### GAME #27: UAlbany Great Danes (6-20) vs. New Hampshire Wildcats (8-13)

**DATE:** Tuesday, February 9, 2010; **TIME:** 7:07 p.m. Eastern.

**LAST GAME:** Boston University's **Carlos Strong** scored a season-high 24 points to pace three players in double figures in leading his team to a 68-53 victory over UAlbany on Feb. 6. The Terriers took control of the game at the start of the final period by ripping off 11 unanswered. Strong, a 6'3" senior, scored the first eight in that run, including a pair of three-point field goals from the left corner. He also added a slam dunk off a turnover and **John Holland** drilled another three-pointer for a 45-26 lead. UAlbany sliced the deficit to 50-39 when freshman **Mike Black** made two free throws. But the Terriers pulled away for good with a 9-4 run. Strong dunked with two hands after picking off an errant pass and **Jake O'Brien** canned a three-point field goal for a 59-43 cushion midway through the half. The Terriers, who were picked as the preseason favorite to win the conference title, built a 34-26 halftime lead. Boston U. led 18-16 before scoring eight of the game's next 10 points. Holland, who had 18 points, made a three-point play as he was fouled on a move in the lane. **Jeff Pelage** added an offensive rebound basket and Strong hit a floater in the lane for an eight-point margin. The Great Danes closed to within 28-25 when **Jake Lindfors**, who had seven points and seven rebounds off the bench, scored with a third-chance opportunity on the offensive glass. But **Corey Lowe** drilled a 15-footer from right of the lane and O'Brien (10 points) made two foul shots to regain the momentum. Black matched a career-high with 18 points for the Great Danes, who suffered their seventh consecutive setback.

**ABOUT UALBANY:** The Great Danes have been chosen to finish third in the America East Conference preseason poll. In 2008-09, UAlbany came alive in the conference postseason tournament after struggling during the regular season. Seven letterwinners return from last year's 15-16 squad. **Tim Ambrose**, a member of the preseason all-conference squad, was one of the league's top scorers at 14.3 points. The 6-foot junior added 5.1 rebounds and 2.6 assists. **Will Harris** contributed 12.9 points and 6.5 rebounds in his first season after transferring from Virginia. Ambrose and Harris were each named to the All-America East third team. **Brett Gifford**, a 6-foot-11 senior, will work in the post for the third consecutive year. He averaged 2.5 points and 3.9 rebounds, and blocked 24 shots. **Will Brown** is one of 10 head coaches to have won multiple America East championships.

**ABOUT NEW HAMPSHIRE:** The Wildcats were picked fifth in the America East Conference preseason poll. New Hampshire (8-13, AE 3-7) has dropped three in a row, including last Saturday's 57-54 last-second loss against Hartford. **Bill Herrion**, who is in his fifth season as head coach, has 290 career wins at the collegiate level. He coached Drexel to three conference championships and was an assistant at Boston University. **Alvin Abreu**, a junior guard, ranks ninth among the America East scoring leaders at 13.9 points per game. Abreu, a member of the 2008 conference all-rookie team, is scoring in double figures for the third consecutive season. He tallied his 1,000th career point against Hartford. **Tyrone Conley**, who appeared in all 30 games last year, adds 12.1 points per game and has made 45 three-point field goals. Conley netted 21 points in a recent 75-56 victory over Vermont. **Dane DiLiegro**, a 6-foot-9, 240-pound junior, is certainly one of the league's most improved players. He is scoring at a 9.7 clip, plus is third in the conference in rebounding (8.4 pg) and fifth in field goal percentage (.472). DiLiegro totaled 20 points and 16 rebounds vs. Boston U. earlier this season. **Radar Onguetou** averages 6.2 points and 6.3 rebounds, the sixth-best mark in the conference. The Cameroon native made 23 starts last year after missing most of 2007-08 with an injury. **Russell Graham** (4.2 ppg) is third in America East in assists at 4.4 per game.

