SERIES: OU leads, 62-23-5 overall, and has won 3 straight since MU's last win in the series (20-6 win in Columbia, in 1998). OU has won 15 of the last 16 overall.

COACHES:

Mizzou: Gary Pinkel (Kent, '75), 36-31 at MU (6th year) and 109-68-3 overall (16th year). Pinkel is 0-2 versus OU and Bob Stoops.

Oklahoma: Bob Stoops (Iowa, '83), 80-18 at OU (8th year) and overall. Stoops is 2-0 vs. MU and Gary Pinkel, and is 23-3 alltime vs. Big 12 North teams.

TIGERS AND SOONERS OFFER NATION'S ONLY GAME OF RANKED FOES

The 23rd-ranked Missouri Tigers (7-1 overall, 3-1 in Big 12 play) begin the final third of the 2006 season by playing host of longtime foe and the 19th-ranked Oklahoma Sooners (5-2, 2-1) in an inter-division game Saturday in what is the only game in the nation featuring two ranked teams in this week's Associated Press Top-25 poll.

Mizzou is coming off a solid 41-21 Homecoming win last Saturday over Kansas State that saw the Tigers rebound from a 7-0 deficit after the first play of the game, to score 34 straight points. MU is 7-1 for the first time since the 1969 season.

Oklahoma enters Saturday's game — which is set for an 11:10 a.m. (central) kickoff on ABC — is coming off a 24-3 homecoming win of its own last week against Colorado. The Sooners jumped out to a 10-0 halftime lead and never looked back in notching their 2nd straight win. Oklahoma is 0-2 away from home this season, but both losses have come against ranked opponents (at #18 Oregon and vs. #8 Texas).

TIGERS HIT HOME STRETCH WITH SHARE OF BIG 12 NORTH DIVISION LEAD

The Missouri Tigers head into the final third of the 2006 season holding a share of the Big 12 North Division lead, at 3-1 along with Nebraska. Mizzou is chasing its first conference title of any kind in football since the 1969 squad won a share of the Big Eight championship.

This marks just the 3rd time in the 11 seasons of Big 12 Conference play that Mizzou has started league play at 3-1. In 1998, MU started 3-1, and split it's last 4 games en route to a 5-3 league mark and a tie for 2nd in the North. In 2003, Gary Pinkel's squad started 3-1 but finished 1-3 to end with a 4-4 league mark (3rd).

With 4 games left in the season, the North Division race is looking like a battle between the Tigers (picked to finish 5th in the North prior to the season by league media) and the Huskers (pre-season Big 12 North favorites), and it could all come down to the Nov. 4th showdown between the two teams in Lincoln, Neb.

MU and Nebraska hold a two-game lead currently over both Colorado and Kansas State (both 1-3), while holding a three-game edge over Iowa State and Kansas (both 0-4).

Who has the tougher road down the stretch? Both teams have 2 home/2 road games left, but MU's 4 remaining foes have a combined record of 17-14, while Nebraska's remaining opponents are a combined 19-12.

DAVID OVERSTREET II NAMED BIG 12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior strong safety David Overstreet II (Dallas, Texas) was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, after he led the Tiger defensive effort in MU's 41-21 win over Kansas State last week. Overstreet earned the honor after he had 11 tackles against K-State (film adjusted), and 1 pass break up.

His biggest contribution to the win, however, came when he scooped up a fumble forced by LB Brock Christopher in the 3rd quarter, and he raced untouched for his first career TD, from 41 yards out. That play gave MU a 34-7 lead with 5:30 left in the 3rd, and effectively iced the game for the Tigers, as Mizzou broke a 13-game losing streak to the Wildcats.

The weekly honor is the first of Overstreet's career, and comes during the week that he will try to help his Tigers win a game against the school where his father, David Overstreet, became one of college football's great running backs playing for the vaunted Sooner wishbone attack of the late 1970s under former coach Barry Switzer. Overstreet went on to become a #1 draft pick of the NFL's Miami Dolphins, before he was killed in a car crash in 1984, when his son, David, was only 1 year old.

Overstreet – a pre-season 2nd-Team All-American pick by one media outlet – is the 3rd Tiger defender, and 4th Tiger overall, to win the Big 12's weekly award this season. Here's a listing of MU's 2006 award winners...

MIZZOU LOOKING TO DEFEND 8-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

With its 41-21 home win last Saturday over Kansas State, not only did Mizzou bounce back from its first loss of the season the week prior at Texas A&M, the Tigers also kept alive a home field winning streak that is becoming one of the longest in school history.

Mizzou has won its last 8 home games, including its last 3 of the 2005 season, and the first 5 of the 2006 campaign. MU's last home loss came on Oct. 1, 2005 against then #2-ranked (and eventual national champion) Texas, by a 51-20 score.

Mizzou's current 8-game home winning streak ranks tied for the 4th-longest in school history, per the chart below. A 9th-straight win this Saturday against Oklahoma would tie for the 2nd-longest in school history.

TIGERS LOOK TO KEEP UNDEFEATED HOME SEASON STRING ALIVE SATURDAY

Mizzou enters the Oklahoma game this Saturday looking to stay undefeated at home for the season, as the Tigers enter the ballgame a perfect 5-0 this year at Faurot Field/Memorial Stadium.

The last perfect home season for MU came back in 2003 when Gary Pinkel's squad went a record 6-0 at Faurot Field on the way to an 8-5 season mark.

Only 12 times in the history of Memorial Stadium (which opened in 1926), has MU had perfect records at home. Here's a look at those occasions:

TIGERS APPEAR IN ALL FOUR MAJOR POLLS

When Mizzou takes the field this Saturday against Oklahoma, it will do so carrying the nation's No. 23 ranking into the game, according to both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls. MU moved up 1 spot in the A.P. poll after last week's 41-21 win over Kansas State, and jumped into the coaches' poll at No. 23, after being just out of that poll the week before.

Additionally, when the Bowl Championship Series rankings were released Sunday, Mizzou climbed to #20, up 4 spots from #24 in the previous week's initial set of BCS rankings.

In other polls, Mizzou moved up to #21 in this week's Harris Interactive poll, jumping 4 spots from #25 prior to the K-State win.

