America East Conference Champion, 2003, 2004, 2005 & 2007

UALBANY'S HEAD COACH

Scott Marr begins his tenth season as UAlbany's head coach. He has an 80-59 career record. Marr has guided the program four America East Conference championships and four NCAA Tournament appearances.

Marr has coached seven All-Americans and 51 all-conference players. Corey Small was selected in both the 2009 Major League Lacrosse and National Lacrosse League drafts.

Marr, the 2007 USILA Division I National Coach of the Year, led the Great Danes to their fourth America East championship three years ago. UAlbany registered its first-ever NCAA victory in a 19-10 triumph over Loyola before losing in overtime to Cornell in the quarterfinal round. The Great Danes posted a school-record 15-3 mark, defeated seven top-20 teams, and were ranked No. 2 for six consecutive weeks.

Coach Marr's 2006 squad reached the America East championship final for the fifth straight year. His team ranked third nationally in scoring offense at 11.73 goals per game. Marr led the Great Danes to their third consecutive America East Conference Tournament championship and NCAA berth in 2005.

Marr coached UAlbany to the program's first-ever NCAA Division I Tournament appearance in 2003. The Great Danes tied a then school record for wins with a 10-6 mark. UAlbany repeated as champions in 2004 by winning both America East tournament games on the road. Marr produced significant results in his second year as head coach. UAlbany captured the 2002 America East regular-season title.

GAME #2: UAlbany Great Danes (0-1) vs. Siena Saints (0-2)

DATE: Tuesday, March 2, 2010; TIME: 6:00 p.m. Eastern.

SITE: Albany, N.Y.; STADIUM: John Fallon Field (2,500).

ABOUT UALBANY: UAlbany was picked third in the America East Conference preseason coaches' poll. The Great Danes return 27 letterwinners from last year's 7-7 squad. **Brian Caufield** earned honorable mention All-America recognition and led the team in scoring with 24 goals and 27 assists. **Joe Resetarits** (34 goals, 9 assists) was named to the All-America East first team as a freshman. **Joe Pompo** and **Dave Brock** each accounted for 19 points. **Mark Cometti** and **Kyle Crotty** are among a group of veteran players in the midfield. **Mark Kelly**, a second-team all-conference selection, leads the defense, while goalkeeper **John Carroll** had a .496 save percentage as a freshman. Head coach **Scott Marr** is in his 10th season. He has led the program to four NCAA appearances.

ABOUT SIENA: The Saints are coming off a historic season in their program's history after winning the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championship and making a first-ever NCAA appearance. Head coach **Brian Brecht**, who is in his sixth season, has six returning starters on a team that has been picked to finish first in the MAAC preseason poll. Siena (0-2) is coming off an impressive 8-7 loss to No. 4 Johns Hopkins on Feb. 28. Michael Kimmel scored a man-up goal with 48 seconds left to decide the outcome. Goalkeeper **Brent Herbst**, an honorable mention USILA All-American, had nine saves. Herbst, a two-time All-MAAC selection, posted a .617 save percentage last year. **Bryan Neufeld**, the 2009 MAAC Rookie of the Year, leads the team in scoring with eight goals and one assist. Neufeld totaled 38 goals and 13 assists one year ago. **Shaun Dunn**, one of three Siena players on the MAAC preseason team, had 20 goals and four assists in 2009. Attackman **Ryan Duggan** added 12 goals and 19 assists.

THE SERIES: UAlbany and Siena are meeting for the eighth time as Division I programs. The Great Danes have won the previous seven contests, including last year's 8-7 double-overtime victory at Siena Field. Joe Pompo scored the game-winner with 32 seconds elapsed in the second extra period. Chris Zarins and Ryan Duggan each found the net in the final period to give the Saints a 7-5 advantage. Joe Resetarits helped UAlbany rally with three-tenths of a second left in regulation. In 2008, Corey Small had four goals, while Steve Ammann scored twice in a 13-6 decision. Goalie Brett Queener made 10 saves. Siena's Matt Girsh and Matt Leithead each had two goals. In 2007, Frank Resetarits totaled four goals and four assists in a 21-8 triumph. Siena's Girsh scored three times.

PAW PRINTS: UAlbany fell to Denver, 17-13, in its 2010 season opener on Feb. 27 ... the Pioneers snapped a 9-9 deadlock with four unanswered in the third quarter ... Denver also edged UAlbany, 10-9, in last year's season lid-lifter ... UAlbany has a 4-7 record in season openers at the Division I level ... the Great Danes were ranked No. 18 in the USILA preseason coaches poll and No. 20 in the Nike/Inside Lacrosse poll ... UAlbany is meeting six opponents who were ranked in at least one of the two polls ... the Great Danes battled five top-15 opponents last season, including defending national champion Syracuse ... UAlbany will appear on television five times, including a ESPN broadcast against Johns Hopkins (April 10) ... UAlbany is 27-22 all-time in Division I games decided by two goals or less ... the Great Danes were involved in four one-goal decisions last season ... the Great Danes advanced to the America East championship final for the seventh consecutive season in 2008 ... UAlbany (15-3) had its best season as a Division I program in 2007 ... the Great Danes set the program's single-season win mark that was previously established on four occasions (1992, 2003, 2004 & 2005) when those clubs posted 10 victories ... UAlbany is 13-22 against top-20 teams since the 2005 season ... the Great Danes have met the top-ranked team in the nation seven times ... Johns Hopkins and Syracuse were each ranked No. 1 in the 2008 campaign ...

