IOWA STATE POSTGAME NOTES

Ryan Kock's 9-yard run in the first quarter was the longest of his career.

Bret Meyer's first-quarter TD dive was the eighth rushing touchdown of his career and his fifth this season.

Bret Meyer passed for 262 yards tonight. He now has 6,250 passing yards in his ISU career, extending his school record. Meyer completed 18 passes to increase his school record to 488.

Bret Meyer's fourth-quarter touchdown pass to Todd Blythe is Meyer's 37th career touchdown pass. He is three touchdown passes behind ISU's all-time leader in passing touchdowns, Alex Espinoza (1984-86, 40).

Todd Blythe equalled a season high with six receptions tonight (Texas). He now has 115 receptions in ISU career, which moves him into sixth place in the annals of Iowa State past Chris Anthony (1997-2000, 114).

Todd Blythe recorded a season-high 96 yards receiving tonight. He now has 2,186 receiving yards in his career, good for second place in ISU annals behind Lane Danielsen (2000-03, 2,690).

Todd Blythe's fourth-quarter touchdown reception is his 24th in ISU career. It is Blythe's sixth touchdown catch of the season and is just three shy of Blythe's personal high for touchdown catches in a season (nine in 2004 and 2005).

Jon Davis caught three passes tonight. That gives him 114 for his ISU career which ties him for seventh place with Chris Anthony (1997-2000, 114).

Austin Flynn's three receptions tonight give him 26 receptions this season which is a team high and is the 22nd time in 24 games (11th consecutive) at wide receiver that Flynn has had at least three catches.

R.J. Sumrall's four receptions tonight equal a career best. Last season, Sumrall hauled down four receptions at Nebraska.

Tonight's crowd of 55,338 is the second-largest in Iowa State history. Last week's crowd of 55,518 against Northern Iowa is the all-time record.

The combined total of 110,856 the last two weeks marks the largest back-to-back home game total in school history. The previous record was 105,916 in 1980 with games of 52,974 (Oct. 25) vs. Oklahoma and 52,942 vs. Nebraska (Nov. 15).

The 131 passing yards allowed by Iowa State is the fewest allowed by the Cyclones since they allowed 58 to Kansas State in a 37-23 in Manhattan on Nov. 20, 2004.