This marks the 5th straight week that the A.P. poll has included Mizzou. After defeating Ohio, 31-6, on Sept. 23rd, the Tigers moved into the AP poll – at No. 25 – for the first time since 2004, when the Tigers were ranked 19th prior to the second game of the year, at Troy. MU began that season ranked 18th in the AP poll.

Mizzou has played 4 games previously in its history as the #23-ranked team in the A.P. poll, and MU is 3-1 in those outings – including a 38-21 win at Texas Tech this season.

Saturday will mark the 149th time overall that Mizzou has entered a game as a ranked team. In its previous 148 such encounters, MU holds an alltime record of 89-58-1 (.605).

This is the 11th week that Mizzou has been ranked in the AP poll under Gary Pinkel, as the Tigers were ranked for 4 weeks (peaking at #22) in 2003, in addition to the aforementioned 2-week stay in the polls in 2004, and the current 5-week span.



MORE RANKING BREAKDOWN HISTORY

Saturday will mark the 11th time overall that Mizzou and Oklahoma have squared off with both teams carrying an A.P. top-25 ranking into the game. Oklahoma has won 8-of-10 games in that situation, including 6 straight dating back to MU's last win, in 1969, when the 9th-ranked Tigers downed the 20th-ranked Sooners, 44-10 in Columbia. See the chart below for details.

Mizzou has played 50 games in its history where both teams carried an A.P. poll ranking into the game, and the Tigers are 16-34 in those instances (.320), and have lost 10 straight dating back to its last win in 1978, when 19th-ranked MU won at home vs. 20th-ranked Iowa State (W, 26-13).

Mizzou is 2-2 alltime in 4 previous games playing against the #19-ranked team in the nation, with wins coming in 1973 against SMU (17-7 in Dallas) and in 1970 against Colorado (30-16 in Columbia), and losses in 1984 to Notre Dame (16-14 in Columbia) and in 1971 to Stanford (19-0 in Columbia).

MIZZOU-OKLAHOMA SERIES HISTORY

Mizzou and Oklahoma will be facing each other for the 91st time when they meet this Saturday in Columbia. The Sooners hold a commanding 62-23-5 lead in the previous 90 meetings between the two long-time conference partners.

Oklahoma has won 3-of-4 contests over Mizzou since the inception of the Big 12 Conference in 1996, including 3 straight games in the series, with MU's last win coming in 1998 – a 20-6 Tiger win in Columbia. Prior to that MU win, Oklahoma claimed 12 straight wins in the series from 1984 through 1995.

Going further back, Mizzou has defeated Oklahoma only 4 times since 1967 (a span of 33 games), but all 4 have come at Faurot Field (1969, 1981, 1983, 1998).

Oklahoma has been ranked in the A.P. poll 23 times in those 33 games dating back 1967, compared to just 9 times that MU has carried a ranking into the MU-OU contest. The last two times Mizzou faced the Sooners, OU was ranked #1 (2003) and #3 (2002). In fact, in 15 of those meetings dating back to 1967, OU has been ranked in the top-10 when it's met the Tigers.

More recent history has provided some very competitive games in Columbia, as MU has outscored the Sooners by a combined 53-50, despite losing 2-of-3. Most recently, #3 Oklahoma used a 4th-quarter fake field goal to escape Columbia and redshirt freshman QB Brad Smith with a 31-24 win. Prior to that, in 1998, #20 MU cruised to a 20-6 win over unranked OU, breaking the Sooners' 12-game win streak in the series. In the last year of the Big Eight Conference, #23 OU scratched out a 13-9 win in 1995 over unranked Mizzou.

THE LAST TIME IN COLUMBIA: #3 OKLAHOMA 31, MIZZOU 24 (2002)

In 2002, Oklahoma brought the nation's #3 ranking to Columbia to play unranked Mizzou, and the Sooners escaped with a hardfought 31-24 win that might have done as much for the national reputation of Tiger redshirt freshman QB Brad Smith as any game in his career.

Smith was scintillating on the night, as he nearly single-handedly engineered one of the biggest upsets in Tiger history, despite throwing 3 interceptions on the night.

Smith, Missouri's redshirt freshman quarterback, had the third-ranked Sooners on the run all game long. Oklahoma needed a touchdown on a fake field goal with 6:33 left to escape with a 31-24 victory.

Smith carried 26 times for 213 yards - then a record for Missouri quarterbacks - and two touchdowns. He also threw for 178 yards and a score, accounting for 391 of the Tigers' 449 yards.

"Brad Smith, just an incredible performance," Oklahoma coach Bob Stoops said. "He really was exceptional in his play and what he did tonight. As a team and as a head coach, I feel very fortunate - lucky - to have been able to have fought through this and won."

The winning touchdown was a stunner. Holder Matt McCoy took the snap, waited a moment, then threw a perfect lob to freshman tight end Chris Chester, who went up and caught the ball between two defenders for his first career reception. Nate Hybl's 2-point conversion pass to Curtis Fagan made it 31-24.

Stoops said he liked his chances of the fake working better than the chances of Trey DiCarlo making a 31-yard field goal. DiCarlo had already missed an extra point and field goals of 34 and 43 yards.

The touchdown was set up by Brandon Everage's interception, which gave Oklahoma (5-0, 1-0 Big 12) the ball at the Tiger 16. It was one of three interceptions thrown by Smith.

He threw another on Missouri's next drive, but the Sooners went nowhere and punted. The Tigers (3-2, 0-1) took over at their 23 with 1:39 left and drove to the Oklahoma 35, but Smith was sacked on fourth down with 5 seconds remaining.

Oklahoma scored twice in under 3 minutes in the third quarter to seemingly take control. Fagan took a short pass from Hybl, broke a tackle and outran two defenders for a 65-yard touchdown. Then Quentin Griffin scored on a 53-yard run, slipping away from a tackle behind the line before bouncing outside and getting down the boundary.

The extra point failed, making the score 23-7.

That's when Missouri got going, scoring on its next three possessions to take the lead.

Justin Gage caught a slant pass and took it 23 yards for a touchdown to cap an 87-yard drive, and later in the third, Michael Matheny kicked a 38-yard field goal.

Five minutes into the fourth quarter, Smith scored on a 25-yard run to put the Tigers in front 24-23. He began the drive with a 37-yard scramble, added a 12-yard completion on a third-down play, then scored on another third down.

Gage finished with nine catches for 122 yards. His first reception made him Missouri's career receiving leader, moving him past Kenny Holly, who had 151 catches.

