign en route to All-BIG EAST Conference honors ... He earned a starting job at left tackle with an impressive back-up effort in the season opener at Penn State on Sept. 3 ... The first of eight starts came a week later against Florida A&M.

- The award is chosen by the Football Writers Association of America and is the third oldest trophy in college football behind the Heisman Trophy and the Maxwell Award ... Lee Roy Selmon, President, USF Foundation Partnership for Athletics, won the 1975 Outland Trophy at the conclusion of his senior year at the University of Oklahoma ... He was the No. 1 overall pick by the expansion Tampa Bay Buccaneers and would go on to be the only player in Bucs history to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

**NICHOLAS READY FOR A BIG, BIG EAST SEASON**

- As planned Stephen Nicholas has been a force during his senior year on the defensive side of the ball ... He was third on the team last year in tackles with 79 (49 UT, 30 AT).

- Nicholas also comes into the 2006 season after leading the team last season in tackles for losses ... He registered 15.5 for negative 69 yards ... He was one-half a tackle ahead of teammate Ben Moffitt (15 TFL, negative

• Nicholas had his best outing of the season, and the second best of his career at USF, in the loss to Kansas on Sept. 23 ... The senior logged a game-high 15 tackles, including 10 for a loss ... His tackle total was the second most of his career, just one behind the 16 he recorded against Memphis on Nov. 20, 2004.

• Nicholas also paced the Bulls in tackles against McNeese State with seven, including six solo ... He also had one tackle for a loss and a pass broken up ... Nicholas recorded seven stops against Rutgers on Sept. 29 and Connecticut on Oct. 7.

### A LITTLE SACK TIME

• Stephen Nicholas comes into this weekend's game tied for the team lead in sacks with 4.5 ... With his two sacks in the first half against Pittsburgh last Saturday, Nicholas moved into a tie for second all-time in career tackles for loss at USF (47.5 with Terrence Royal 2002-05). The school record is 48 - held by Greg Walls (1999-02). His two sacks gives Nicholas 4.5 for the season and 17 for his career - tying him for third at USF with Shawn Hay (1997-02) for sacks in a career.

### NICHOLAS NAMED TO BUTKUS AWARD PRESEASON WATCH LIST ...

• For the third consecutive year, Stephen Nicholas has been named to the Butkus Award Preseason Watch List compiled by the Downtown Athletic Club of Orlando ... Nicholas is one of just six players from the BIG EAST to be named to the list ... In addition to the Bulls' senior linebacker, H.B. Blades (Pittsburgh), Nate Harris (Louisville), Kevin McLee (West Virginia), Corey Smith (Cincinnati), and Kelvin Smith (Syracuse) from the BIG EAST were also included on the list.

• Nicholas is the sixth USF player who has been a Butkus candidate ... Maurice Jones in 2003 and Kawika Mitchell - twice in 2001 and 2002 ... Demetrius Woods and Vassay Marc also made the list in 1998 and 2000 respectively.

• The list was trimmed to 10 semifinalists finalists on Oct. 19, with that list being cut to three on Nov. 9 ... Nicholas was not among the 10 to make the semis, however Pittsburgh's H.B. Blades did make the list ... The three semifinalists will be announced via national teleconference that will include players, coaches, Butkus Award officials, and media members ... The winner will be announced on Dec. 9 at the Butkus Award Gala in Orlando.

### ... AND ALSO THE NAGURSKI LIST

• Nicholas also became the first player at USF to be named to the preseason Bronco Nagurski Watch List ... The award, sponsored by the Charlotte Touchdown Club and chosen by the Football Writers Association of America, is given to the best defensive player in college football ... Ben Moffitt was added to the list last season after his play in the Bulls win over Louisville.

• It's no secret that USF linebackers Stephen Nicholas and Ben Moffitt are forces to be reckoned with in the BIG EAST Conference ... The two entered the 2006 season as one of the top returning duo's in the BIG EAST in tackles for losses ... Last season Nicholas was third in the league in TFL's with 15.5 for 69 yards (1.29 TPG) ... Moffitt also recorded 15 hits behind the line of scrimmage for 47 yards (1.25 TPG) ... The following are the BIG EAST's 2005 leaders in tackles for losses:

• Nicholas and Moffitt were two of the top three tacklers for the Bulls against McNeese State on Sept. 2 ...

Nicholas finished the game with seven stops while Moffitt had four, including three solo.

- Moffitt had a standout game against Florida International on Sept. 9 recording eight tackles, all solo, and two tackles for a loss of four yards ... In addition, Moffitt had eight stops, including five solo, and one tackle for a loss against Kansas.

- Against UConn on Oct. 7, the two combined for 13 tackles, three tackles for a loss (-13 yards), two passes broken up and a sack for 10 yards.

- Moffitt leads the team in tackles this season with 81 (54 solo) while Nicholas is second with 72 (54 solo).

#### **VERPAELE RETURNS TO LINE UP**

- Danny Verpaele was a welcome sight to an already solid defensive secondary at the beginning of the season ... Verpaele was tabbed a third team freshman All-American by The Sporting News at the conclusion of his rookie campaign in 2004 ... He looked forward to a banner year as a sophomore, however suffered a broken foot in August 2005 which ended his season.

