STORYLINES

Indiana State (3-9, 1-0 MVC) returns to the Hulman Center for the first of two Missouri Valley Conference games this week against the visiting Creighton Bluejays (11-2, 1-0 MVC) on New Year's Eve. Tip off is set for 2:05 p.m. ET on Nellie and John Wooden Court.

The Sycamores are coming off a thrilling 85-84 double-overtime win on Sunday at Northern Iowa in the team's first Valley game of the season. The win marked the second-straight year in which the Sycamores opened Valley play with a win on the road, after defeating Evansville last year in the league opener for both schools. It was also the team's first double-overtime win in the last two seasons, after ISU defeated SIU at the Hulman Center 64-62 on Jan. 12.

UNI held a 79-77 lead late in the second overtime period after Kwadzo Ahelegbe hit free throws. However, Aaron Carter hit his second three-pointer of the period, was fouled and hit his free throw to convert the four-point play and give ISU an 81-79 lead with just 54 seconds left. The Sycamores would hold onto that lead and walk away with an 85-84 win.

Harry Marshall led four ISU scorers in double figures with 23 points, including a 9-for-14 effort from the charity stripe, to go along with six assists and four rebounds. Carl Richard recorded the first double-double of his career, as he tallied 15 points and a career-high 11

rebounds to help the Sycamores to the win. Carter finished with 16 points and five rebounds, while Jay Tunnell rounded out the balanced scoring effort with 14 points and seven rebounds for the Sycamores.

Creighton puts its eight-game win streak on the line today in its first MVC road contest of the year. The Bluejays defeated Wichita State 68-56 on Sunday in the season opener at the Qwest Center, with Booker Woodfox leading the way with 16 points.

Creighton owns a 46-22 record all-time against Indiana State and has won 13 of the last 16 games in the series. ISU is 14-6 against CU in Terre Haute all-time against the Bluejays, including two-straight wins over the Jays at the Hulman Center in the last two seasons.

ABOUT THE COACHES

Kevin McKenna (Creighton '93) is in his second season as the head coach at Indiana State (17-25). In his first season with the Sycamores, McKenna led the team to its highest win total since the 2000-01 season and an impressive 12-2 record at home in the Hulman Center. McKenna came to Indiana State after spending nine seasons as an assistant coach at Creighton under head coach Dana Altman, where he helped the Bluejays advance to four NCAA tournament appearances. From 2001-05, McKenna spent four years as the head coach (89-33) at NCAA Division II Nebraska-Omaha, where he guided the Mavericks to four consecutive 20-win seasons and three appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Dana Altman (Eastern New Mexico, 1980) is in his 15th year as head coach of the Bluejays. He owns a 293-154 (.655) mark at Creighton and a career record of 376-221 (.630) in his 20th year as a NCAA Division I head coach when you add four seasons at Kansas State and one at Marshall. Creighton's all-time winningest coach, Altman has been named national, conference, regional or district coach of the year in 10 of his first 23 years as a head coach. The 2001 and 2002 MVC Coach of the Year was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award in 2003. Additionally, Altman has led Creighton to seven NCAA Tournaments and his teams have played in the postseason in 11 straight seasons.

SCOUTING THE BLUEJAYS

► Creighton University is located in Omaha, Neb., and has an enrollment of 6,992 students. The Bluejays are members of the Missouri Valley Conference and play their home games at the Qwest Center (17,272).

► The Bluejays finished with an overall record of 22-11 during the 2007-08 season. In conference play, Creighton posted a 10-8 record which was good enough for fourth place in the conference. That record was good enough to qualify the Bluejays for the MasterCard National Invitation Tournament (NIT), where the team defeated Rhode Island 74-73 in the first round before falling on the road at Florida in the second round 82-54 to end the season.

► Creighton comes into the Hulman Center today after earning its eighth straight victory, a 68-56 victory over Wichita State on Sunday night at Qwest Center Omaha. Senior guard Booker Woodfox led Creighton in scoring for a seventh straight game, finishing with a game-high 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting.

INDIANA STATE BASKETBALL NOTES

LAST TIME AGAINST THE BLUEJAYS

OMAHA, Neb. – Indiana State was looking to earn a series sweep over Creighton on Saturday night, after winning the first game between the two squads on January 2. However, the Sycamores (9-8, 4-3 MVC) could not overtake the Bluejays (14-3, 5-2 MVC) on their home court and suffered an 86-69 loss in front of 17,371 fans at the Qwest Center.

Creighton jumped out to an early 6-1 lead and later widened the advantage to 11-4 on a jumper by Cavel Witter. Gabe Moore then answered with a jumper to make the score 11-6, but Booker Woodfox connected from three-point range to give the Jays an eight-point lead at 14-6. ISU then cut the lead to five points at 16-11 on a Marico Stinson three-pointer with 14:54 left in the half.

The Bluejays then went on a 10-2 run to make the score 26-13 after Woodfox drained three-straight free throws after being fouled while attempting a three-pointer. That lead would eventually grow to 17 points at 32-15 with 6:27 left in the half after a Josh Dotzler layup. ISU clawed back and cut the lead to 11 points at 38-27 after another three-pointer by Stinson with 3:19 left in the half. However, that would be as close as the Sycamores would get and the Jays finished the half strong and took a 46-30 lead into the locker room at halftime.