**THE SERIES:** UAlbany and New Hampshire are meeting for the 21st time. The Great Danes have won 11 of the previous 20 matchups. In this year's first meeting on Jan. 13, UNH won its third straight in the series with a 67-59 victory at Lundholm Gymnasium. Dane DiLiegro totaled 13 points and 13 rebounds and Alvin Abreu scored 13. UAlbany's Will Harris totaled 20 points and 11 rebounds. The Wildcats swept the season series last year for the first time since 2005-06. UNH's Tyrece Gibbs had 20 points as his team broke away for a 64-56 win on Feb. 26. New Hampshire used a seven-point run to break a 49-49 deadlock. UNH's Abreu had 19 points to pace four players in double figures in a 78-59 victory at UAlbany on Feb. 15. The Wildcats shot a season-best 56.8 percent, including 12-of-20 from beyond the arc. In 2007-08, UAlbany's Brian Lillis had 19 points and Tim Ambrose added 14 in leading their team to an 80-59 triumph on Feb. 6. The Wildcats won the first meeting, 75-66, on Jan. 3. Gibbs had 14 of his 19 points in the second half. New Hampshire rallied from a 53-47 deficit with less than seven minutes remaining. Abreu added 11 of his 14 points in the final stanza. UAlbany won all three contests in the 2006-07 campaign, including a 64-47 decision in the America East Conference Tournament's quarterfinal round at Agganis Arena in Boston, Mass. Jamar Wilson had 21 points and Brent Wilson added 13. Jermaine Anderson led UNH with 15 points, while Radar Onguetou netted 11. Jamar Wilson had 23 points as his team held off the Wildcats, 71-64, during the regular season on Jan. 28. New Hampshire trailed 48-35, but regrouped behind Gibbs, who had 17 of his 21 points after halftime. In the first meeting on Jan. 3, Wilson had 12 of his 20 points in the second half in a 69-52 victory. New Hampshire's Anderson scored 18 and made four 3-pointers. The Great Danes posted a 67-54 triumph in the 2006 America East semifinals. Brent Wilson had 16 points on 7-of-8 shooting. The Wildcats won both regular-season games in overtime. Anderson and Mike Christensen combined for 11 points in the extra period in a 78-71 triumph on Feb. 23. Blagoj Janev scored 22 points and New Hampshire made 11-of-24 from three-point range in a 75-72 overtime win on Jan. 22.

**AMERICA EAST:** UAlbany is in its ninth year as a member of the America East Conference. Seventeen of the school's 19 intercollegiate teams compete for America East championships and NCAA post-season play. The America East basketball membership includes UAlbany, Binghamton, Boston University, Hartford, Maine, UMBC, New Hampshire, Stony Brook and Vermont. UAlbany elevated its entire athletics program to the Division I level in the 1999-00 academic year.

**BIG PURPLE GROWL HISTORY:** UAlbany fell to Boston University, 68-53, on Feb. 6 in the 13th annual Big Purple Growl game at SEFCU Arena. The University at Albany's Winter Homecoming featured a crowd of 4,000-plus for the sixth consecutive year. Big Purple Growl, traditionally a men's and women's basketball doubleheader, has averaged 3,772 fans in the event's 13-year history.

**ALL-TIME SCORERS:** UAlbany's Tim Ambrose became the 30th player in the program's history to score 1,000 career points on Feb. 3. The 6-foot junior needs five points to move past Jack Jordan (1968-71) into move into 29th place on the all-time scoring.

**HEAD COACH:** UAlbany's **Will Brown** is in his ninth season as head coach. Brown had led the program to a pair of America East Conference championships and two NCAA berths. He was named the 2006 New York State Basketball Coaches Association Coach of the Year after leading UAlbany to its first-ever America East crown. Brown was appointed to the position on March 13, 2002, after coaching on an interim basis for the final 20 games of the 2001-02 season. He has a 112-144 career record. Brown coached at Sullivan County Community College for three years. He led the Generals to a 30-2 record and an appearance in the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship in 2000-01. Brown, at age 38, is one of the youngest Division I head coaches in the nation. He was listed among the top college basketball coaches under age 40 by SI.com in the fall of 2006.

**SEFCU ARENA:** SEFCU, the largest credit union in the Capital Region, and the University at Albany announced on Nov. 1, 2006 a \$2.75 million commitment to name the university's Recreation and Convocation Center, in addition to promotional opportunities, for a 10-year period. The facility, now known as SEFCU Arena, is the home for UAlbany's men's and women's basketball teams. The SEFCU Arena will continue to expand its role as a major venue for community and sporting events.

