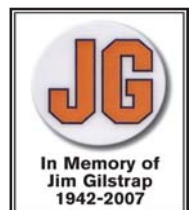

THEME: Oregon State enters Saturday's Homecoming game at No. 13 USC looking for its fourth consecutive victory, which would match the longest streak in Mike Riley's tenure (twice in 2006 and in 2003). To earn that victory the Beavers will have to win in Los Angeles for the first time since 1960 and hand Trojans' head coach Pete Carroll his first-ever loss in November. USC is at home for the only time in a five-game stretch and faces possibly the most difficult schedule remaining in the conference -- at California, at Arizona State and vs. UCLA. Both the Beavers and Trojans remain in the hunt for the conference title, but neither can afford a loss. Oregon State also arrives in L.A. attempting for its fourth straight win over a top-25 team -- 2007 at No. 2 Cal, 2006 vs. No. 3 USC and at No. 24 Hawai'i. Depending on the outcome of other games, the winner could stand as high as tied for second in the league on Saturday night.

ON THE ROAD VS. TOP 25: A win Saturday against USC would signify a couple of big milestones for the Oregon State football program. The program has won a road game against a top-25 team each of the last three seasons (2005 at No. 18 Cal, 2006 at No. 24 Hawai'i and 2007 at No. 2 Cal), but has never won two true road games against nationally ranked opponents. Oregon State hasn't won back-to-back games vs. the Trojans since 1914 and '16 -- the first two games of the series. The OSU program also hasn't won in Los Angeles since 1960 -- 20 consecutive losses.

RILEY MATCHES RECORD: Head coach **Mike Riley** and former head coaches the late Tommy Prothro (1955-64) and the late Dee Andros (1965-75) are the only mentors in Or-



egon State history to post victories over top 25 teams in three consecutive years (nobody has done it four straight). Riley has wins in 2005 over No. 18 Cal, 2006 over No. 3 USC and No. 24 Hawai'i, and 2007 over No. 2 Cal. Prothro won games in 1962 over No. 12 Stanford and No. 19 West Virginia, in 1963 over No. 14 Baylor and in 1964 over No. 17 Oregon. Andros beat No. 18 Arizona State in 1969, No. 14 Oklahoma in 1970 and No. 11 ASU in 1971. Riley has in fact won four of his last seven games vs. top 25 foes.

LAST YEAR VS. TROY: In one of the most memorable games ever at Reser Stadium, Oregon State ended USC's 27-game Pac-10 Conference win streak with a 33-31 win on Oct. 28. **Sammie Stroughter** caught eight passes for 127 yards and scored on a 70-yard punt return to lead the Beavers. Defensive end **Jeff Van Orsow** deflected John David Booty's two-point conversion pass with seven seconds remaining to ensure the OSU win. The Beavers led by as much as 33-10 after an **Alexis Serna** field goal with 4:51 left in the third quarter, before USC rallied. The Trojans had four turnovers, compared to OSU's zero and actually outgained the Beavers 492-351. Beaver running back **Clinton Polk** started his only game of his OSU career to date, filling in for the injured **Yvenson Bernard**, and rushed for a game-high 100 yards.

THE RANKINGS: Oregon State appeared in this week's "also receiving votes (2)" category in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll and is No. 41 in the Bowl Championship Series. USC is No. 13 in the Associated Press Poll, No. 15 in USA Today and No. 19 in the BCS.

STAR OF THE WEEK: Senior placekicker **Alexis Serna** is one of three Lou Groza Award Stars of the Week after his performance in the win over Stanford. Serna was 3-for-3 for field goals and now has made six consecutive. He is the Pac-10 record holder for field goals with 72 and has made 127 consecutive extra point attempts -- 12 short of the conference mark. Serna won the Groza Award in 2005.

SUCCESSFUL ROAD GAMES: Oregon State has been successful of late on the road in Pac-10 action posting a 9-5 record since the start of the 2004 season. Only USC (12-3) has more away game victories in that same span -- one of its losses was at OSU last season, snapping the Trojans' 27-game conference win streak.

BIG CROWD? Oregon State could be playing before its largest crowd ever within Pac-10 action Saturday. If USC meets its home average of 86,897 at the Coliseum, it would be the sixth-largest audience to ever witness an OSU game. OSU and UCLA played before 86,000 in Tokyo in 1980. The largest ever to watch a game involving Oregon State was in 1986 at Michigan Stadium -- 104,741. If it's a sellout Saturday at the Coliseum (92,000), it would be the fourth-largest ever.

