## POSTGAME NOTES

- With the loss today, Kansas State moves to 15-74-2 all-time against Nebraska with the Huskers winning in Manhattan for the first time since the 1996 season.
- Saturday's crowd of 50,723 was the first sellout of the 2006 season and was the 16th largest crowd in K-State history. The last sellout came in the 2004 game between the Huskers and Wildcats.
- Saturday's loss to No. 20 Nebraska marked the fifth straight time that the Wildcats have lost when facing a ranked opponent.
- Kansas State has now scored in 122 straight games, dating back to the 1996 Colorado game. Colorado knocked off the Wildcats 12-0 in Boulder back on November 19, 1996.
- Eight different receivers made catches on Saturday, with five recording multiple catches.
- Wide receiver Daniel Gonzalez caught a career-high four passes for 72 yards Saturday and also recorded his first career rush on a 38-yard dash on a fake punt.
- Kansas State freshman quarterback Josh Freeman earned his second career start Saturday and finished the night 23-for-47 for 272 yards. The last time K-State threw 40+ passes was on Oct. 29, 2005 when Allan Evridge had 40 attempts versus Colorado.
- Freeman's 272 yards were a career high and the most ever by a true freshman quarterback.
- Senior wide receiver Jermaine Moreira caught six passes Saturday, giving him 113 for his career. His 113 career catches rank seventh all-time at K-State. Also, with 86 receiving yards, Moreira moved into eighth place with 1,582 career receiving yards.
- Jeff Snodgrass now has 20 career field goals, which are the seventh-most in school history and also has four 50-plus yard field goals, which are the second-most in school history, one behind Martin Gramatica. His 10 field goals this season are the 10th-most in single-season school history.
