A&T: A&T is back in a familiar place.

They are in a midseason fight for first place. The Aggies lost their first game in nearly 700 days when they loss to Morgan State on Sept. 22. The Aggies have won two straight conference games since and are close to returning to the top-10 nationally.

A&T Coach Sam Washington:

Washington (MVSU '82) is off to a 5-1 start to his head coaching career. It took Rod Broadway a whole season to get five wins. It took Bill Hayes two seasons to get five wins. Both are legendary A&T head coaches. He is off to the best start of any first-year Aggies head coach in history. He learned under great coaches such as Tony Dungy and Rod Broadway.

FAMU: Florida A&M has had some lean years lately but they are back in the hunt for the conference title and a Celebration Bowl bid. The Rattlers have not finished above .500 in the MEAC since 2011. They have not won a MEAC title since 2010. The Rattlers are No. 3 in total offense and total defense after shutting out Norfolk State last week.

FAMU Coach Willie Simmons:

Simmons is known for putting together great offenses. He is coming off a successful three-year tenure at Prairie View A&M where he went 21-11. Before PVAMU, he was successful in turning around Alcorn State's offense as their offensive coordinator from 2012-14. He was also OC at Middle Tennessee.

FAMU COMES TO GREENSBORO FOR FIRST-PLACE FIGHT WITH A&T

- ▶ There will not be a winless opponent in front of the Aggies this week. After facing three straight winless teams, the Aggies will battle for first place against Florida A&M.
- ▶ N.C. A&T has won three out of the last four MEAC titles and have not loss a conference game since Nov. 19, 2016. They will put their 10-game conference winning streak on the line at home.
- ▶ FAMU is in unfamiliar territory when it comes to N.C. A&T. FAMU has dominated the all-time series but they have not defeated the Aggies since 2011. They have not defeated N.C. A&T in Greensboro since 2010.
- ▶ It could be a historic day for Aggies quarterback Lamar Raynard. Raynard needs just one touchdown pass to become the Aggies all-time leader. He is tied with Alan Hooker (1984-87) for the all-time mark.
- ▶ Raynard threw three touchdown passes last Saturday at Delaware State to tie the record with the tie-breaking throw being a 4-yard toss to Zachary Leslie with 2:55 remaining in the third quarter.
- ▶ Raynard picked up another record on Saturday as well. Hooker also held the school record for touchdowns responsible for with 66. Raynard needed to account for two Aggie touchdowns to break that mark. He did that when he rushed for a 10-yard touchdown with 11:49 remaining in the first half.
- ▶ By accounting for all five touchdowns on Saturday, he now has accounted for 70 N.C. A&T touchdowns (59 passes, 11 rushing).
- ▶ The receiver who has benefited the most from Raynard is Elijah Bell. Eighteen of Raynard's 59 touchdown passes have gone to Bell. Denzel Keyes and Malik Wilson have caught nine touchdown passes apiece from Raynard.
- ▶ Raynard has thrown touchdown passes to 16 different receivers in his career. His first touchdown pass was a 16-yard throw to Caleb Gabriel on Sept. 5, 2015 against Shaw University.
- ▶ Defensively, the Aggies held Delaware State without a touchdown. It marked the 19th time in eight seasons the Aggies held an opponent without a touchdown. It is the second time this season, the Aggies defense kept a foe out of the end zone.
- ▶ N.C. A&T's defense is still strong despite giving up 140 yards to Delaware State. The Aggies are ranked 13th nationally and second in the MEAC in total defense. They are 10th in rushing defense and 11th in passing defense efficiency.

1 — It is the number of touchdown passes Lamar Raynard needs to throw to become the Aggies all-time leader passing Alan Hooker.
3 — It is the number of wins the Aggies have over FBS opponents in the past three years.
5 — It is the number of times the Aggies ranked in the top-10 in total defense nationally in Washington's seven-year tenure as defensive coordinator. They were top-10 in 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2017.
8 — It is the number of players on the 2018 team who have already graduated including Lamar Raynard, Jamaal Darden, Kiaundric Richardson, Leroy Hill, Julian McKnight, Julius Reynolds, Terrence Peterson and Breontae

Matthews.
19 — It is the number of times in the past eight seasons the Aggies have prevented an opponent from scoring a touchdown. The Aggies have shutout opponents eight times in eight years.
27 — N.C. A&T is 27-3 at home against MEAC opponents since 2011. The Aggies are 35-6 at home over the past eight years.
31 — It is number of games Lamar Raynard has won as the Aggies starting quarterback. He is 31-1 as N.C. A&T's starter with only loss coming against Morgan State on Sept. 22, 2018.
40 — The Aggies have been ranked nationally ranked 40 straight weeks in the FCS Coaches Poll. They have been ranked as high as No. 4 in the poll this season.