BOWL ELIGIBILITY: Oregon State needs one victory to become bowl eligible and likely play in its second consecutive postseason game and seventh in the last nine years. If Beaver head coach **Mike Riley** is involved in bowl games it is usually a good thing -- he's 3-0 as the head coach at OSU and 3-0 as the offensive coordinator at USC.

A LONG DAY FOR THE BACKS? Entering this week's action Oregon State and USC rank as the top two teams in the Pac-10 for rushing defense. The Beavers lead the nation allowing an average of 54.5 yards per game with California's Justin Forsett the only opposing back to reach triple figures against the Beavers (150). USC is second in the Pac-10 and seventh nationally allowing 78.9 yards. A huge part of OSU's rushing defense statistic is the 357 total yards lost by opponents via tackles-for-loss. That ranking will be tested this week as the Trojans are second in the conference for rushing at 190.9 yards.

TOTAL DEFENSE: Two of the most difficult teams to move the ball against in the Pac-10 will be featured at the Coliseum Saturday. USC leads the Pac-10 and is fourth in the nation allowing 263.0 yards per game, while OSU is second in the conference and 13th nationally giving up an average of 299.9 yards.

FOURTH AND.....: The Beavers have had tremendous success on fourth downs this season, converting a league-leading and tied for the third-best in the nation at 80 percent (8-10).

FIRST QUARTER BLITZ: Oregon State has outscored its opponents 92-6 in the first quarter this season and over the last 17 games has a margin of 172-30 in the opening period. No team in the BCS has allowed fewer first quarter points or has a wider point differential for the opening period. Field goals by Arizona and Cincinnati are the only points allowed in the first.

SACKS: Oregon State is the nation's leader for sacks per game at 4.25 and for yards lost via the sack with 263. The Beavers had a season-high eight against Arizona (allowed 22 for the season), which is more than five teams (Navy, Syracuse, Arkansas State, Toledo, Minnesota) have for the entire season.

OUT OF THE CELLAR: While the Beavers lead the nation for quarterback sacks they have been as low as last for lost turnovers, but that has changed over the last three games, and not so coincidentally the team is 3-0. The Beavers have lost three turnovers in its last three wins while forcing 10. OSU has forced 21 turnovers overall, the league's best and tied for 20th in the nation.

TURNOVER STORY -- THE POSITIVE: Over the last 44 games, Oregon State is 20-2 when committing fewer turnovers than its opponent, 3-14 when committing more turnovers and 3-2 when even. In its victories last season, Oregon State was plus-14 for turnover margin; in its losses minus-6.

THE DURABLE ONE: While there was some question last week whether starting right guard **Roy Schuening** would be able to play due to an illness, he did make his 45th consecutive start -- the second longest streak in OSU history (Richard Seigler, 2000-03, 48). If Schuening starts the final four games he would become the school's all-time leader for consecutive and overall starts with 49. Receiver **Anthony Brown** is also quietly moving up the list with 37 overall starts and would move into 10th place if he finishes out the season in that role.

STARTERS RETURNING: Oregon State is hopeful to have preseason All-America guard **Jeremy Perry** and left cornerback **Keenan Lewis** back for this week. Perry has been out since suffering a lower leg injury in the season opener and Lewis has been sidelined the last two games with a knee injury. Starting safety **Daniel Drayton** returned to the lineup last week after missing two games with a groin injury.

DEEP DEPTH CHART: Oregon State's depth chart on defense might be among the deepest in the nation. The Beavers routinely play 10 defensive linemen, eight linebackers and nine defensive backs. That depth has resulted in 11 players recording tackles-for-loss and eight individuals with sacks.

TOUGH TO CATCH: Oregon State is 38-6 when it leads after three quarters with **Mike Riley** as the head coach. Starting with the 2004 season, the Beavers are 24-2 (losses to LSU - 04 & UCLA - 07) when they head into the fourth quarter with the lead.