The Sooners dominated the first quarter, outgaining Missouri 152-36 and keeping Smith in check, but Oklahoma managed just a 7-0 lead. The touchdown came on a 2-yard run by Kejuan Jones, one play after Hybl threw a 34-yard completion to Antwone Savage on third-and-inches from the 36.

It was 10-0 when Missouri scored late in the half on a 25-yard keeper by Smith on a third-and-7 play. He had kept the drive alive three plays earlier with a 15-yard run on third-and-3.

LAST TIME OUT: #24 MIZZOU 41, KANSAS STATE 21

Mizzou came into its 2006 Homecoming game looking to get the pain of its first loss of the season out of its system, and while things couldn't have started any worse for the Tigers, they withstood some early body shots and emerged with a solid 41-21 win to break a 13-game losing streak to Kansas State.

K-State had won 13 straight games over Mizzou from 1993-2005, and it appeared the spectre of past losses might be haunting the Tigers again, when, on the first play of the game, Tiger QB Chase Daniel fumbled after being sacked from his blindside. KSU's Zach Diles scooped up the



ball at the MU 43-yardline, and raced untouched for a TD to give the Wildcats a 7-0 lead before the season-best crowd of 64,657 could even get settled in their seats.

On a cold, rainy day, things seemed like they might get even worse, as Kansas State, leading 7-3 early in the 2nd quarter, had a 4th-and-goal from the Tiger 1-yardline, and decided to go for it to try and take a 14-3 lead. But the Tigers stiffened, as reserve DL Tommy Chavis stuffed KSU RB for no gain at the 1-yardline, giving MU the ball and some life.

The offense then responded with its best drive of the season, promptly marching 99 yards in 10 plays – taking just 3:13 off the clock in doing so – for a TD on a 14-yard Daniel-to-Martin Rucker pass that gave MU its first lead of the game with 8:33 left before half. That momentum shift really turned the game, as the Tigers scored 4 more times before K-State could muster another score, as MU jumped to a 34-7 lead before settling for the 41-21 final.

Daniel completed 24-of-31 passes on the soggy day, for 262 yards and 4 TDs (going to 4 different receivers). His 4th of the day – on a 15-yarder to TE Chase Coffman in the 4th quarter – gave Daniel 19 TD passes for the season, breaking the 37-year-old MU single-season record of 18 held previously by Terry McMillan (1969 season).

Coffman was once again brilliant for the Tigers, as he had 6 catches for 75 yards and the 1 TD. He was joined in the endzone by WR Tommy Saunders (6 catches, 51 yards, 1 TD), WR Will Franklin (5 catches, 87 yards, 1 TD) and Rucker (3 catches, 18 yards, 1 TD). TB Tony Temple led the Tigers in rushing, as he had 62 yards on just 9 carries (6.9 avg.), while Daniel added 47 yards on the ground to give him 309 yards of offense on the day.

Mizzou rushed for 171 yards overall, marking the most for MU since it rushed for 197 in game #3 at New Mexico.

David Overstreet led the Tiger defensive effort that kept the Wildcats in check for most of the day, as KSU didn't score any offensive points until the game was 34-7 in MU's favor. Overstreet scored the 1st TD of his career when he scooped and scored on a 41-yard fumble return in the 3rd quarter to make it 34-7. He led Mizzou on the day with 11 tackles (film adjusted) and was on Sunday named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

In all, MU forced 4 Kansas State turnovers (2 fumble recoveries, 2 interceptions), and the Tigers scored 17 points off those miscues. Mizzou's defense held KSU QB Josh Freeman to just 5-of-19 passing for 63 yards and 2 interceptions (zero TDs).

TIGERS LOSE ALLTIME QB SACKS LEADER BRIAN SMITH TO INJURY

Mizzou's Homecoming win over Kansas State last Saturday came with a heavy price to pay, as senior defensive end Brian Smith was lost for the remainder of the regular season with a broken right hip. The injury does not require surgery, but he'll need to be on crutches for around 8 weeks, meaning there could be an outside chance of him being available in a bowl game.

Smith was injured in the 3rd quarter on the play when safety David Overstreet returned a fumble 41 yards for a Tiger touchdown. Smith was running interference for his teammate, and leapt to hurdle a downed player, and landed awkwardly, apparently breaking his hip in a non-contact situation.

Smith was having an outstanding senior season for the Tigers, as he was named just last week as 1 of 12 semi-finalists for the prestigious Lombardi Award. He had ranked all season long among the nation's top-5 in QB sacks, with 7.5 through 8 games. He is Mizzou's alltime career leader in sacks, with 31.5, and needed just 3 more to break the Big 12 Conference career record of 34, held by Aaron Hunt of Texas Tech (1999-2002).

The loss of Smith leaves senior DE Xzavie Jackson as MU's most accomplished sack master. Jackson enters the OU game with 5.0 sacks on the year and 13.5 career sacks – both numbers currently best among active MU players. Jackson's 13.5 sacks now ranks as 9th-best in MU history.

Replacing Smith directly in the lineup will likely be sophomore DE Stryker Sulak. Sulak actually has more tackles on the 2006 season than Smith (35-to-30), despite more limited reps, and he has produced nicely, accumulating 4.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 QB sack, breaking up 3 passes, and recovering 1 fumble. Sulak has 8 starts in his career, including 7 in 2005 as a redshirt freshman, and 1 in 2006, as he started in place of Jackson in the season opener while Jackson sat out the game due to disciplinary reasons.

PINKEL HAS WON 15 OF LAST 21 GAMES AT MIZZOU

Mizzou Head Coach Gary Pinkel is in his sixth season at MU and touts a career record of 109-68-3 (61.4%). His career winning percentage of 60.2% to begin the season ranked him 23rd in the nation among active Division I-A coaches with a minimum of seven years coached.

Pinkel, who has led MU to a combined record of 27-17 over the past four seasons (including 15 wins in his last 21 games dating back to the 2004 season finale), and to bowl games in 2003 and 2005, has a six-year record in Columbia of 36-31 (53.7%).