After the half, the Jays widened their lead to 54-35 points at the 15:36 mark after another Woodfox three pointer. The Sycamores then fought back and cut that lead to 62-49 points at the 11:16 mark of the second half after Aaron Carter connected on a jumper.

The ISU comeback was thwarted by the Jays, who went on to extend their lead to 22 points at 79-57 on a jumper by P'Allen Stinnett with 5:33 left in the game. The Sycamores then went on a 10-2 run, highlighted by seven-straight points from Cole Holmstrom and capped off by a Carter three pointer, to cut the lead to 81-67 with 2:14 left in the game. That late push was not enough, though, and the Jays earned an 86-69 victory to even the season series with the Sycamores.

Stinson scored a game-high 23 points, including six treys, and added six rebounds and three steals to the lead the way for ISU. Holmstrom also finished in double figures for the Sycamores, as he scored 13 of his 15 points in the second half.

FACING OFF AGAINST A FAMILIAR FOE

When the Creighton Bluejays take to Nellie and John Wooden Court at the Hulman Center today, they will do so against an Indiana State team coached by one of Creighton's all-time best players. As a player, McKenna currently ranks 12th in Creighton history with exactly 1,500 career points. He remains ranked in CU's career top-10 lists in field goal attempts, free-throw percentage and assists. Two of his teams (1977-78 and 1980-81) reached the NCAA Tournament and McKenna was enshrined into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998 for his exploits. Following his playing career, McKenna returned to the sidelines as an assistant coach for nine seasons at his alma mater (1994-2001, 2005-07) before taking over the reigns at Indiana State.

RICHARD DOUBLES UP

Freshman Carl Richard put together the best game of his young career at Indiana State when the Sycamores needed it the most. On Sunday at UNI, the Chicago, Ill., native recorded the first double-double performance of his career with 15 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Richard's double-double was the first of the season for the Sycamores and the first for ISU since Feb. 27, 2008, when Jay Tunnell also posted a double-double against the Panthers at the McLeod Center with 12 points and 13 rebounds.

LEITNAKER EARNS FIRST CAREER START

Redshirt sophomore center Brant Leitnaker has battled injuries throughout his time at Indiana State and has played in just 18 games in three years on campus. However, his size in the post was needed against Northern Iowa on Sunday and the Lancaster, Ohio, native was put into the starting lineup for the first time in his career to match up with UNI big man Jordan Eglseider. Leitnaker scored the team's first two points of the game, which turned out to be his only of the contest, and grabbed a rebound in 14 minutes of action. In addition, he helped hold the 7-foot-1 Eglseider to just four points in 18 minutes of action after coming into the game averaging a team-high 12.6 per game.

SOMETHING ABOUT THE POWDER BLUE

This season marks the 30th anniversary of Indiana State's historic 1978-79 season that saw the Sycamores advance to the Final Four of the NCAA Tournament and eventually to the National Championship game. The Sycamores unveiled their throwback replica uniforms from that season on the road on Sunday at Northern Iowa and some of the magic may have rubbed off, as ISU won a thrilling Missouri Valley Conference opener 85-84 in double overtime over the Panthers. The Sycamores will continue to wear the jerseys throughout the season to commemorate the anniversary all season long.

McKENNA REMAINS UNBEATEN IN VALLEY OPENERS

In each of his two seasons on the bench at Indiana State, head coach Kevin McKenna's teams have opened Missouri Valley Conference play on the road. In those two contests, the Sycamores have earned big wins in both after the Sycamores defeated Northern Iowa in double overtime 85-84 on Sunday in Cedar Falls. Last season, ISU opened Valley play with a 70-56 win at Evansville on Dec. 29 to pick up its lone conference road win of the season.

DOUBLE OVERTIME... NO SWEAT

Indiana State's 85-84 double-overtime win at Northern Iowa was its second such win in two seasons. Last year, the Sycamores defeated Southern Illinois 64-62 in double overtime on Jan. 12 at the Hulman Center thanks to a 3-pointer by Marico Stinson.

INDIANA STATE BASKETBALL NOTES

THE MARSHALL PLAN IS IN EFFECT

Junior guard Harry Marshall made his return to the Indiana State lineup against No. 14 Purdue on Dec. 13 and since that time his presence has been very welcome for the Sycamores. In his first game back after sitting out the team's first eight games of the season, Marshall tallied 16 points and dished out six assists against the Boilermakers. He followed that up by scoring a game-high 18 points, including a 10-for-13 effort from the free throw line, in the team's win over DePauw. However, he saved his best performance for his fourth game of the year, as he scored a team-high 23 points against UNI to help the team to a thrilling double overtime victory. In his four games back, Marshall is averaging 16.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.2 assists per contest.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

The Sycamores have struggled getting rebounds at times throughout the season, but that was not the case in the team's last two victories. Indiana State won the battle on the boards at Northern Iowa on Sunday 37-35, which helped the team score 11 second-chance points. ISU also out-rebounded DePauw by a margin of 42-27, including a 30-18 difference on defensive rebounds. With that performance, it marked the second time this season the team had corralled 40 or more rebounds (40 at DePaul). In total, ISU has out-rebounded opponents twice this season and are 2-0 in those games.