49 — It is the number of times since Sam Washington came to N.C. A&T as the defensive coordinator in 2011 that A&T has held an opponent under 100 yards rushing. Washington enters his first season as coach.
55 — The Aggies are 56-3 when leading after three quarters in the past eight years. The Aggies lost a fourth-quarter lead for the first time since Nov. 9, 2013 when Morgan State came from behind to beat A&T on Sept. 22, 2018. It broke a streak of 39 straight games.
57 — The Aggies are 57-1 in the past eight seasons when leading at halftime. N.C. A&T's only loss when leading at halftime since 2011 was at Norfolk State. It is a streak of 50 straight wins when leading at halftime.

BROADWAY INDUCTED INTO ANOTHER HALL OF FAME

- ▶ On Saturday, Sept. 29, former N.C. A&T head coach Rod Broadway was inducted into the National Black College Alumni Hall of Fame which inducts people from a variety of genres such as art and entertainment, athletics, civil rights, education, business and industry, community service and faith and theology.
- ▶ Broadway went in as a Chairman's Award inductee.
- ▶ Broadway announced his retirement from coaching on January 8, 2018, nearly seven years after he was announced as the Aggies head coach in on Feb. 3, 2011.
- ▶ In seven years as the Aggies head coach, Broadway went 59-22 (.728) putting together the best winning percentage in school history.
- ▶ Under Broadway, the Aggies won two HBCU national titles, three MEAC titles, beat two Division I-FBS schools and made one NCAA FCS playoff appearance.
- ▶ In total, the Aggies have had 36 first-team mentions during Broadway's era and 67 total All-MEAC mentions.
- ▶ Broadway reached 50 wins as the Aggies head coach faster than any other coach in the school's 93-year history, earning the milestone in 72 games coached. Only four other coaches have 50 wins as A&T's head coach.
- ▶ Broadway ended his career with a 127-45 (.737) record which was the best winning percentage among active FCS coaches. In the history of FCS, Broadway has the third-highest winning percentage.
- ▶ He came into the season 17th on the all-time wins list among FCS coaches. He won coach of the year twice in the CIAA, once in the SWAC and once in the MEAC. He has also been named Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C. Coach of the Year twice.
- ▶ Before coming to A&T, he spent four seasons as NCCU's head coach (2003-06) and four seasons as Grambling State's (2007-10) head man.

CALLING DR. REYNOLDS, CALLING DR. REYNOLDS

- ▶ Aggies linebacker and team captain Julius Reynolds has already graduated and is seeking a master's degree.
- ▶ He is also trying to head to medical school having already applied to South Florida, Florida State, NYU, Tulane, Baylor, UNC Chapel Hill, East Carolina and Wake Forest.
- ▶ Before entering medical school to become an orthopedic, Reynolds is teaching three different sessions of Biology 100 courses at N.C. A&T.
- ▶ He teaches two classes on Wednesday's and one class on Friday's. He has three players in his Friday class including starting left guard Macquel Hardy, wide receiver Jordan McDaniel and linebacker Chris Mosley.
- ▶ Reynolds graduated from N.C. A&T in the spring of 2018. He graduated from AggieLand in 3 1/2 years and is now seeking a degree in biomedical engineering. He plans to have that degree in one year before becoming Dr. Reynolds.

NORTH CAROLINA A&T vs. FAMU

- ▶ The Rattlers own the series thanks to dominating the Aggies in the 1950's and 60's. The Aggies went 1-17-2 against the Rattlers over those two decades.
- ▶ A&T has recovered lately winning the last six over the Rattlers. It is the longest winning streak the Aggies have ever had against the Rattlers.
- ▶ The Aggies have won the last six matchups by an average of 15.5 points. They have even won three straight in Tallahassee, something the Aggies have never done before.
- ▶ Both teams have won a considerable amount of MEAC titles. N.C. A&T owns the second-most MEAC titles with nine. The Rattlers have won the third most MEAC titles with eight.