- Verpaele started in seven of 11 games as a freshman and finished fourth on the team in tackles with 57, including six for losses, and two sacks.

- Verpaele comes into Saturday's game against the Orange ninth on the team in tackles with 23, including 15 unassisted.

#### **THE HEIR APARENTS**

- There have been some extremely big shoes to fill this season in the Bulls backfield with the loss of USF's all-time leading rusher Andre Hall ... Although Hall played just two seasons for the Bulls he amassed an impressive 2,731 career yards and 24 rushing touchdowns (27 career TD's) in just 23 collegiate games.

- Moise (pronounced Moses) Plancher came into the McNeese State game, on Sept. 2, No. 1 on the depth chart despite never taking a live snap in a game after redshirting the 2005 campaign ... He unfortunately left the game prior to the end of the Bulls' first series with a knee injury ... He had just carried the ball four times rushing for 26 yards, including a 16-yard scamper for his longest of the game ... Plancher would find out on Sept. 5 that he would likely miss the remainder of the 2006 season with a ACL tear in his right knee.

- The backfield, however stepped up after Plancher's exit as three other Bulls rushed for better than 50 yards against McNeese State ... USF also scored four of its six touchdowns by way of the ground attack.

- Walt Smith finished the McNeese State game leading the Bulls in rushing yards with 70 on seven carries and two TD's ... Smith was a late addition to the 2005 roster after a junior college career at Ellsworth Community College ... Smith saw action in all 12 games last year, mostly on special teams and some spot time at cornerback where he recorded five tackles on the year.

- Benjamin Williams and Keeley Dorsey also impressed ... Williams ran for 54 yards on nine carries ... Dorsey rushed for 53 yards on two carries and scored a touchdown on the final play of the game.

- Williams had the first breakout game - of all the running backs - when he recorded 108 yards on 22 carries against Connecticut on Oct. 7 ... He also logged his first career rushing touchdown against the Huskies.

- Matt Grothe rushed for 82 of the Bulls 123 yards against Florida International on Sept. 9 ... He carried the ball 16 times and scampered for 5.1 yards per carry ... Grothe's yardage is the most logged by a USF quarterback since Pat Julmiste ran for 90 yards on 20 carries against Army on Oct. 16, 2004 ... Grothe had another solid outing running the ball against UCF logging 73 yards on 21 carries.

- Ricky Ponton returned after a six-game suspension to rush for 101 yards on 17 carries and scored two touchdowns against North Carolina on Oct. 14 ... Ponton's 101 yard rushing against the Tar Heels - on the heels of Benjamin Williams 108-yard game against UConn on Oct. 7 - marked the first time that USF had two different players combine for back-to-back 100 yard games since September, 2000 when Rafael Williams (122) and Marquel Blackwell (132) did so.

#### **FOR THE RECORD**

- USF is 51-28 in night games and has won 28 of the last 42 and 37 of the last 56 ... USF is 16-14 in day games and has won just nine of its last 18 ... USF is 3-2 in home day games.

- USF is 18-28 all-time on the road ... The Bulls lost their first three road games in 1997 (at The Citadel, 10-7, on Sept. 13 1997; at Western Kentucky, 31-3, on Sept. 27; and at Elon, 41-13, on Oct. 11) and are 15-18 since ... USF was 1-3 in 1997, 2-2 in 1998, 1-3 in 1999, 1-4 in 2000, 1-3 in 2001, 3-2 in 2002, 3-2 in 2003, 2-3 on the road during the 2004 season, and 2-4 away from home last year ... USF lost five straight road games - at Troy State (41-24) on Sept. 25, 1999, James Madison (13-3) on Oct. 30, 1999, Kentucky (27-9) on Sept. 9, 2000, Baylor (28-13) on Sept. 23, 2000, and Southern Miss (41-7) on Oct. 7, 2000 - prior to a win at UConn (21-13) on Oct. 28, 2000 ... Since then, Bulls have won 11 of their last 20 road games.

USF took a 7-0 lead at Northern Illinois in the first week of the 2001 season before falling 20-17 on a field goal as time expired ... USF opened the 2003 season with a 7-0 lead at Alabama but lost 40-17 and led UAB 3-0, Nov. 22, 2003, but fell 22-19 ... Last year USF scored on its first possession against Pittsburgh before the dropping the decision to the Panthers.

• USF is 42-7 when leading after the first quarter, 51-6 when leading at the half, and 55-5 when leading after the third quarter ... Rutgers is the most recent team to come back and defeat the Bulls overcoming a small 14-10 disadvantage at the half en route to the win on Sept. 29 ... Pittsburgh also came back and defeat the Bulls outscoring USF 31-7 from the second quarter on - on Oct. 15, 2005 - after USF led 10-0 following one quarter ... Army came back in the fourth quarter, on Oct. 16, 2004, rebounding from a 28-14 deficit to defeat the Bulls 42-35 ... Drake (23-22) on Sept. 20, 1997, and Northern Illinois (20-17) on Aug. 30, 2001 in the season opener are the only other two teams to do that against USF.