THE FANTASTIC FOUR

The Sycamores have shared in the scoring duties through 13 games this season and that was very apparent in the team's double-overtime win at Northern Iowa. Four Sycamores scored in double figures, led by junior Harry Marshall's 23 points. Sophomore Aaron Carter chipped in 16 points, including two big 3-pointers in double overtime, while freshman Carl Richard recorded the first double-double of his career with 15 points and 11 rebounds. Senior Jay Tunnell rounded out the balanced scoring effort with 14 points in the victory for ISU. With those four players in double figures, it marked the fourth time this season that the Sycamores have achieved that feat.

JP FOR THREE

Redshirt freshman Jordan Printy had a breakout day against IUPUI at Consecro Fieldhouse, connecting on a career-high five three pointers to finish with a new career-high of 15 points. The Marion, Iowa, native was 5-for-7 from beyond the arch in the game and added two rebounds and a blocked shot in a career-high 25 minutes of action against the Jaguars. Printy's previous career high was eight points, which he set earlier this season against Murray State.

CUTTER OUT WITH ANKLE INJURY

Freshman point guard Tyler Cutter will miss four to five weeks with a severe ankle sprain which he suffered in practice prior to the team's game against IUPUI. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native played in 10 games for the Sycamores, starting in two of those contests. He was averaging 21.3 minutes per game for ISU and currently ranks second on the team with 28 assists. Cutter played a strong game against No. 11 Louisville, as he scored a career-high eight points in 24 minutes and followed that up by dishing out a career-high eight assists against Lamar to help the team win its first game of the season.

WHO NEEDS THE THREE?

Indiana State is averaging seven three-point baskets per game this season and are shooting 35.9 percent from long distance through 11 games. However, in the team's win over DePauw, the Sycamores were ice cold from three-point range going 0-for-10 against the Tigers. That snapped a streak of 252 consecutive games with at least one three-point field goal made. The last time the Sycamores failed to make a three-point field goal was on February 9, 2000, when the Sycamores shot 0-for-7 against UNI.

CRAWFORD RETURNS TO FORM

Junior transfer Josh Crawford averaged 14.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.5 blocks in his first two games in an ISU uniform. Over the next seven games, though, Crawford struggled to find his game and averaged just 2.6 points and 2.9 rebounds per game while blocking just eight shots. However, he broke out of that funk against DePauw with 10 points, six rebounds and three blocked shots in 12 minutes of action to help the Sycamores to their second win of the season. With that performance, Crawford is now averaging 5.7 points and 3.8 rebounds per game while adding 18 blocked shots.

TUNNELL PLAYS IN 100TH GAME OF CAREER AT ISU

Indiana State fields one of its youngest teams in years in 2008, but senior forward Jay Tunnell provides the team some much-needed leadership on and off the court. Against DePauw, Tunnell played in his 100th career game at Indiana State and finished with 10 points and five rebounds in 17 minutes of action. In those 100 games, the Topeka, Kan., native started in 94 games while averaging 8.9 points, 4.7 rebounds and 24.9 minutes per game for the Sycamores.

COMING THROUGH IN THE CLUTCH

Rashad Reed was Indiana State's leading scorer heading into the team's game against Lamar at the Marques Maybin Classic at Freedom Hall in Louisville, Ky. When the Sycamores needed a go-ahead basket late in the game against the Cardinals, they went to Reed who connected on a floater in the lane with 0.2 seconds to propel ISU to its first win of the season. Reed finished the game with 15 points and six rebounds for the Sycamores in the game and now leads the team with an average of 12.9 points per game in seven starts.

KENTUCKY BRINGS OUT THE BEST IN CUTTER, LEITNAKER

Freshman point guard Tyler Cutter and sophomore center Brant Leitnaker enjoyed playing over the weekend at the Marques Maybin Classic, as both set new career highs on the historic floor of Freedom Hall. Cutter played a strong game against No. 11 Louisville, as he scored a career-high eight points in 24 minutes of action. He followed that up by dishing out a career-high eight assists against Lamar to help the team win its first game of the season. Leitnaker also had a career effort against Louisville, as he scored a career-high nine points while tying his career high with five rebounds in 15 minutes of action against the Cardinals.

DIALED IN FROM LONG DISTANCE

Against Murray State, the Sycamores made a season-high 12 three-pointers score 36 of the team's 61 total points. Redshirt freshman Keenan Barlow led the way with a 3-for-4 effort to end up with a career-high 11 points, while fellow redshirt freshman Jordan Printy, senior Jay Tunnell, junior Rashad Reed and sophomore Aaron Carter each added two treys against the Racers.

HONORING A TRUE SYCAMORE LEGEND

Prior to the start of ISU's first exhibition game against Albion College, the floor at Hulman Center will officially be named the Nellie and John Wooden Court in honor of the legendary coach and his late wife, Nellie. Prior to achieving legendary success as the head coach at UCLA, Wooden began his collegiate coaching career and served two years as head men's basketball coach, baseball coach and athletics director at Indiana State from 1946 to 1948. While earning his master's degree at Indiana State, he compiled a 44-15 record as basketball coach while leading the Sycamores to post-season tournament appearances each year and two conference championships. In addition, coach Wooden will also be inducted into the Missouri Valley Conference Athletics Hall of Fame in March.