A&T STREAKS CONTINUE

- ▶ The Aggies have won nine straight conference games at home with their last loss coming to N.C. Central on Nov. 21, 2015. The Aggies have won five straight conference games on the road.
- ▶ N.C. A&T has gone 48 straight games without being shutout. The last time they were shutout was Oct. 4, 2014 against S.C. State.
- ▶ The Aggies still have their MEAC winning streak in place because the Morgan State game was counted as a non-conference contests. The Aggies have won 10 straight MEAC games.
- ▶ A&T wide receiver Elijah Bell has caught at least one pass in all 29 games he has played for N.C. A&T. He did not play against Delaware State on Oct. 6.

THE NFL EYES DEFENSIVE END DARRYL JOHNSON

- ▶ N.C. A&T has had some success in the NFL Draft lately.
- ▶ In 2016, running back Tarik Cohen was selected in the fourth round by the Chicago Bears.
- ▶ In 2017, the Oakland Raiders selected offensive tackle Brandon Parker with the first pick of the third round.
- ▶ There have been talks of Lamar Raynard and Marquell Cartwright getting the next look but don't underestimate Darryl Johnson's opportunities.
- ▶ The redshirt junior out of Kingsdale, Ga. is starting to get attention not only for the 2020 draft but there may be a possibility for the 2019 draft.
- ▶ Johnson stands at 6-foot-5 and weighs 232 pounds so many NFL scouts like his body and the fact that they can add weight to it.
- ▶ Johnson leads the MEAC in sacks with five total and 1.25 per game. He is ninth in the nation in sacks. Johnson is also third in the MEAC in tackles for loss with seven total and 1.75 per game. He is 23rd in the nation.
- ▶ For his career, Johnson has 85 tackles, 29.5 tackles for loss, 14 sacks and he has broken up five passes.

BIG BALLER BELL

- ▶ Sophomore Elijah Bell is headed toward having one of the best careers in school history.
- ▶ Bell has already earned two first-team All-MEAC honors, while also being named MEAC Rookie of the Year in 2016.
- ▶ He broke freshman school records in receiving yards (631), receptions (35) and touchdown receptions (8).
- ▶ His 953 yards receiving this season is the second-best single season performance in school history. He was 47 yards shy of becoming only the second player in school history to earn a 1,000-yard receiving season.
- ▶ His 64 catches was the second-best single-season performance in A&T history.

RECORD-BREAKING SEASON AWAITS QB RAYNARD

- ▶ Redshirt senior quarterback Lamar Raynard has a chance to break many of Alan Hooker's records Hooker has held for more than three decades.
- ▶ Raynard already broke several single-season A&T records in 2017 on his way to winning MEAC Offensive Player of the Year.
- ▶ Raynard enters the season as the 2018 MEAC preseason offensive player of the year. It marked the fourth straight year an A&T player has been named the conference's preseason offensive player of the year.
- ▶ Raynard was also placed on the preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List for the best offensive player on the Division I-FCS level.
- ▶ Raynard has one loss as a starter in 30 career starts. He has helped the Aggies win two national titles.

COACHING CHANGES

- ▶ Rod Broadway was not the only departure from the Aggies coaching staff.
- ▶ Chip Hester, the Aggies offensive coordinator the past four seasons, was hired as the head coach of Barton College which is in its first season of football.
- ▶ Hester was replaced by quarterbacks coach Chris Barnette who takes over the playing calling duties at the age of 33.
- ▶ Barnette helped quarterback Lamar Raynard earn MEAC Offensive Player of the Year honors last season.
- ▶ With Sam Washington moving from defensive coordinator to head coach, Washington turned over some of his coordinator responsibilities to defensive line coach Courtney Coard.

AGGIES CONTINUE TO BE STINGY DEFENSIVELY

- ▶ North Carolina A&T has been tremendously stingy under since Sam Washington became the Aggies defensive coordinator in 2011 before becoming head coach in 2018.
- ▶ The Aggies run defense has been especially stingy. In all seven seasons with Washington as the defensive coordinator, the Aggies have finished first in the MEAC in run defense.
- ▶ Nationally, the Aggies have only finished out of the top-10 in run defense once under Washington's leadership on defense finishing 24th nationally in 2014. The previous season, the Aggies led the nation in run defense.
- ▶ In total defense, the Aggies have never finished any lower than third in the MEAC. In 2012 and 2015-17, the Aggies led the MEAC in total defense.
- ▶ The Aggies have never finished lower than 20th in total defense nationally, and they finished in the top-10 five (2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2017) times in the past seven years.
- ▶ The Aggies have finished first in the conference in scoring defense four times under Washington and over the last six seasons they were at least ranked in the top-2.