With a team picked to finish 4th in the Big 12 North in 2005, Pinkel's Tigers tied for 2nd place last year (winning all tiebreakers), and were playing for a chance to share for the division title heading into the regular-season finale. Pinkel has led MU to two bowl games, and with a third on the horizon in 2006, that puts him in select company, as he joins Don Faurot, Dan Devine, Al Onofrio, and Warren Powers as the only coaches to guide MU to three bowl games. After beating Nebraska (41-24 in 2005) for the second time in three years, Pinkel became the first MU coach since Onofrio to defeat NU twice.

Mizzou's 34-7 win over Ole Miss earlier this year drew him above the .500 mark at Mizzou. Pinkel is the first Tiger coach since Powers to have an MU record of above .500 after at least one full season of coaching (Powers left after the 1984 season with an MU record of 46-33-3).

Pinkel has driven Mizzou to a pair of winning seasons (8-5 in 2003 and 7-5 in 2005) in his five previous years at the wheel, with those representing two of MU's four winning campaigns dating back to the 1983 season. With a winning season in 2006, he would become the first MU coach since Powers to have three winning years.

MIZZOU IS NCAA'S ALLTIME OVERTIME KING

Overtime is old hat around Mizzou. Since the rule was put into effect for the 1996 season, Mizzou has played the most overtime games in NCAA history, with 11 through games of Oct. 21st, 2006. With MU's 27-24 OT win in 2005 versus Iowa State, the Tigers improved to 8-3 alltime in overtime games, a win total which also is most in the NCAA.

Mizzou went 1-1 in 2002 in overtime affairs, dropping a tough 42-35 home overtime game to #18 Colorado and the very next week winning a 33-27 double overtime thriller at Texas A&M, the week after A&M beat #1-ranked Oklahoma on the same field.

Interestingly, MU Head Coach Gary Pinkel won the very first overtime game played in Division I history when his Toledo Rockets beat Nevada, 40-37, in the 1995 Las Vegas Bowl. The overtime rule was put into effect for that bowl season, and has been in use ever since.

Pinkel is now 7-1 alltime in his career in overtime games, including 5-1 at Mizzou.

✪ – QB Chase Daniel completed 24-of-31 passes for 262 yards and 4 TDs (zero INTs), as he compiled a QB rating of 190.99 on the day. He broke the school record for most consecutive games with a TD pass, as he moved his running total to 8 currently, surpassing the old mark of 7 co-held by Terry McMillan (1969) and Brad Smith (2004)...



✪ – Junior WR Will Franklin continued his push for All-Big 12 honors, as he caught 5 passes for 87 yards and 1 TD. His TD – a 52-yard catch-and-run effort – came with just 2:40 left in the 2nd quarter, and helped extend MU's lead to 17-7 at halftime. Franklin ranks 3rd in the Big 12 (15th nationally) in receiving yards per game (86.25). His average per catch of 18.2 yards ranks 4th in the Big 12 among those with at least 2 catches per game. He now has 5 TDs of 30 yards or more this season, and that ties him for the season record, along with former greats Mel Gray (1969), Henry Marshall (1975) and Sean Coffey (2004), who all had 5 of 30 yards or more...

✪ – Sophomore TE Chase Coffman had yet another sterling day, as he caught 6 passes for 75 yards and 1 TD. His season totals of 35 catches for 353 yards and 5 TDs leads all Big 12 TEs, and his receptions per game average of 4.38 currently ranks 8th in the Big 12 among all players, and 73rd nationally. Only 2 TEs nationally have caught more passes than Coffman (Chris Hopkins – Toledo, Dustin Keller – Purdue), and only 2 TEs nationally have caught more TD passes than Coffman to this point (Darius Hill – Ball State, Hopkins – Toledo)...

✪ – MU gained 433 yards of total offense on the day, including 262 passing and 171 rushing (MU's most since game #3 at New Mexico [197]). That was the most surrendered all year by K-State, which had a defense that was allowing 298.29 yards per game coming in (36th in NCAA). The 41 points scored by MU was also a season high for KSU opponents, and the Wildcats were allowing an average of 17.00 points coming in (30th in NCAA)...

✪ – Sophomore PK Jeff Wolfert continued his outstanding contributions to the squad, as the former MU diver was perfect on all kicks for the 6th-straight game. He was 2-of-2 on FGs (20, 30) and a perfect 5-of-5 on PATs Saturday to raise his season totals to 10-of-12 on FGs and 33-of-33 on PATs. He has made 33 consecutive kicks overall (7 FGs, 26 PATs), since he missed his last kick – a 4th-quarter FG attempt in game #2 versus Ole Miss. With 63 points scored on the season to date, Wolfert needs only 19 more to break the MU single-season kick scoring record of 81, set by Adam Crossett in 2005. The MU single-season record for most FGs made is 16 (Tom Whelihan in 1985 and Jeff Jacke in 1992)...

✪ – Junior P Adam Crossett raised his season punting average to 40.3 yards per punt, a figure that would rank him 4th in the Big 12 if he had enough punts to qualify for the standings. Crossett punted 3 times Saturday versus Kansas State for an average of 42.0 yards per punt, and in his last 3 games, Crossett is averaging 48.3 yards per punt in his last 3 games (10 punts)...

GOALLINE STAND SPARKS TIGER VICTORY OVER K-STATE

Lost in the boxscore of MU's 41-21 win last Saturday over Kansas State was possibly the biggest play of the game – an MU stop of a K-State rush on 4th-and-goal from the Tiger 1-yardline in the 2nd quarter. The Wildcats admirably went for it on the 4th down play, as they were trying to extend their 7-3 lead at the time, and to get MU's Homecoming crowd squirming in their seats.

But instead of backing down, the Tiger defense dug in, and stopped the Wildcats for no gain, as reserve DL Tommy Chavis stopped KSU RB James Johnson for no gain to turn the ball over to MU's offense.

Despite facing the longest of possible fields, QB Chase Daniel and his offensive teammates put together their best drive of the season, and marched 99 yards in 10 plays for a TD to put the Tigers on top, 10-7 with 8:33 left in the 2nd quarter. Daniel was 5-of-5 passing for 60 yards on the drive, and TB Earl Goldsmith covered 15 yards in 3 rushes (Daniel had 9 yds. on 2 carries), and K-State helped out with a 15-yard personal foul to account for the yardage. TE Martin Rucker covered the final 14 yards on a TD reception, and MU never looked back, as it scored four more times in a row to make it 34-7 before K-State could muster any offensive points.