INDIANA STATE BASKETBALL NOTES

GAME 1 • INDIANA STATE AT NORTHERN ILLINOIS

DeKALB, Ill. – After playing two exhibition games, the Indiana State men's basketball team opened the regular season on Tuesday night at Northern Illinois. ISU (0-1) scored 79 points and had four players in double figures, but the duo of Mike DiNunno and Darion Anderson combined for 52 points to lead NIU (2-1) to an 86-79 victory at the Convocation Center.

NIU jumped out to an early 8-2 lead after a three-pointer by Anderson with 15:52 on the clock and another three by Anderson widened the NIU advantage to 10 points at 14-4 just a minute later.

ISU answered back with a 14-1 run to eventually take the lead back from the Huskies. Freshman Carl Richard and sophomore Aaron Carter then answered with back-to-back layups to cut the lead to one before a dunk by sophomore Isiah Martin gave the Sycamores the lead at 22-21 with 7:04 remaining in the half.

A free throw from Ante Dzepina and a jumper by Anderson gave the Huskies the lead back soon after, but a three-pointer by Carter knotted the game at 25-25 with just over five minutes left on the clock. Five straight points gave NIU the lead back at 30-25 and the Huskies maintained a slim lead over the final four and a half minutes of play to head into the locker room with a 38-33.

At the start of the second half, NIU jumped out to a quick 10-point lead at 45-35 after another three-pointer by DiNunno. The Sycamores later fought back with an 11-2 run to cut the lead to three at 53-50. The Huskies came out of the timeout and hit a quick shot, before Tunnell connected from three-point range to cut the lead to two at 55-53. NIU then went on a 15-3 run over the next seven minutes to widen the lead to 70-56. From there, the Huskies controlled the clock continued to make free throws and held on for an 86-79 victory.

Rashad Reed led the way for the Sycamores in his first official game with the team, scoring 21 points on 7-of-12 shooting including a 5-for-8 effort from three-point range.

GAME 2 • NORTH TEXAS AT INDIANA STATE

TERRE HAUTE, IND. – Indiana State (0-2) struggled to find its rhythm and could not cool off a hot shooting North Texas (3-1) team, dropping their second contest of the season 80-69 in the home opener.

It was a fast pace opening half of play with the score tied five times in the early going, the final time at 13 after ISU's Crawford connected from short range with 14:32 left. North Texas' Tramiel knocked down two free throws and added a lay-up with 9:53 left to give the Mean Green a 17-13 advantage.

After Carter banged one home from long distance to bring the Sycamores back to within one, North Texas scored four more points to take their largest lead at 22-16. Crawford led an Indiana State rally late in the half scoring seven of ISU's final 11 points. Richard scored two on a short jumper with 1:12 left and Jay Tunnell scored his first points of the game on two free throws with 44 seconds left as the Sycamores fought back to trail 33-31 at the break.

Richard tied the game up at the start of the second half and a Crawford three-pointer gave ISU their first lead since early in the game, 38-35. Indiana State was able to open their biggest lead of the game at 46-42 after an Isiah Martin bucket with 13:31 left.

North Texas used a 13-2 run over the next three minutes to move in front 55-48 with 10 minutes left in the contest. The Sycamores were down 57-53 after two Richard free throws but the Mean Machine ran off 10 straight points in taking a 67-53 advantage.

Richard stopped the run with a bucket off an offensive rebound with 4:06 left, was fouled, and made the free throw to cut the North Texas lead to 67-56. Tunnell scored his first field goal of the game with 2:23 left, a three-pointer from the top of the key that cut the ISU deficit to 67-59.

North Texas held off the Sycamores in the final two minutes of the game, making 13-of-14 free throws in holding on to post their third win of the season.

Carl Richard led four Sycamores into double figures with 17 points. Josh Crawford added 16 points, Aaron Carter 12 and Rashad Reed. Carter paced the Sycamores in rebounding with nine while Crawford had two blocks.

INDIANA STATE BASKETBALL NOTES

GAME 3 • MURRAY STATE AT INDIANA STATE

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. - Indiana State was looking for its first win of the 2008-09 season on Wednesday night in a match-up against Ohio Valley Conference foe Murray State. The Sycamores (0-3) held an eight-point lead during the first half and went into the locker room with a two-point lead at halftime, but they could not reign in the Racers (3-1) in the second half and dropped a 67-61 decision at the Hulman Center.

Senior Jay Tunnell's layup at the 10:30 mark in the first half gave ISU its biggest lead of the game at 24-16, before two free throws by MSU's Isacc Miles and one by Ivan Aska cut the lead to five at 24-19 with 9:10 remaining on the clock. Aaron Carter then answered with his second trey to widen the lead back to eight points with 8:00 remaining. The Racers then went on a 7-0 run to cut the lead to one at 27-26, but a layup by sophomore Isiah Martin and a three-pointer from redshirt freshman Jordan Printy extended the lead back to six at 32-26 in favor of the Sycamores.