THE MCCAIN LEGACY CONTINUES AT N.C. A&T

- ▶ The name Franklin McCain holds a lot of lore at N.C. A&T. Franklin McCain and three other N.C. A&T students staged a sit-in at the Woolworth's lunch counter in Greensboro on Feb. 1, 1960 to protest the store's policy of refusing to serve black customers.
- ▶ The foursome went on to be known as the Greensboro Four and are credited with ushering in the modern-day civil rights movement.
- ▶ McCain, who died in 2013, has a monument created in his honor along with the other Greensboro Four in Ezell Blair (now Jibreel Khazan), Joseph McNeil and David Richmond.
- ▶ McCain's grandson Franklin McCain III, the starting corner for A&T.
- ▶ McCain III was a first-team All-MEAC performer in 2017 as well as a third-team AP All-American and a Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American.
- ▶ McCain's pick-6 in the late seconds of the Aggies win at Charlotte on Sept. 16, 2017 clinched the win for the Aggies. He became the 28th player in FCS history to return two INTs for TD's when he did it at Morgan State on Sept. 23 of last season.
- ▶ He has eight career interceptions and has returned those INTs for 374 yards including four INT returns for touchdowns.

SIX AGGIES EARN PRESEASON DEACON JONES WATCH LIST NODS

- ▶ Six Aggies are on the preseason Black College Football Player of the Year Award Watch List. The Deacon Jones Trophy is given to the best black college football player in the nation.
- ▶ The winner of the 2018 Black College Football Player of the Year Award will be honored with the Deacon Jones Trophy during the Black College Football Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony, which takes place on February 16, 2019, in Atlanta. Four finalists will be unveiled on November 29.
- ▶ Quarterback Lamar Raynard returns to the watch list after being one of four finalists for the trophy last season.
- ▶ Raynard is joined by cornerback Mac McCain III, defensive end Darryl Johnson, wide receiver Elijah Bell, running back Marquell Cartwright and tight end Leroy Hill.
- ▶ McCain established himself as one of the cornerbacks in the nation last season as a freshman. McCain intercepted six passes last season and returned those picks for a total of 274 yards. He also had three INT returns for touchdowns.
- ▶ Johnson made a name for himself last season by using his long arms and ability to run down ball carries to force turnovers. He is also one of the best pass rushers in the nation. He is on the preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List for best FCS defensive player in the nation.
- ▶ Bell is a favorite target of Raynard. Bell caught a single-season school record 11 touchdown passes in 2017. He is also close to breaking numerous N.C. A&T career records despite being only a sophomore.
- ▶ Cartwright is looking for his second straight 1,000-yard rushing season. He was the offensive MVP in the 2017 Celebration Bowl.
- ▶ Hill shared the tight end duties last season, but in 2016 he was an All-MEAC performer. He is a first-team preseason all-conference player.

N.C. A&T AND THE NFL DRAFT

- ▶ For the second straight year, the Aggies had a player selected in the NFL Draft. Three-time MEAC Offensive Lineman of the Year and consensus All-American offensive tackle Brandon Parker was selected by the Oakland Raiders as the first pick of the third round in the 2018 draft.
- ▶ Only Jamain Stephens was drafted higher than Parker in the history of Aggies football as Parker went 29th overall in the first round to the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1996.
- ▶ The Chicago Bears selected Tarik Cohen with the 119th overall pick in the fourth round of the 2017 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Before Cohen was drafted, the Aggies went 12 years between NFL Draft picks.
- ▶ The last time the Aggies had players drafted in back-to-back drafts came in 1996 and '97 when Stephens went 29th overall to the Pittsburgh Steelers in '96 and Michael Hamilton (San Diego) and Cedric White (St. Louis) were drafted in '97.
- ▶ The Chargers have liked the Aggies the most. The Chargers organization has taken five Aggies in their history.

AGGIES IN THE PROS

- ▶ N.C. A&T has good representation in the NFL considering it is an FCS school.
- ▶ Tarik Cohen and Brandon Parker are the most noticeable because they were drafted over the past two years, but the Aggies have also seen a few players picked up in free agency.
- ▶ Two-time All-MEAC performer Tony McRae is a second-year player in the NFL. He is in the Cincinnati Bengals camp but he has played for the Bills and the Ravens as well.
- ▶ McRae made the Bengals practice squad back in 2016 to start his NFL career. He entered the NFL with Oakland as a college free agent following 2016 draft.
- ▶ Former Aggies tight end and wide receiver Kevin Francis played in the CFL last season as a linebacker after playing tight end and receiver at A&T.
- ▶ Former Aggies receiver Wallace Miles, who holds a share of the school record for career receptions, was also a CFL player.
- ▶ This past season, the Aggies had several Aggies from their 12-0 team invited to NFL camps as free agents. Khris Gardin, the Aggies NCAA record-breaking return specialist, was invited to work out with the Bears.
- ▶ Jeremy Taylor was signed as a NFL free agent by the Pittsburgh Steelers while tight end Trey Scott was invited to work out for the Tennessee Titans.