Just how good was the Tiger goalline stand? Consider that MU had to overcome 2 fresh sets of downs due to a facemask penalty on what appeared to be a 3rd-down stop on the Tiger 8-yardline. After getting a fresh set of downs with a 1st-and-goal from the 4, the Tigers held, as K-State endured a false start penalty, and could muster only 8 yards on 4 straight rushing attempts.

BIG CROWD EXPECTED SATURDAY FOR OU GAME

While Saturday's game against Oklahoma is not in a sold-out situation, Mizzou Athletic Officials are expecting the crowd to at least equal, if not surpass, the season-high crowd of 64,657 that took in last week's Homecoming victory over Kansas State.

That crowd was the 6th-largest at Memorial Stadium dating back to 1984 – and that even predates the shrinking of capacity to the current level. Current capacity of the stadium is listed as 68,349, and that changed in 1995 when the grass berm that now outlines the field was installed, taking out many seats that used to come from concrete steps at the time. The largest crowd to ever see a game at Memorial Stadium was when 75,298 saw MU take on Penn State on Oct. 4, 1980. Here's a quick look at the largest crowds since 1984, when 70,915 fans saw MU take on Notre Dame on Sept. 29, 1984 (representing the last crowd of 70,000 at MU)...

TIGER RUNNING GAME KICKS IN GEAR VERSUS K-STATE

Mizzou rushed for 171 yards in Saturday's win over Kansas State, and while that total might not cause eyes to pop, it was the most that MU had rushed for since going for 197 in game #3 at New Mexico. Additionally, it wasn't the yardage that was so impressive, it was the efficiency of the attack, as the Tigers averaged a salty 4.6 yards per attempt. In its 3 previous games, MU had averaged 2.9 yards per carry in games against Colorado (40 rushes, 100 yards), at Texas Tech (40-133) and at Texas A&M (26-74).

Last Saturday against K-State, MU's top 3 tailbacks averaged 7.6 yards per carry, as they gained 129 yards combined on 17 carries. Tony Temple led the way with 62 yards on 9 attempts (6.9 avg.), while Jimmy Jackson had 36 yards on 4 carries (9.0 avg.) and Earl Goldsmith added 31 yards on 4 attempts (7.8 avg.).

The Tigers had success against a K-State defense that was allowing just 3.4 yards per rush to opponents coming into last Saturday's game.

The challenge gets even stiffer this weekend, as Oklahoma brings with it the Big 12's top-ranked defense in terms of total yardage allowed – OU ranks 1st in the league, and 11th nationally with a 266.71 yards per game average.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Chase Daniel set a Missouri record with five touchdown passes, helping the Tigers beat Murray State 47-7 as he led an offensive attack that racked up 589 yards on the night – the 10th-highest single game output in MU school history.

Daniel, making his first career start, was 23-of-32 for 320 yards with a passer rating of 207.44. He broke the school mark that was held by six others, including former record-setting quarterback Brad Smith, who had four in last season's opening 44-17 win over Arkansas State.

Daniel's passing yardage total was also the 10th-highest mark in MU single-game annals.

The Tigers needed just six plays to take the lead for good. Daniel's quick toss to Will Franklin became a 60-yard scoring pass when Franklin spun past the cornerback and ran untouched into the end zone.

Daniel connected with Brad Ekwerekwu on an 8-yard touchdown pass and with Chase Coffman on a 3-yard score later in the first quarter. In the second quarter, Marcus Woods scored on a 2-yard run and Daniel and Franklin connected again, this time on a 34-yard scoring pass in the final minute of the half.

The record-breaking touchdown pass came with 10:53 to play when Daniel hit a wide-open Jared Perry down the left sideline, putting Missouri ahead 47-0.

The Tigers also scored on a safety in the third quarter when Sean Weatherspoon blocked a punt out of the end zone, and on

a 38-yard field goal by Jeff Wolfert.

Missouri's defense played well, too. Murray State, in the first game under new coach Matt Griffin, didn't make a first down until 7:34 remained in the second quarter. By then, Missouri was head 21-0. Starting quarterback Ryne Salyer was 8-of-13 for 39 yards with a lost fumble and an interception. Backup Zac Barnard was 12-of-17 for 89 yards and a touchdown. The Racers' leading rusher, Chad Cook, gained 12 yards on 31 carries.

Murray State's lone score came late in the fourth quarter on a 13-yard TD pass from Barnard to Nate Moore.

Mizzou's defense held the Racers to only 150 yards of offense on the night, including just 25 rushing yards on 27 attempts. The Tiger defenders held Murray State to just 2-of-13 on third down attempts, and snuffed out the only fourth down try the Racers had all night.

Starting tailback Tony Temple carried 15 times and ended with a career-high 119 yards – the most by an MU tailback since former standout Zack Abron rushed for 139 yards in 2003 against Texas Tech.

Senior linebacker Marcus Bacon led the Tiger defensive charge, with a career-high 12 tackles. Bacon recovered a fumble by noseguard Ziggy Hood, and safety Brandon Massey intercepted a pass to account for two forced turnovers by Murray State.

The win was the 30th in the six-year Missouri career of Head Coach Gary Pinkel, and evened his record at MU to 30-30.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Chase Daniel had 332 yards in total offense, and Missouri got a dominant effort from its defense in a 34-7 victory over Mississippi to move to 2-0 on the season.

Daniel ran for a 3-yard score and had a 20-yard touchdown pass in a strong follow-up to his first career start when he threw a school-record five touchdown passes against Division I-AA Murray State. Saturday's effort came against tougher competition, with Daniel going 24-for-40 for 243 yards and rushing for 89 yards on 13 carries.

Mississippi (1-1) managed just 162 total yards, and Mizzou's defense forced Rebel quarterback Brent Schaeffer into throwing three interceptions. The Rebels were outgained 169-7 in the first quarter and surrendered 471 yards overall.

Missouri (2-0) scored on three of its first four drives in the first half and the first two possessions of the second half. The Tigers are 2-0 for the first time since 2003, after getting upset by New Mexico and Troy the previous two seasons.

Mississippi's lone score came after a turnover gave the Rebels possession in Missouri territory for the only time. Marcus Woods fumbled a punt return, and Charles Clark recovered at the 40. Two plays later, Schaeffer threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Marshay Green with 1:50 left in the first half to cut the gap to 17-7.