Two-straight jumpers by Thomas cut the lead the two points a minute later for the Racers, before a three-pointer by Tunnell made the score 35-30 with 33 seconds left on the clock. The Racers then went down the floor and Thomas drained a trey with five seconds remaining to cut the ISU lead to 35-33 at the half.

ISU held the lead for the first two and a half minutes of the second half before Thomas hit another three-pointer to tie the game at 37-37 with 16:02 on the clock. MSU scored the next six straight points to take a six point lead at 43-37, before a jumper by Rashad Reed and a three-pointer by Barlow cut the lead to just one at 43-42 at the 13:36 mark.

Murray led by fourth points at 61-57 with 2:48 remaining, before a jumper by freshman Carl Richard cut the lead to two at 61-59 with just over a minute remaining. ISU would never get close from there, as the Racers got a jumper from Miles and six free throws over the last minute to secure the 67-61 victory.

Tunnell led the way for the Sycamores with 12 points and seven rebounds in the defeat, while Barlow recorded a career-high 11 points and five rebounds in the loss for ISU. Carter also finished in double figures with 10 points to go along with three assists. Thomas led all scorers with 22 points on 8-for-15 shooting, including a 4-for-6 effort from three-point range.

GAME 4 • INDIANA STATE AT DePAUL

ROSEMONT, Ill. - The first half of Saturday's game basketball game between Indiana State and DePaul was dominated by the Blue Demons, who held a 39-19 lead at the intermission. The Sycamores (0-4) fought back in the second half though and outscored DePaul (0-4) by a margin of 51-36, but they could not pull out the dramatic come-from-behind victory and fell by a score of 75-70 at the Allstate Arena.

ISU started the game hot, as Jay Tunnell converted on a traditional three-point play and then hit two free throws to put the Sycamores up 5-0 early. From there, though, it was DePaul as the Blue Demons ripped off 14 straight points before a Carl Richard jumper stopped the bleeding for the Sycamores with the score at 14-7 with 11:29 remaining in the half.

DePaul then went on a torrid 18-2 run to extend the lead to 32-9 after a three-pointer by Devin Hill before a jumper by Rashad Reed cut the lead to 32-11. Tunnell would then add a jumper of his own to make the score 32-13, before back-to-back dunks by Dar Tucker widened the DePaul lead to 34-13 with 3:37 remaining in the half. Two free throws by Aaron Carter then cut the lead to 19 points at 36-17 before a free throw by Mac Koshwal and two free throws by Michael Bizoukas put the lead back to 22 points at 39-17. A layup with 18 seconds left by Brant Leitnaker made the score 39-19 in favor of the Blue Demons at the half.

At the start of the second half, the Sycamores looked like a new team and the DePaul double-digit advantage quickly dwindled. Back-to-back three-pointers by Reed and Carter cut the lead to 14 points just over a minute into the half before DePaul answered with a three-point play in the paint by Matija Poscic. Josh Crawford then answered by connecting from long distance to cut the lead back to 14 and back-to-back jumpers by Tunnell and Reed cut the lead to 10 with 17:03 left on the clock.

The Sycamores then chipped away at the lead with some strong free throw shooting as Carter (3-for-3), Tyler Cutter (2-for-2) and Crawford (2-for-2) cut the lead to five points at 65-60 with just under three minutes remaining. After a free throw by Tucker made the score 66-60, a jumper from Richard and a jumper by Carter cut the lead to just two points at 66-64 with 1:49 left in the game. A layup from Crawford cut the lead to three points at 73-70 with three seconds remaining, but Tucker was fouled and made both of his free throws to give DePaul the 75-70 victory.

INDIANA STATE BASKETBALL NOTES

GAME 5 - ARKANSAS STATE AT INDIANA STATE

TERRE HAUTE, IND. – Indiana State returned home on Monday night in search of its first victory of the 2008-09 season against Sun Belt Conference opponent Arkansas State. The Sycamores (0-5) went through ups and downs throughout the game, but fell just short of victory and dropped a 56-54 decision to the visiting Red Wolves (5-1) on Nellie and John Wooden Court at the Hulman Center.

The Sycamores dominated the early going, scoring the game's first seven points. Junior Rashad Reed connected from three-point range with 16:23 on the clock to give ISU the early lead, which later grew to 17-4 after a layup by senior Jay Tunnell. The ISU lead then widened to 20-7 lead after Reed's second three-pointer with 8:22 left in the first half. The Red Wolves then outscored the Sycamores by a margin of 12-2 over the next seven minutes to get back into the game at 22-19 with 1:43 left. Tunnell then converted on a traditional three-point play to boost the ISU lead to 25-19, but Arkansas State scored the final four points of the half to trail 25-23 at the break.

The Red Wolves came out of the locker room determined and took the lead early in the second half as JeJuan Brown scored six-straight points to give ASU a 29-25 advantage four minutes into the final half. A free throw by Isiah Martin and a Tyler Cutter try then moved Indiana State to within two points at 31-29 with 14:19 remaining on the clock.