**HOME FLOOR:** UAlbany's SEFCU Arena opened in December 1992. The on-campus facility has seating for 4,538. UAlbany has a combined 138-81 record in the arena. UAlbany averaged 2,826 fans in 14 home dates last year. SEFCU Arena has had six capacity crowds over the previous three seasons, including last year's America East Conference quarterfinal against Vermont.

**20-POINT MARK:** Senior forward **Will Harris** scored 20 or more points in three consecutive games after netting 20 against Florida Atlantic on Nov. 30. Harris (6'5") was the first UAlbany player since Associated Press All-America Jamar Wilson in February 2007 to accomplish this feat. Harris scored 20 points at New Hampshire on Jan. 13, the sixth time he has reached that total this season.

**ALL-DECADE:** Former UAlbany All-America guard **Jamar Wilson** has been named to the collegeinsider.com Mid-Major All-Decade team. Wilson, a two-time America East Conference player of the year, is one of 25 players on the squad. Wilson, who led the Great Danes to pair of NCAA appearances, is the school's all-time scorer with 2,164 points.

**PLAYING CHAMPIONS:** UAlbany tangled with defending national champion North Carolina on Dec. 30 at the Dean E. Smith Center. The Great Danes met the reigning champion for the second year in a row after taking on Kansas last season. In 2005-06, UAlbany faced both NCAA championship participants (Florida & UCLA) during the regular season. UAlbany went up against Syracuse in 2002-03 when the Orange and Carmelo Anthony made their run to the NCAA crown.

**UALBANY VS. RANKED TEAMS:** UAlbany met a nationally-ranked team for the seventh consecutive season with games against Syracuse (#25) and North Carolina (#9, AP). The Great Danes traveled to #23 Villanova to start last season. In 2007-08, Duke (#6) was the second-highest ranked opponent that the Great Danes have faced. UAlbany met No. 2 Connecticut in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. The Huskies rallied from a 12-point deficit in the second half to advance. UAlbany lost to UConn (#18) in 2006-07 and UCLA (#16) in 2005-06.

**POWER OPPONENTS:** UAlbany and North Carolina met for the first time on Dec. 30. UAlbany continues to add to its list of power conference opponents as a Division I program. The Great Danes have previously met Kansas (Big 12), Syracuse (Big East), Duke (ACC), UCLA (Pacific 10), Florida (SEC), Connecticut (Big East), Pittsburgh (Big East), Notre Dame (Big East), Villanova (Big East), Ohio State (Big Ten), Iowa State (Big 12), Virginia (ACC) and California (Pacific 10).

**BIG CROWDS:** UAlbany has played before crowds of 10,000 or more on 20 occasions at the NCAA Division I level. The opener against Syracuse at Carrier Dome was attended by 15,707 fans. More than 19,000 watched the Great Danes at North Carolina on Dec. 30. Kansas drew 16,300 to Allen Fieldhouse last year, the sixth largest the Great Danes have appeared before. In the 2006 NCAA first round vs. Connecticut, the attendance at the Wachovia Center was 19,990.

**ON THE REBOUND:** UAlbany followed a 20-plus point loss with a double-figure win for the first time since the 2000-01 season. The Great Danes lost to Siena by 29 and came back with an 18-point win at Pennsylvania. On Dec. 29-30, 2000, UAlbany lost to Utah State, 88-43, in the first round of the Gossner Foods Classic in Logan, Utah. The Great Danes defeated Cornell, 72-59, in the third-place game.

**CROSSTOWN RIVALRY:** UAlbany and Siena renewed their cross-town rivalry in 2001 at the Times Union Center, a downtown facility in the state capital. The two schools had not met since 1976-77. The Saints hold a 31-18 lead in a series that dates back to January 1940. The two schools are in the middle of a three-year agreement. The series has averaged 11,377 fans over the last nine years.

**CITY RIVALS:** UAlbany and Siena produced the second-largest crowd last year among city rivals who are teams from different conferences. More than 13,000 watched last year's annual meeting at the Times Union Center. Marquette and Wisconsin-Milwaukee had the most fans at their non-league game when 15,168 attended.