Daniel accounted for all 80 yards on the Tigers' opening drive, going 6-for-6 for 50 yards and rushing four times for 30

yards. He busted a 25-yard run off a fake handoff and scored on a 3-yard run.

A 24-yard pass from Daniel to William Franklin set up a 22-yard field goal by Jeff Wolfert, and a punt downed at the 2 ended up giving Missouri favorable field position on a 43-yard drive capped by Woods' 1-yard run for a 17-0 lead.

Brad Ekwerekwu caught a 20-yard touchdown pass to cap Missouri's first drive of the second half, and backup quarterback Brandon Coleman had an 8-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter.

BenJarvus Green-Ellis had 69 yards on 16 carries for Mississippi, which had 240 yards rushing in its opening victory over Memphis.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) -Chase Daniel's fourth quarter touchdown run broke open the game, Tony Temple rushed for 168 yards and Brian Smith tied an MU single-game record with 4 sacks as the Tigers remained unbeaten with a 27-17 win over New Mexico.

Missouri (3-0) showed plenty of offensive potential with 396 total yards, but the Tigers couldn't capitalize on several scoring opportunities against a New Mexico defense that played good enough to keep the Lobos (1-2) in the game.

Daniel finally gave the Tigers breathing room by taking Missouri on an 80-yard, 11-play drive in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter and scoring on an 8-yard keeper for a 20-10 lead.

Earl Goldsmith added a late 2-yard TD for the Tigers and New Mexico scored with 25 seconds left on a 13-yard pass from Chris Nelson to Marcus Smith in garbage time.

New Mexico, whose other touchdown came from linebacker Michael Tuohy's 11-yard interception return of a Daniel pass in the second quarter, had trouble all night against the bigger and quicker Missouri defensive front.

The Lobos finished with 201 total yards - just 33 of them rushing- and Missouri's pressure sacked Nelson eight times. But the Lobos were still thinking upset after Kenny Byrd's career-best 52-yard field goal cut Missouri's lead to 13-10 with 31 seconds left in the third quarter.

That's when Daniel, who completed 25 of 36 passes for 199 yards, led the Tigers on their best drive of the night. He completed four passes in the drive, the two biggest a 16-yarder to Will Franklin and a 13-yarder to Martin Rucker to the New Mexico 17.

The Tigers had wasted a good drive in the third quarter when Temple was hit by Lobo freshman defensive back Frankie Solomon and fumbled

the ball into the end zone, where defensive end Phillip Harrison recovered for a touchback.

Missouri led 13-7 at the half, but the Tigers easily could have had a bigger cushion.

The Lobos lost two fumbles and Nelson threw an interception in the second quarter, but all the Tigers got from the three turnovers was a 36-yard field goal by Jeff Wolfert.

Missouri's offense clicked early as Daniel completed his first six passes in a smooth 13-play drive that ended with a 37-yard Wolfert field goal.

After New Mexico went three-and-out, Missouri went 56 yards on five plays, with Daniel hitting Rucker with a 6-yard TD. The big play in that drive was a 39-yard run by Temple.

New Mexico, which spent much of the first half with negative rushing, cut it to 10-7 on Tuohy's interception. Missouri's receivers broke upfield on the play and Daniel's pass into the flat went right into Tuohy's hands. It was Daniel's interception this season after seven TD passes.

New Mexico's defense held the Tigers on fourth down at the Lobos' 5-yard line late in the first half. That drive started with a fumble by Lobo halfback Rodney Ferguson at the New Mexico 30 that was recovered by linebacker Marcus Bacon. Daniel completed three straight short passes that got the Tigers to the New Mexico 7. On fourth-and-one from the six, Daniel tried to sneak for it and came up short.

New Mexico's offense again gave the Tigers another opportunity when Nelson fumbled and Lorenzo Williams recovered at the Lobos' 19. But Missouri gained just 1 yard on three plays and settled for Wolfert's second field goal.

GAME #4 • MIZZOU 31, OHIO 6

SEPT. 23, 2006 • FAUROT FIELD • COLUMBIA, MO. • (50,098)

A dominant second-half performance buoyed Mizzou to a 31-6 win over the Ohio Bobcats, and a perfect 4-0 start for just the sixth time in the last 82 seasons (since 1925).

The MU defense, which allowed 157 yards of offense in the 1st half, shut down Ohio after intermission, allowing only 31 total yards in the 2nd half (with 37 coming on its final possession before an MU interception ended the game). The Tiger offense chipped in adequately, despite 3 turnovers in the game, outgaining the Bobcats 211-to-31 in the 2nd half, and 428-to-188 in total on the day.

The Tiger defense, ranked 2nd in the nation coming into the game, got challenged early, as Ohio forced a turnover on MU's game-opening possession and took over on the Tiger 41-yardline. The Bobcats mustered only 20 yards, however, and had a 38-yard field goal attempt blocked by LB Marcus Bacon to end the threat.

The Tiger offense responded 3 plays later, when QB Chase Daniel hit a wide-open WR Will Franklin down the left sideline for a 68-yard TD pass – the longest pass play since 2000 at MU – to give Mizzou the lead, 7-0.

The Bobcats wouldn't go away, however, as they strung together a 7-play, 80-yard TD drive midway through the 2nd quarter to close to within one point, at 7-6. The extra point was blocked by DL Lorenzo Williams and DE Xzavie Jackson, though, to preserve the lead.

That block seemed to swing momentum for the

homestanding Tigers, as the offense answered with an 11-play, 75-yard TD drive that ended with Daniel's 2nd TD pass to Franklin (from 11 yards) with 5:26 left in the half to make it 14-6.

After a quick 3-and-out forced by MU's defense to open the 3rd quarter, the Tiger offense scored on its first two possessions – on a career-long 44-yard field goal by PK Jeff Wolfert and a 5-yard TD run by Daniel – to extend the lead to 24-6 with 6:38 left in the period.

The TD drive covered only 28 yards and was set up by Williams' fumble recovery after CB Darnell Terrell crashed from the corner to force an errant option pitch by Ohio QB Austen Everson that Williams pounced on.

In four 3rd-quarter possessions by Ohio, the Tiger defense held the Bobcats to -13 yards on 14 total plays, while the MU offense totaled 102 yards in the same 15 minutes.