The Sycamores trailed 35-29 with just over 12 minutes remaining, but fought back into the contest over the next couple minutes. Jordan Printy's second trey of the game at the 7:04 mark then tied the game at 41-41 with 7:04 left on the clock. Arkansas State's Brandon Ayers came right back and knocked down back-to-back threes to give the Red Wolves the momentum and a 47-41 lead. Indiana State came back again thanks to five points from Tunnell and two free throws each from Josh Crawford and Cutter to cut the deficit to 51-50 with 3:11 remaining in the contest. ASU's Boone then made 1-of-2 free throws, but they were answered by a pair of charity tosses by ISU's Carl Richard which tied the game at 52-52 with 2:35 left on the clock.

With the score tied at 54-54, Boone then came down the floor and put the Red Wolves up 56-54 with 43 seconds left with a 15-footer that turned out to be the game winner.

GAME 6 - INDIANA STATE AT No. 11 LOUISVILLE

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – Indiana State played the first of three games in three days at the Marques Maybin Classic on Saturday against the host No. 11-ranked Louisville. The Sycamores (0-6) shot just 28 percent from the field throughout the game and the Cardinals (3-1) forced 23 ISU turnovers that led to 32 points on way to an 83-43 victory in front of 18,924 fans at historic Freedom Hall.

The Cardinals jumped out to a 21-3 with just over 13 minutes remaining before Tyler Cutter nailed a jumper at the 11:22 mark to give the Sycamores their first field goal since Jay Tunnell's make earlier in the half to cut the lead to 21-5. A layup by Edgar Sosa later put the Cardinals up by 20 points at 25-5, before back-to-back layups by Tunnell and Brant Leitnaker cut the lead to 25-9 with 8:31 left in the half.

Louisville scored the next 13 straight points to take a 38-9 lead with just over three minutes remaining, before a three-pointer by Keenan Barlow snapped the Louisville scoring streak and made the score 38-12 with 2:32 remaining in the half. Barlow later added two free throws to make the score 40-14 in favor of the Cardinals and Tunnell added another layup with 55 seconds left in the half to make the score 43-16. A three-pointer by Will Scott and a dunk by Earl Clark then made the score 48-16 with 15 seconds remaining before a free throw by Cutter brought the score to 48-17 with nine seconds left. A layup by Sosa with five seconds remaining then made the score 50-17 at halftime.

Rashad Reed nailed a three-pointer for the Sycamores on their first possession of the second half and Leitnaker added four straight points to make the score 53-24 just over two minutes into the second half. The Cardinals then went on a 14-4 run to extend their lead to 67-28.

After an ISU bucket Louisville scored the next ten points, capped off by a jumper from Williams, to take their largest lead of the game at 77-30 with 6:53 left in the game. The Sycamores then answered with five straight points on a layup by Jordan Printy and a three-pointer from Tunnell to make the score 78-35, but the Cardinals remained focused and maintained their lead over the final four minutes to secure an 83-43 win.

INDIANA STATE BASKETBALL NOTES

GAME 7 • INDIANA STATE VS. LAMAR

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – Rashad Reed was Indiana State's leading scorer heading into Sunday's game against Lamar. When the Sycamores (1-6) needed a go-ahead basket late in the game against the Cardinals (6-2), they went to Reed who connected on a floater in the lane with 0.2 seconds to propel ISU to its first win of the season in the fourth game of the Marques Maybin Classic at Freedom Hall.

The Sycamores jumped out to an early 9-2 lead after a thunderous dunk by Josh Crawford with 13:57 left on the clock in the first half. The Cardinals came right back though on a 7-0 run, capped off by a jumper by Anthony Miles, to tie the game at 9-9 at the 12:29 mark. ISU got the lead back on its next possession on a three pointer by Reed and later extended that lead to six points at 19-13 after two free throws from Jay Tunnell.

After Lamar fought back to bring the game within three points at 22-19, Jordan Printy nailed a three-pointer with 6:18 left on the clock to put the Sycamores back up by six points at 25-19. However, Lamar went on a 9-2 run and took its second lead of the game at 28-27 after a jumper by Tristan Worrell. With Lamar leading 40-36 with 1:18 remaining, Isiah Martin then took over for the Sycamores and converted on back-to-back buckets to tie the game at 40-40 with 40 seconds left in the half, which is where the score would stay as both teams headed into the locker room at halftime.

Lamar came out of the break on a 6-0 run to take a 46-40 lead at the 18:04 mark of the second half, but a layup from Tunnell stopped the run and brought the Sycamores back within four. The Lamar lead would eventually grow to eight points at 50-42 after a jumper by Jay Brown with just under 16 minutes left in the game. Lamar played consistently over the next nine minutes of action and led by eight points at 62-54 after a jumper by Ashton Hall with 7:10 left in the game.

Tunnell made the first of two free throws with 16 seconds left, but missed the second to give ISU just a two-point lead at 66-64. Lamar's Kenny Dawkins then tied the game with two free throws with nine seconds left after being fouled by Tunnell, his fifth of the game. GAME 8 • OHIO VS. INDIANA STATE

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – Coming off its first win of the season, Indiana State was looking to win its second game in a row when it faced off against Mid-American Conference foe Ohio in the final game for the Sycamores at the Marques Maybin Classic. The game was close for the first half, but the Bobcats (4-3) out-shot the Sycamores (1-7) in the second half 46.7 percent to 29.2 percent to pick up a 62-50 win over at Freedom Hall.