**SUNSHINE STATE:** The Great Danes made their second appearance in the state of Florida as a Division I program in November. UAlbany played in the 2005 2K Sports Classic against the host school Florida and Oakland. As a Division II program, UAlbany appeared in the 1997 Holiday Inn Calder Classic against Barry, the host team, and St. Thomas.

**ONE-POINTERS:** UAlbany improved to 12-8 all-time at the Division I level in one-point decisions following a 51-50 victory at American on Nov. 16. Tim Ambrose scored on a follow shot in the lane with 1:58 remaining to snap AU's 12-game win streak at Bender Arena.

**2K SPORTS CLASSIC:** UAlbany played host to the 2009 2K Sports Classic, benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer, Sub-Regional on Nov. 20-22 at SEFCU Arena. The Great Danes entertained Alcorn State, Detroit and Robert Morris during the three-day event. The Albany Sub-Regional tournament drew 7,832 fans. UAlbany began 2K Sports Classic play against Syracuse at the Carrier Dome on Nov. 9.

**FIRST GAME:** The Great Danes had six players appear in their first collegiate game on Nov. 9 against Syracuse. **Jake Lindfors**, who had four points and four rebounds, and **Logan Aronhalt** redshirted as freshman last year. **Mike Black**, **Derrek Tartt** and **Blake Metcalf**, who had four rebounds, are true freshman. **Fran Urli**, a native of Croatia, transferred from Panola College in Texas.

**2008-09 REVIEW:** The Great Danes put together another list of achievements for the fourth consecutive season. UAlbany registered 15-plus wins in four straight seasons for the first time since 1995. The Great Danes also became the first seventh seed to win an America East quarterfinal. In addition, UAlbany hosted the America East Championship for the first time and set an attendance record.

**SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS:** UAlbany starts its America East schedule on Jan. 7 against Binghamton and concludes the season with the America East Tournament on March 4-13. The non-conference schedule features defending NCAA champion North Carolina, a program that won its fifth national championship last year. The Great Danes will meet six opponents who made NCAA appearances last season.

**HOME SLATE:** Morgan State, last year's Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference champion, is among five non-league opponents who will play at SEFCU Arena. Yale (Jan. 3) will also travel to the Capital Region for the first time since 2000. Boston University, the league's preseason favorite, headlines the list of America East teams. The 13th annual Big Purple Growl & Ferocious Feast is Saturday, Feb. 6, 2010.

**ACROSS AMERICA:** Nine states are represented on the UAlbany basketball roster. UAlbany has five players from New York, three from Illinois and two from Ohio. The Great Danes have one high school standout from Missouri, Arizona, Arkansas, Indiana, Iowa and Pennsylvania. Fran Urli is a native of Zagreb, Croatia.

**TOP SCORER:** UAlbany's **Tim Ambrose** ranked ninth among the America East Conference leaders in scoring at 14.3 points per game as a sophomore. Ambrose, who scored in double figures 22 times, tied a school mark for points in one half (29) against Vermont. He earned third-team all-conference recognition.

**ALL-LEAGUE:** A third-team All-America East standout, **Will Harris** averaged 12.9 points and 6.5 rebounds in his first year with the program as a University of Virginia transfer. Harris ranked among the conference leaders in rebounding (7th) and scoring (10th). He recorded six double-doubles in points and rebounds.

**TRI-CAPTAIN:** Joining Tim Ambrose and Will Harris as a captain is senior **Brett Gifford**, a 6-foot-11 center. Gifford is the most seasoned Great Dane, having started 42 of 91 career games played. Gifford is among the program's top 20 all-time with 50 career blocked shots. He contributed 2.5 points and 3.9 rebounds as a junior.

**HEAD COACH'S SONS:** UAlbany's **Billy Allen** and **Logan Aronhalt** each played for his father as high school athletes. Allen's father, William, led Hamilton High to the 2004 Ohio Division I state championship.

Aronhalt's father, Scott, guided Zanesville High to the 1995 Ohio Division I state title. UAlbany head coach Will Brown also played for his father at Miller Place High on Long Island.