THE TRANSFERS IN 2018

- ▶ Transfers played a big role in the Aggies successful season in 2017.
- ▶ Graduate transfers Jaquil Capel (Appalachian State) and Trey Scott (Tulane) were major players on offense. Scott even earned first-team All-MEAC honors as a tight end.
- ▶ Another graduate transfer, Jamari Smith out of the University of South Carolina, also played a key role last season. He posted 700 all-purpose yards and scored four total touchdowns a year ago.
- ▶ Offensive guard Macquel Hardy, a junior college transfer, started some games in 2017 and looks to be a full-time starter in 2018.
- ▶ This season the Aggies looked to be helped defensively with transfers.
- ▶ University of South Carolina transfer Antoine Wilder looks to play an important role on an Aggies defense that returns eight starters. Wilder will play the strong side linebacker position.
- ▶ Northern Illinois transfer Justin Nwachukwu will also look to play role on the defensive end as an interior defensive lineman along with Michael Branch who transferred from Presbyterian College.
- ▶ Offensively, the Aggies welcome in UNC transfer and former Dudley running back Darius Graves. Another RB transfer, Jah-maine Martin out of Coastal Carolina will also compete for playing time.

THE DANGEROUS RAYNARD/CARTWRIGHT COMBINATION

- ▶ Seniors Marquell Cartwright and Lamar Raynard have been playing football together for more than 10 years.
- ▶ The duo met each other at the age of 9 and played little league football together.
- ▶ They started playing with each other at T.W. Andrews High School in High Point, N.C., as ninth graders. As seniors, the duo won the state Class 2AA state championship.
- ▶ QB Raynard led the team on a game-winning drive that ended with a 38-yard touchdown pass from Raynard to beat Monroe 18-14 at the University of North Carolina.
- ▶ Raynard became the Aggies starting quarterback as a redshirt freshman, while Cartwright spent two seasons as the backup running back to Tarik Cohen.
- ▶ The two finally teamed up again as starters in 2017 and the results have been an 12-0 historic record with an 8-0 mark in the MEAC and a conference championship.
- ▶ Both men are first-team All-MEAC selections with Raynard being named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year. The two have combined to be responsible for 76 Aggie touchdowns over their respective careers with multiple MEAC titles and HBCU national titles.

▶ RAYNARD GOES AFTER WALTER PAYTON AWARD

- ▶ North Carolina A&T quarterback Lamar Raynard is considered one of the best players on the Division I-Football Championship Subdivision level heading into the 2018 season. The evidence of this was presented when Raynard was placed on the Walter Payton Watch List.
- ▶ The Payton Award is handed to the best offensive collegiate player in the nation. Raynard has a spot on the list for the second straight season.
- ▶ Raynard was also a finalist in 2017 for the Deacon Jones Award which is presented to the best player in black college football.
- ▶ Raynard could own many of the Aggies career passing records before the 2018 season ends. In 2017, he broke single-season passing records in passing yards (2,932), passing touchdowns (27), touchdowns responsible for (31), completions (209), attempts (328) and passing efficiency (161.7).
- ▶ Raynard also completed more than 60 percent of his passes for the second straight season.

JOHNSON EARNS BUCHANAN WATCH LIST HONOR

- ▶ North Carolina A&T defensive end Darryl Johnson added to his preseason accolades in 2018 by being added to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List.
- ▶ It is an exceptional honor for Johnson considering during the Aggies last seven years of dominance on the defensive end, Johnson is the only Aggie to earn a spot on the Buchanan Watch List during that span.
- ▶ The Buchanan Award is given to the best defensive player in the nation on the Division I-Football Championship Subdivision level.
- ▶ The last time an N.C. A&T Aggie who won the Buck Buchanan Award was in 1997 when N.C. A&T Sports Hall of Famer Chris McNeil won the honor. Johnson played on an Aggies defense that was ranked fourth in total defense, third in scoring defense, fifth in rushing defense and ninth in sacks, nationally.