ISU jumped out to an early 5-2 lead after a three-pointer by Aaron Carter and later extended that lead to 7-4 after a layup by Jay Tunnell. After the Bobcats tied the game at 7-7 at the 16:04 mark, a three-pointer from Tunnell put ISU back up 10-7 with 15:10 left on the clock. That lead would eventually grow to 16-13 after a layup by Carl Richard with 8:37 remaining in the half. The Bobcats then went on a 7-0 run, capped off by a three-pointer by Steven Coleman, to take a 20-16 lead with just over four minutes left in the half.

Tunnell quickly answered with a three-pointer of his own to bring the Sycamores within one, but a three-pointer by Justin Orr put the Bobcats back up by four points at 23-19. Tunnell then added a dunk to cut the deficit to two at 23-21 with 2:59 left in the half for ISU. Ohio would hold on to that lead for the remainder of the half, with two free throws from Tyler Cutter cutting the lead to just two points at the half for the Sycamores at 27-25.

Carter scored the first points out of the break and gave ISU a 28-27 lead by connecting from three-point range at the 18:12 mark of the second half. However, those would be the last points for the Sycamores over the next five and a half minutes as the Bobcats put together a 12-0 run to take back the lead at 39-28. Two three-pointers by Tommy Freeman and four free throws from Jerome Tillman sparked the run and gave Ohio strong momentum for the rest of the half.

Ohio then went on a 7-0 run to extend the lead to 54-41 with 6:02 left in the game, before another trey by Carter and two free throws from Tunnell cut the Ohio lead to 54-46 at the 5:09 mark. Ohio then strung together an 8-0 run, capped off by a dunk from Coleman, to take its largest lead of the game at 62-46 with 1:12 remaining in the game. A layup from Tunnell and two free throws from Carter in the last minute were not enough and the Bobcats earned a 62-50 win over the Sycamores.

INDIANA STATE BASKETBALL NOTES

GAME 9 • INDIANA STATE AT PURDUE

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. – Indiana State was up against its second nationally-ranked opponent of the week on Saturday when the team traveled to near-by West Lafayette to face off against No. 14 ranked Purdue. The Sycamores (1-8) played tough against their Big Ten Conference counterparts, but 22 points off ISU turnovers helped the Boilermakers (8-2) to a 76-62 win in front of a loud crowd at Mackey Arena.

Purdue held an early 5-2 lead before a three pointer by Rashad Reed tied up the game at 5-5 just under three minutes into the game. The Boilermakers then answered with a three of their own from E'Twaun Moore to take an 8-5 lead, but a jumper from Jay Tunnell and another three from Reed put the Sycamores up 10-8 at the 15:19 mark of the first half.

ISU maintained a slim lead over the next three minutes of play, eventually taking a 20-17 lead on a jumper from Tyler Cutter. Lewis Jackson then made a bucket for Purdue to cut the lead to one, before he converted on a traditional three-point play to give his team the lead back at 22-20 with 9:34 left in the half.

A three-pointer from Robbie Hummel then put Purdue up 25-20, before two free throws from Harry Marshall cut the lead back to three. The Boilermakers would then jump out to a 28-22 lead, before a jumper from Aaron Carter cut the lead back to four points. That lead would eventually grow to 35-27 after a free throw by Moore, before a three-pointer by Jordan Printy cut the lead back to five points at 35-30 with 1:14 left in the half. A jumper from Hummel with 50 seconds remaining would then give Purdue a 37-30 advantage, which is where the score stayed until halftime.

ISU came out of the locker room at the half and scored the first four points of the half. Tunnell made two quick buckets to cut the Purdue lead to 37-34 just a minute in. However, those would be the last points for ISU over the next eight minutes, as Purdue went on a 13-0 run to widen the lead to 50-34.

Purdue controlled for the remainder of the half and eventually widened its lead to 69-50 with 3:45 left in the game on a bucket by JaJuan Johnson. Tunnell knocked down a three-pointer to keep the Sycamores in the game and cut the lead to nine at 71-62 with 1:20 remaining.

From there, the Sycamores were forced to foul and the Boilermakers converted on five of their last foul shots to secure the 76-62 win.

GAME 10 • DEPAUW AT INDIANA STATE

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – Indiana State was hungry for a victory Saturday afternoon at the Hulman Center as they hosted DePauw on Nellie and John Wooden Court as part of the Sycamore Holiday Showcase. Although the Sycamores failed to convert a single three-point basket, a 42-27 advantage on the boards helped the Sycamores defeat the Tigers (5-4).

Senior Jay Tunnell, playing in the 100th game of his career at ISU, scored the first bucket of the afternoon on the Sycamores' opening possession when he tipped in his own shot. Sophomore Aaron Carter followed on the ensuing possession with a nifty slam dunk from the left baseline to help the Sycamores jump out to a quick 4-0 lead with 18:18 showing on the clock.

DePauw's Tony James made good on two layups within a one-minute span and Tom Callen dropped the first Tiger jump shot at 15:32 to tie the game for the first time at 6-6. The Tigers scored four straight points when Joe Bergfeld converted his layup attempt and then went 2-for-2 at the free-throw line less than a minute later putting the visiting Division III Tigers ahead 10-6.