TB Jimmy Jackson capped the scoring with a 2-yard run (his first of the season) with 3:13 left in the game to account for the final score. Ohio drove 37 yards on its final drive, only to have Bacon grab his 2nd interception of the season. He returned his pickoff 48 yards before being dragged down.

Bacon led all Tigers, with 9 tackles, while Daniel totaled 302 yards of total offense, including 258 passing and 44 rushing. Franklin led all receivers with 99 yards receiving on 4 catches, and TB Tony Temple had a team-high 60 yards rushing on 15 attempts.

The 25th-ranked Missouri Tigers beat Colorado 28-13 in their Big 12 Conference opener to improve to 5-0 and match their best start in a quarter-century.

Chase Daniel threw four touchdown passes as Missouri equaled the 5-0 start of the 1981 team.

Daniel, a sophomore in his first season as a starter, completed 23 of 35 passes for 253 yards, with two interceptions. He has now thrown 13 TD passes this season, including a team-record five against Murray State.

Daniel and tight end Chase Coffman teamed up for first-quarter scoring passes of 2 and 9 yards. Daniel hit Missouri's other tight end, Martin Rucker, on a 1-yard score with 11 seconds left in the first half, and connected with wide receiver Jared Perry on a 9-yard score midway through the third quarter.

Both teams entered the game ranked in the top 10 nationally in team defense - Missouri (5-0, 1-0) was first and Colorado eighth. But the Tigers moved easily to touchdowns on their first two possessions, scoring on drives of 71 and 77 yards.

Colorado, ranked 113th in offense with just 223.5 yards per game coming in, actually outgained Missouri 373-353, but could manage just two Mason Crosby field goals - a 32-yarder in the first quarter and a 36-yarder in the second - and one third-quarter touchdown.

Missouri's third score was set up by a Colorado mistake when punter Matt DiLallo let a high snap slip through his hands

late in the second quarter. He recovered but was tackled at the Colorado 14.

Six plays later, on third-and-goal from the 1 and out of time-outs, Daniel hit Rucker to make it 21-6.

Colorado quarterback Bernard Jackson and wide receiver Dusty Sprague connected on a 63-yard pass on the first play of the third quarter, and Jackson scored from the 1 a play later to make it 21-13.

Missouri answered with a 52-yard scoring drive ending with Perry's score.

Colorado went for it on fourth down five times. All five failed, including a second-quarter effort on fourth-and-goal from the Missouri 4 with the Buffaloes trailing 14-3.

Jackson was 13-of-27 for 190 yards and ran 15 times for 93 yards. Hugh Charles carried 13 times for 87 yards for Colorado. Tony Temple led Missouri runners with 70 yards on 18 carries.

Crosby's two field goals and extra point gave him 256 career points and made him Colorado's all-time leading scorer.

The Tigers had not allowed a first-quarter score until Saturday and have outscored opponents 62-3 in the first quarter.

Missouri converted 11-of-18 third down conversions, and its defense held the Buffaloes to only 3-of-12 on third downs, in addition to the 0-of-5 on fourth downs.

Missouri enjoyed a total team effort, making enough big plays on both sides of the ball, to earn a solid 38-21 win at Texas Tech, spoiling the Red Raiders' Homecoming game.

The No. 23 Tigers' defense, which came into the game ranked No. 10 in the nation, set up most of the scoring on the night. If there were any questions coming into the game about MU's ability to defend the high-powered Tech offense, the answers came in four turnovers - two interceptions and two fumbles - by Tech quarterback Graham Harrell, which led to 28 points for Missouri. In all, MU collected five turnovers on the night, the most by Mizzou since gaining five in 2003 against Nebraska.

Chase Daniel threw for 171 yards and a touchdown, giving Missouri its first 6-0 start in 33 years.

Xzavie Jackson and William Moore scored on interception returns on consecutive Texas Tech possessions in the second quarter, to help stake the Tigers to a commanding 24-0 lead, before Tech staged a rally to pull to within 24-21 early in the 3rd quarter.

Daniel, who returned to Texas where he played high school football in the Dallas area, kept Tech's defense guessing. The Birthday Boy - Daniel turned 20 on Saturday - completed 15 of 22 passes, threw one interception and ran for 37 yards.

Missouri (2-0 Big 12) got up 24-0 before Texas Tech (4-2, 1-1) crossed the 50. The Red Raiders scored a two touchdowns before halftime and appeared to have momentum turned around.

But Missouri stiffened and allowed only one score in the second half. Daniel and his offensive teammates responded after Tech closed it to 24-21 with a methodical 10-play, 73-yard drive for a TD to end the Tech momentum and push the lead back to 31-21, as Daniel connected with TE Chase Coffman from 6 yards out.

Harrell's second fumble came early in the second half and gave the Tigers good field position at Tech's 44. Daniel threw a 36-yard pass to Will Franklin and Tony Temple ran 8 yards for a touchdown (his 2nd of the night) on the first play of the fourth quarter to give the Tigers their winning margin.

Missouri's defense pressured Harrell early, forcing a fumble at the Red Raiders 12 on the first play of Tech's second possession. DeMarcus Scott recovered the ball and four plays later Temple put Missouri up 10-0 on a 1-yard run.

Missouri's defense got better in the second quarter.

Jackson got the first Missouri defensive score on a screen pass over the middle by Harrell and the defensive end lumbered 17 yards into the end zone untouched to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead.

Harrell's very next pass - to Robert Johnson near the sideline - was picked off by Moore, who scampered 22 yards to put Missouri up 24-0.

Mizzou was dropped from the ranks of the undefeated, thanks in large part to three costly turnovers and an inability to get a methodical Texas A&M offense off the field, as the homestanding Aggies claimed a 25-19 win over the 19th-ranked Tigers.

The Tigers lost three fumbles on the day – all in the first half – and Texas A&M turned those into 10 points as the Aggies forged a 17-17 tie at halftime.

All 10 of those Aggie points off turnovers had an involvement with instant replay, as both plays that led to points were reviewed, and both ultimately went against Mizzou.

The first was potentially the most crucial play of the game, and it came just three plays into the game. Tiger QB Chase Daniel threw a perfectly-lofted pass deep downfield to a wide-open WR Will Franklin, who caught the ball in stride and raced toward the goalline for an apparent 65-yard TD. However, Franklin was caught from behind by A&M's Jordan Peterson inside the 5-yardline, and Peterson punched the ball out of Franklin's arms as he crossed the goalline, with the ball rolling out of the back of the endzone. The play was originally ruled a TD for MU, but replay showed that the ball came out before Franklin crossed the goalline, and it was overturned for a touchback.