**MEDIA PRACTICE:** UAlbany conducted a simulated practice session for 15 Capital Region media members on Oct. 15 at SEFCU Arena. Head coach **Will Brown** and his staff spent 90 minutes, both on the floor and in the locker room, with the media. The session included a video scout, warm-up drills and stretching exercises, defensive concepts, full-court shooting instruction, the installation of an offensive set and a competition drill where the winners did not have to run.

**ALL-CONFERENCE:** UAlbany's **Tim Ambrose** and **Will Harris** were voted to the 2009 All-America East Conference third team. The Great Danes have produced 13 all-conference selections since joining the league in 2001-02. Jamar Wilson, a four-time all-league guard, was the 2006 and 2007 America East Conference Player of the Year.

**NATIONAL STATS:** UAlbany ranked seventh nationally among 330 teams in rebound margin at plus-8.7 per game. The Great Danes registered a 10-plus rebound total against 13 opponents. UAlbany also was 74th nationally in free throw percentage (.719).

**TELEVISION COVERAGE:** UAlbany is scheduled to make nine television appearances in 2009-10, including ESPN2 dates with defending national champion North Carolina (Dec. 30) and Syracuse. The Great Danes will be featured twice on the America East TV Network against Stony Brook (MSG Plus, Jan. 24 & Feb. 19). Time Warner Cable will televise five games, including Yale (Jan. 3), Vermont (Jan. 10), Hartford (Jan. 27), Boston U. (Feb. 6) and New Hampshire (Feb. 9). Rodger Wyland and John Quattrocchi handle the TW3 broadcasts.

**ONE THOUSAND:** UAlbany earned its 1,000th win as a basketball program on Dec. 20, 2005. The Great Danes have a 1,077-809 record in their 96th season of competition. UAlbany began varsity play in 1909-10 and competed at the NAIA, NCAA College Division, and NCAA Division II & Division III levels prior to 1999.

**GIANTS CAMP:** The National Football League's New York Giants have made the University at Albany its summer training camp home since 1996. UAlbany has played host to the longest stint of any Giants' camp, surpassing Pace University. The Super Bowl XLII champions were on campus for a record-setting 14th summer in 2009.

**OVERTIME HISTORY:** The Great Danes are 8-15 all-time in overtime games as a Division I program following a 70-68 loss at Central Conn. State on Dec. 12. UAlbany defeated Vermont, 56-52, in the 2009 America East quarterfinal round. UAlbany suffered a 68-64 loss against Boston U. in the 2008 America East quarterfinals. UAlbany posted a 63-60 victory at Central Conn. State to end a long losing streak in overtime affairs on Nov. 14, 2007. The Great Danes had dropped eight straight OT decisions, including a double-OT loss at Siena on Dec. 2, 2006. UAlbany reached extra periods in three games over a two-week stretch in the 2002-03. UAlbany lost to Stony Brook (2OT) and Northeastern (OT), but defeated Dartmouth in triple overtime.

## 2009-10 UAlbany Season Preview

UAlbany came alive in postseason play after going through a rugged regular season in 2008-09. The Great Danes, who became the first seventh seed to win a conference tournament quarterfinal, recorded 15-plus victories for the fourth season in a row.

"I thought the last six or seven games we improved," offers UAlbany coach **Will Brown**, whose team upset Vermont in the postseason. "But the problem was we couldn't put the ball in the basket. Perimeter shooting was a huge achilles heel for us."

The Great Danes have a 17-player roster that features four seniors, three juniors, two sophomores and eight freshmen. With a large roster, the coaching staff is hoping to improve upon a competitive environment.

"We wanted to make sure we have plenty of bodies," Brown states. "Certain guys were logging heavy minutes and not getting a ton of rest. That doesn't bode well in practice. It hurt the competitiveness of practice."

Brown continues, "We have more talent and more depth overall. There is more of an inside presence where multiple guys can score on the block. Our perimeter shooting has improved tremendously."

### UALBANY BY POSITIONS

**GUARDS:** The backcourt starts with **Tim Ambrose**, an explosive leaper with a solid build. The 6-foot junior can put points on the scoreboard at a quick pace. He was among the conference's top scorers at 14.3 points per game and reached double figures 22 times.

"He is one of the most feared scorers in the league," Brown states about the third-team All-America East Conference performer who also averaged 5.1 rebounds and 2.6 assists. "We just need to get him to continue to maintain his focus defensively."