In the next five minutes, the home squad outscored the Tigers 9-5 thanks to Crawford and Harry Marshall, who combined for seven of those nine points. The Tigers managed to pull within four with 1:14 remaining, but two free-throw baskets by Isiah Martin and a layup by Carter to end the half put the Sycamores back up by eight for a halftime score of 33-25.

DePauw remained undaunted coming into the second half fueled by a three-point basket just eight seconds in by Steve Lemasters, his second of the game. Lemasters later drained three consecutive three-point baskets to put the score at 39-36 in favor of the Sycamores with 12:42 on the clock. Two minutes later the Tigers found themselves behind by just one point after scoring five-straight points capped off by a Mike Moore jumper in the paint at 10:58 remaining in the game.

The Sycamores refused to give up the lead. Reed nailed both of his jumpers and Marshall went 8-for-10 at the free-throw line from that point on to help the home team obtain its largest lead of the game 58-46 with 3:46 remaining. Martin also chipped in five points to cushion the Sycamore lead. Although the Tigers pulled within four with 1:05 to go, the Sycamores held on for a 66-60 victory.

The Sycamores raced out of the gate to a quick 10-5 lead behind solid defensive play from Harry Marshall and Rashad Reed. Marshall capped off a 5-0 run with a driving lay-up off a steal by Reed just four minutes into the contest.

IUPUI failed to close the game within a point, 13-12, on a dunk by Robert Gleen, but Jordan Printy was on fire in the opening stanza and he hit his first 3-pointer to stretch the lead out to 16-12.

The Sycamore offense dried up over the next five minutes as IUPUI went on a 13-2 run which was capped by a triple from Alex Young as the Jaguars took a 25-18 lead. Printy answered with a 3-pointer of his own to make it 25-21, but a conventional 3-point play by Billy Pettiford made it 28-21.

After IUPUI's John Ashworth stretched the Jaguar advantage up to a first-half high of eight points, 31-23 on a triple with 2:26 on the clock, Printy finished off his first half scoring with his fourth 3-pointer of the half to make it 31-26. Robert Glenn closed out the scoring with 1:46 left before the break with a jumper that made it 33-26.

Printy was on fire in the first half, hitting 4-of-5 shots from 3-point range to lead the Sycamores with 12 points before the intermission.

The Sycamores trailed by 19 points in the second half at 54-35 with 7:46 left in the game.

ISU had back-to-back 3-pointers on the next two possessions to cut the IUPUI advantage down to 54-41, but that would be as close as ISU would get the rest of the way. The game ended with IUPUI ahead by its largest lead of the game, 62-41.

Printy added three more points in the second half to score a career-high 15 points. Rashad Reed added a trio of 3-pointers to score 11 points.

GAME 12 - INDIANA STATE AT NORTHERN IOWA

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa - The Missouri Valley Conference season opened up for Indiana State on Sunday at Northern Iowa and the game did not disappoint. The two squads needed two overtime periods to decide the outcome, but it was the Sycamores (3-9, 1-0 MVC) who pulled out the victory over the Panthers (6-6, 0-1 MVC) in dramatic fashion at the McLeod Center.

The win marked the second straight year in which the Sycamores opened Valley play with a win on the road, after defeating Evansville last year in the league opener for both schools. It was also the team's first double-overtime win in the last two seasons, after ISU defeated SIU at the Hulman Center 64-62 on Jan. 12.

Indiana State shot 64 percent from the field (16-for-25) and turned the ball over just three times compared to UNI's eight giveaways to take a 41-24 lead at halftime. The second half was a different story, as the Panthers turned the tide and outscored the Sycamores 41-24 to send the game to overtime.

Indiana State took the early lead in the first extra frame on a three-pointer by Tunnell, but Farokhmanesh answered with a bucket to make the score 68-67 with 3:22 remaining. Harry Marshall then hit a free throw to give ISU a 73-71 lead with 32 seconds remaining, before Kwadzo Ahelegbe scored on a layup with 19 seconds left to knot the score at 73-73. Marshall had a good look at the game-winner with two seconds left, but the shot didn't fall and the game went into the second overtime period.

Ahelegbe gave UNI a quick lead on a layup just 20 seconds into the second extra frame and added another layup at the 3:42 mark to put the Panthers up 77-73. After a free throw from Marshall cut the lead to three, Aaron Carter nailed a three-pointer to tie the score at 77-77. Ahelegbe then added two more free throws to give UNI a two-point advantage, before Carter hit another three-pointer, was fouled and hit his free throw to convert the four-point play and give ISU an 81-79 lead with just 54 seconds left.

Two free throws from Brown knotted the score for the sixth time in the game, but Marshall was clutch and added two free throws of his own with 17 seconds remaining to put the Sycamores back up 83-81. After an Ahelegbe miss, Reed connected on two free throws with five seconds left to put ISU up 85-81 with five seconds left. Ahelegbe then hit a three-pointer with 0.4 seconds left to cut the lead to one and Marshall was immediately fouled to give ISU the ball back for the win.