The Aggies drove 74 yards on 15 plays for a 23-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead, which represented MU's first deficit of the entire season.

The Tigers responded quickly, however, driving 73 yards in just 7 plays to take a 7-3 lead as TB Tony Temple scored on a 5-yard run.

Texas A&M used a reverse pass that went for 67 yards on its next possession to key a drive that saw them regain the lead at 10-7, but Mizzou again responded with a TD drive of its own, with Daniel and Franklin hooking up for a TD pass that covered 38 yards this time.

The next big replay that hurt MU came midway through the 2nd quarter, as Temple ran into traffic in the middle of the field, and was ruled to have fumbled the ball, which was recovered by A&M on the Tiger 23 yardline. Replay showed that Temple's knee appeared to be down, but the call was not overturned by replay officials, giving the Aggies field position that they cashed in for a subsequent TD to take a 17-14 lead.

MU's Jeff Wolfert tied the game just before half with a 39-yard field goal, and things looked to be going the Tigers' way when A&M QB Stephen McGee had to fall on an errant snap in his own endzone on the opening possession of the 3rd quarter for a safety, giving MU a 19-17 lead.

However, the Tiger offense – despite owning great field position at its own 45-yardline – couldn't seize the momentum, and went three-and-out.

A&M responded with a 13-play, 80-yard drive that was aided by a McGee 12-yard pass to himself that was deflected at the line of scrimmage by MU's Brock Christopher. McGee caught the deflection and raced for 12 yards on a 2nd-and-10 situation to the A&M 43-yardline. Instead of facing a 3rd-and-10, the Aggies were near midfield and on their way to what would ultimately prove to be the winning score. That came 10 plays later, when TB Mike Goodson scored from 2 yards out with 6:38 left in the 3rd quarter, and after McGee rushed for the 2-point conversion, A&M held a 25-19 lead.

The Tigers certainly had plenty of opportunities to regain the lead, but it couldn't score in any of its last four possessions. Its best chance came early in the 4th quarter, as Daniel directed a sharp drive that went from MU's 20-yardline to the A&M 4. Daniel hit his first 7 passes on the drive, before his 3rd-and-goal attempt to TE Chase Coffman in the endzone was batted away. After taking a delay of game penalty back to the 9-yardline, Mizzou went for the jugular, as it tried a fake field goal, but holder Brad Ekwerekwu's rush attempt was stopped after gaining only 3 yards.

That would prove to be MU's best chance to score the rest of the way, as the Tiger defense twice more got the ball back for the offense. But the Mizzou offense couldn't convert a 3rd-and-2 from its own 42-yardline on its first chance, and also came up short on a 4th-and-2 rush by Temple from its own 46 on its last possession. Replays showed that Temple might have gotten a bad spot, as he came up a football length short, but the play was not reviewed.

A&M held the ball for a commanding 41 minutes and 30 seconds, and converted 9-of-15 third down situations, as the Tiger defense couldn't muster any turnovers, one week after forcing 5 Texas Tech turnovers that turned into 28 MU points.

A wet field, a slippery ball, a 13-game losing streak — none of it mattered to Chase Daniel.

Missouri's sophomore quarterback put on another passing display, throwing touchdown passes to four different receivers as the 24th-ranked Tigers beat Kansas State 41-21, snapping a 13-game losing streak against the Wildcats.

Missouri (7-1, 3-1) overcame a turnover turned into a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage to bounce back from the previous week's 25-19 loss to Texas A&M and get off to its best start since 1969. After starting 3-0 under new coach Ron Prince, the Wildcats (4-4, 1-3) dropped their fourth game in their last five.

The game, played in a driving rain, marked Missouri's first win over Kansas State since a 27-14 victory in Columbia in 1992.

Kansas State seemed poised for the upset early. Defensive end Rob Jackson broke around left end on the first play from scrimmage at the Missouri 41 and blindsided Daniel, forcing a fumble that was scooped up by linebacker Zach Diles, who ran 43 yards for the score.

After Jeff Wolfert made a 30-yard field goal for Missouri, the Wildcats had a chance to go up 14-3 early in the second quarter. But on fourth-and-goal from the 1, James Johnson was stopped for no gain.

Prince said going up 14-3 would have given his young team — the offense starts five freshmen — confidence on the road.

Missouri then drove 99 yards in 10 plays, scoring on a 14-yard pass from Daniel to tight end Martin Rucker.

The Tigers made it 17-7 later in the half. On third-and-1 from the Missouri 48, Daniel threw a short sideline pass to Will Franklin, who spun around a defender on single coverage and ran untouched to the end zone.

Daniel, who set a team record with five TD passes in a season-opening 47-7 win over Murray State, was 24-of-31 for 262 yards. He broke Terry McMillan's record of 18 touchdown throws in a season, set in 1969.

Franklin had five catches for 87 yards and a touchdown, and tight end Chase Coffman had six catches for 75 yards and a 14-yard fourth-quarter score. Tony Temple gained 62 yards on nine carries.

Kansas State freshman quarterback Josh Freeman, who came in completing just 43.1 percent of his passes, was 5-of-19 for 63 yards, was intercepted twice and lost a fumble. He was also sacked four times, twice by linebacker Marcus Bacon.

But the Wildcats had success running the ball, rushing for 262 yards. Johnson carried 20 times for 127 yards and a fourth-quarter 9-yard score, and Patton rushed 18 times for 112 yards and a 15-yard touchdown run in the third quarter.

The start of the second half was a disaster for Kansas State as the Wildcats committed turnovers on three of their first four plays from scrimmage, resulting in 17 Missouri points.

Freeman was intercepted by Dedrick Harrington at the Missouri 48, and the Tigers eventually scored on a 3-yard pass from Daniel to Tommy Saunders. After the kickoff, Darnell Terrell outmuscled Yamon Figurs for a Freeman pass at the Kansas State 29 and returned it to the 11, setting up a 20-yard field goal by Wolfert.

Two plays after that, Missouri's Brock Christopher jarred the ball loose from Patton, and David Overstreet picked up the fumble and ran 41 yards for a touchdown.