**Mike Johnson** is the lone veteran point guard with proven ability. Johnson, who played in 30 games last year after transferring from Blinn College in Texas, accounted for 3.4 points and 2.8 assists. A good on-ball defender, he showed flashes of brilliance with a near triple-double at DePaul.

"The biggest adjustment he has made is he has really improved his perimeter shooting," Brown says. "His leadership ability and tenacity on defense is really going to impact us."

**Billy Allen** (6'6") and **Louis Barraza** (6'5") each saw significant minutes for the first time as collegians last season. Allen, who can play several positions, appeared in 29 games as a redshirt freshman following a successful return from back surgery.

"He's finally healthy and has regained his flexibility," Brown explains. "He has a high basketball IQ."

Barraza came off the bench as a junior college transfer. He scored at a 4.0 clip and made 22 three-point field goals. "Louis is a big-time shooter," Brown says. "He's got unlimited range and can really stretch the defense."

**Logan Aronhalt** (6'3") earned a medical redshirt after missing all of last season with a foot injury. A strong, physical guard, he played for his father on the high school level. Freshman **Ralph Watts** (6'5") was a first-team Class A all-state selection by the New York State Sportswriters Association.

**Mike Black** and **Derrek Tartt** were teammates at the high school level in Chicago. Black, a lead guard, received special mention all-state recognition by the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association (IBCA). Tartt attended Brewster Academy in New Hampshire last year. He was a runner-up for the Chicago High School Athletic League player of the year as a scholastic senior.

**FORWARDS:** Just as Ambrose is the focal point of the backcourt, the baseline centers around **Will Harris**, a 6-foot-5, 230-pound athlete. Harris contributed 12.9 points and 6.5 rebounds in his first season after playing two years at the University of Virginia.

Harris, who received an NCAA waiver for immediate eligibility one year ago, has six double-doubles, including an 18-point, 10-rebound performance in the conference tournament quarterfinals. He can play inside and outside.

"I thought he was as good as any player in the league before he hurt his knee," Brown says about his all-conference standout. "He needs to use his strength and athleticism to attack the basket and not settle for jump shots."

**Scotty McRae** (6'8") is a versatile athlete who needs to develop consistency. McRae, who is good at attacking the basket and takes advantage of his length, averaged 4.7 points and 3.4 rebounds in 21 appearances.

"I think he's learned from last year and he's matured," Brown offers about a player who is in his second year after coming from Eastern Wyoming College. "He oozes potential and ability. He is as talented as any player on our roster."

A pleasant surprise on UAlbany's team is **Fran Urli**, a 6-foot-8 forward from Croatia. Urli averaged 10.2 points and 7.1 rebounds in earning all-region honors at Panola College in Texas.

"He is an inside, outside frontcourt guy who can play the power forward or center spot," Brown says. "He can shoot the ball from the perimeter, handles the ball and has a good post-up game."

Redshirt freshman **Jake Lindfors** has added 20 pounds to his 6-foot-10 frame. Lindfors can step back to the three-point arc and presents matchup issues for the defense. **Gavin Glanton** (6'7"), the program's first recruit from Arkansas, was a second-team all-state selection.

**CENTERS:** UAlbany will make use of the talents of **Brett Gifford** (6'11") in the post for the third consecutive year. He averaged 2.4 points and 3.9 rebounds, plus blocked 24 shots as a junior. Gifford can shoot with either hand and has the experience of having played in 91 career games as a collegian.

"Giff" is the anchor of our defense," Brown states. "He does everything we ask of him, and he knows our system. His is a big reason why we have had success defensively and on the glass."

**Blake Metcalf** (6'9") and **John Puk** (6'10") represent the future at this position. Metcalf, an all-state center out of Indiana, accounted for 16.8 points and 12.4 rebounds at the prep level. Puk, an Iowa native who is expected to redshirt this season, is just scratching the surface after an all-conference senior campaign.

"Blake loves physical play," Brown says. "He is a block-to-block guy."

**OUTLOOK:** UAlbany is picked third in the conference preseason poll, but it is still hard to capture the team's true identity. "Teams will have to play us more honestly because we have more offensive weapons," Brown states. "I just sense these guys really like each other."