N.C. A&T HEAD FOOTBALL COACH SAM WASHINGTON



Sam Washington became the 19th head football coach in North Carolina A&T State history on January 9, 2018. Prior to being promoted to head coach, Washington served as the Aggies defensive coordinator and secondary coach for seven years. In 2015, he was promoted to associate head coach. He has established himself as one of the best defensive minds in Division I-FCS. The Aggies improvement defensively under Washington is remarkable.

Under Washington, the Aggies have finished out the top-20 in total defense only once nationally, and they have never finished outside the top-30. In two of those seasons, they were second nationally in total defense. The run defense has finished outside the top-10 nationally once, and in 2013 the Aggies led the nation in run defense.

A year before his arrival in 2011, A&T was ranked 89th in total defense, 114th in rushing defense and 78th in pass defense nationally. In three of Washington's seven seasons, the Aggies have finished among the top-10 teams in passing defense efficiency including No. 1 in 2012. The Aggies have been the MEAC's No. 1 total defense and scoring defense four times in the past seven years. They have had the No. 1 total defense in the conference three straight seasons. N.C. A&T has also had the No. 1 rush defense in the

conference six times in seven years.

In 2017, the defense was instrumental in the Aggies finishing the season 12-0 with the MEAC title, the Celebration Bowl victory and the HBCU national title. Washington's defense finished fourth nationally, third in the nation in scoring defense and fifth in the nation in run defense.

In his role as the secondary coach, five different cornerbacks have earned All-MEAC success in D'Vonte Graham, Justin Ferrell, Tony McRae, Donald Mattocks and Marquis Boyan with only Boyan not earning first-team honors. Graham, McRae and Mattocks have all earned All-American honors from various organizations. Two of Washington's corners – McRae and Ayodeji

Olatoye – signed free agent contracts with NFL teams with Olatoye making the Dallas Cowboys 53-man roster in 2015 and playing the Super Bowl in 2017.

In 2017, the Aggies had two cornerbacks – Mac McCain and Timadre Abram – earn first-team All-MEAC honors with McCain going on to win All-American honors by Phil Steele Magazine and the Associated Press (third team). Marquis Ragland earned three first-team All-MEAC selections as a defensive lineman, linebacker D'Vonte Grant was a Jerry Rice finalist for best FCS rookie in 2011 and linebacker Denzel Jones was the defensive MVP of the 2015 Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl.

Before arriving at A&T, Washington spent four seasons as Grambling's defensive backs coach under Broadway. Washington played a significant role in the Tigers' dominating defense in 2007. Nationally, the Tigers ranked 12th in total defense. During the next season, Washington's defensive backfield played a vital role in Grambling being an opportunistic defense. Grambling led the nation in turnover margin and was third in scoring defense.

Defensive back Desmond Lenard returned one interception for a touch-down and was ninth in the nation in interceptions per game. Three other defensive backs ranked among the Top-50 in interceptions per game that season.

Before Washington came to Grambling, he spent five years at his alma mater Mississippi Valley State. Washington served as an assistant head coach and defensive coordinator in addition to his customary role as the defensive backs coach. In his first season at MVSU, he transformed the Delta Devils defense from one of the worst defenses in the SWAC into the league's No. 2 ranked defense.

Before returning to MVSU, Washington spent one season (2001) as A&T's special teams coordinator under then head coach Bill Hayes. Under Washington, the Aggies had one of the best special teams seasons in school history. The Aggies led the nation in punt return yardage per game with punt returner Curtis Deloatch breaking the NCAA's single-season record for punt return touchdowns. Punter Yonnick Matthews was second in the MEAC in punting.

Washington also spent eight seasons at N.C. Central as the school's assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. Led by All-American Buddy Crutchfield, Adrian Jones and Trei Oliver in 1996, Washington put together one of the best defensive backfields in Division II as the Eagles went 8-3 with the best pass defense in the CIAA.

In 1992, he began work at Johnson C. Smith. He was named the assistant head coach. His other duties included being the defensive and special teams coordinator, the defensive backs coach and the head track and field coach.

Washington's coaching profession also includes a stint with Bethune-Cookman (1987-92), where he helped the Wildcats take a share of the 1988 MEAC championship. In 1998, he secured an internship with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers under legendary head coach Tony Dungy. Washington is no stranger to the NFL. He spent four seasons in the NFL with stops in Pittsburgh and Cincinnati. As a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Washington intercepted at least one pass in five consecutive games during the 1984 season.

Washington earned a B.S., degree in physical education from MVSU in 1982. He was inducted into the MVSU Hall of Fame in 2006. He and his wife Donna have one son, Jarvis.