PLAYER NOTES: UAlbany's **Brian Caufield** was chosen to the Inside Lacrosse/Face-Off Yearbook Preseason All-America Team ... Caufield, who has scored three or more points in 17 of his last 24 starts, ranked seventh nationally in scoring (3.64 points/game) last year ... Caufield was the second-highest scoring sophomore behind North Carolina's Billy Bitter ... Caufield recorded his 100th career point with a second-quarter goal at Denver ... he has a 24-game point scoring streak that dates back to April 2, 2008 ... Caufield has 101 career points (52 goals, 49 assists) ... goaltender **John Carroll** was named America East rookie of the week twice as a freshman ... Carroll has made double-

figure stops seven times as a collegian, including 12 saves in the opener ... **Drew DiCioccio** made four starts in goal as a redshirt freshman ... Canada (Ontario, Alberta) and seven states (New York, Florida, Ohio, Oregon, New Jersey, Arizona, Connecticut) are represented on the UAlbany team's 46-man roster ... defenseman **Mark Kelly**, midfielder **Dave Brock**, midfielder **Mark Cometti**, midfielder **Kyle Crotty** and Caufield have been named 2010 team captains ... Kelly was named second-team All-America East last year ... he started 14 games and collected 30 ground balls ... senior defenseman **Brendan Gleason** is the most veteran UAlbany player with 45 career appearances ... **Joe Resetarits** and **Luke Cometti** are the brothers of former or current UAlbany captains and members of the 2009 America East All-Rookie Team ... Resetarits was chosen first-team all-conference last year, the second UAlbany freshman to be honored ... he ranked 12th among the NCAA leaders in goals (2.43 pg) ... Resetarits averaged 3.07 points per game, the fourth-highest freshman scorer in Division I ... the UAlbany attacker had two goals and one assist against Denver ... **Dave Brock** recorded a career-high four points (3 goals, 1 assist) vs. Denver ... **Mike Banks** is a starter on defense for the third consecutive season ... **Mark Cometti** had his season shortened by a leg injury last spring ... **Kyle Crotty** returned to the lineup on April 25th last year after missing the previous six games with a broken thumb ... Crotty had a career-best six ground balls at Denver... **Derek Kreuzer** has moved to attack from midfielder ... the junior netted a career-high three goals vs. Denver ... **Joe Pompo** slides between the midfield and attack ... Pompo had a career day with three goals, two assists and three ground balls against Denver ... he did all of his goal scoring in the first half ... Pompo had 13 goals and two game-winners as a sophomore ... **Rocky Bonitatibus** earned conference all-rookie recognition last year ... freshman **Matt Mackenzie** won 15 of 32 face-offs and had an assist in his first game at the collegiate level on Feb. 27 ... UAlbany's **Scott Marr** was recruited and played for Denver coach Bill Tierney at Johns Hopkins in 1987 ... Tierney was an assistant coach at the time ...

ALL-CONFERENCE: UAlbany has produced 51 all-league players since joining the America East Conference in the 2002 season. **Luke Daquino** earned first-team all-conference recognition three times. **Frank Resetarits** and **Jordan Levine** are also a three-time first-team selections.

STARTING A TRADITION: The Great Danes have reached the NCAA Tournament in four of the last seven seasons. UAlbany captured the America East Conference championship in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. Albany also reached the America East postseason tournament final in 2002, 2006 and 2008.

PRESEASON: UAlbany was ranked No. 20 by *Face-Off Yearbook/Inside Lacrosse* in the preseason. The Great Danes placed two players on the Face-Off Yearbook preseason all-conference squad, as junior attack **Brian Caufield** and sophomore attack **Joe Resetarits** were chosen.

AGAINST TOP 20: The Great Danes have won 14 of 48 meetings with teams ranked in the national top-20 since upgrading to the Division I level. UAlbany upended No. 13 Massachusetts, 12-9, in the first meeting with a top-20 club last season. The Great Danes later fell to Princeton (#5), Johns Hopkins (#11), UMBC (#7) and Syracuse (#4). The Great Danes dropped seven of eight matchups versus ranked teams in 2008, including the America East tournament championship loss at UMBC. The Great Danes last defeated a national top-10 club in a 13-7 win over Delaware in 2007.

DRAFT PICKS: UAlbany's **Corey Small** was chosen in the third round of the 2009 Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft by the Toronto Nationals. Small was drafted 22nd overall. Long-stick midfielder **Chris Schongar** was chosen in the fifth round (42nd selection overall) by Toronto. Small was also picked in the National Lacrosse League Entry Draft by the Edmonton Rush in the first round.

AMERICA EAST CONFERENCE

UAlbany is in its ninth year as a member of America East Conference. Seventeen of the school's 19 varsity teams are eligible for America East championships and NCAA post-season play. America East Conference men's lacrosse members include Albany, Binghamton, Hartford, UMBC, Stony Brook and Vermont. UAlbany competed as a Division I lacrosse independent for two years prior to joining the America East.

NCAA DIVISION I

UAlbany's 19-sport intercollegiate athletics program for men and women began competition at the NCAA Division I level in Sept. 1999. Beginning in 2001-02, the school became a member of the America East Conference.