YOUNG GUYS: Oregon State has a wealth of experience in almost every area of the team, but a couple of true-freshmen who impressed in August have made people notice early in the season. Wide receiver **Darrell Catchings** has 24 receptions, including having the first touchdown of the season via the pass. Wide Receiver **James Rodgers** has made his presence known on rushing plays with 16 attempts for 264 yards -- although in reality he was on the end of two receptions that were credited for rushes. He does have six receptions as well. Freshman linebacker **Keith Pankey** (now jersey # 35) has been activated from redshirt status due to injuries on special teams and saw his first action at Arizona State.

REDSHIRTS: Oregon State may have among the most in terms of players redshirting in the Pac-10 this season with 29, plus an anticipated 30th with senior **Sammie Stroughter** applying for a medical redshirt. A host of those redshirts this season will be counted on to contribute next year as the Beavers currently routinely play 15 juniors and only five sophomores. The Beavers expect to be one of the younger teams in the conference in 2008.

"OLD" GUY: Senior defensive tackle **William 'Akau'ola Vea** is 27 years old, believed to be the third-oldest player in the Football Bowl Subdivision. Vea worked for FedEx for two years, then participated in a two-year LDS Mission to the Dominican Republic before attending L.A. Harbor College. He and his wife, Elaine, have a son.

RAISING RESER: The second phase of the Reser Stadium expansion/remodel project was completed prior to the season opener, raising capacity to 45,674. The latest phase bowled in the south end zone and features the largest score/video screen (Dam Cam) in the Pac-10. The actual video portion of the board is 30x80 feet -- overall the board is 150 feet wide. The board is operated by a television production truck that is owned by OSU and is the same truck that operates the recently installed score/video board at Goss Stadium at Coleman Field (baseball). In addition, a "ribbon board" was erected on the exterior of the Valley Football Center. In all, over the last three years approximately \$110 million of improvements have been constructed in or around Reser Stadium.

THEY MIGHT BE TAILBACK U, BUT...: USC claims the "Tailback U" title in college football and rightfully so with four individuals in the top-10 for career rushing in the Pac-10 Conference. But, to the surprise of many, Oregon State is the only other program with more than one individual in the top-10 -- Ken Simonton (2nd/5,044 yards) and St. Louis Rams' Steven Jackson (10th/3,625 yards). Current Beaver **Yvenson Bernard** will likely unseat Jackson from the top 10. -- he currently is the conference's active leader with 3,462 yards and needs to average 41 yards per game to catch Jackson. The other programs represented in the top-10 are Arizona, UCLA, Stanford and Washington.

PURELY ACADEMIC: OSU is tied for second in the Pac-10 with the number of conference All-Academic selections over the last two seasons with 20. The Beavers have a plethora of players who are finishing their requirements for degrees this academic year -- **William 'Akau'ola Vea** (June/Const. Eng.); **Yvenson Bernard** (Dec./Merchandising Mgmt); **Anthony Brown** (June/Ethnic Studies); **Joel Cohen** (Dec./Liberal Studies); **Curtis Coker** (March/Sociology); **Kyle DeVan** (Dec./Business Adm.); **Naymon Frank** (Dec./Sociology); **Ryan Gunderson** (Dec./Const. Eng.); **Brandon Powers** (Dec./Business Adm./Comm.); **Roy Schuening** (March/Agriculture); **Alexis Serna** (Dec./History); **Dorian Smith** (June/Communication); **Sammie Stroughter** (March/Sociology); **Jeff Van Orsow** (Dec./Political Science)

TEAM CAPTAINS: For 2007, **Yvenson Bernard**, **Alan Darlin**, **Jeff Van Orsow**, **Ryan Gunderson**, **Derrick Doggett** and **Sammie Stroughter**. Bernard was also a co-team captain in 2006.

THE RULES HAVE CHANGED: Several rules changes were made during the offseason. The most noteworthy is that kickoffs have moved from the 35-yard-line to the 30 in an attempt to put the ball in play more. The play clock will be 15 seconds following a television time-out. Two rules from last season were rescinded -- on kickoffs the clock now starts when the ball is touched by the receiving team and on a change of possession the clock begins at the snap.

MIKE RILEY

Head coach **Mike Riley** is in his second stint as the coach of the Oregon State University football program. Riley concluded his sixth year overall leading the team to the title of the Sun Bowl. He has led the Beavers to three bowl games in four years in his second tenure, winning each. Oregon State's 10 wins in 2006 marked the second most in school history. Riley is the only coach to lead OSU to two winning marks in conference action since 1969.

Riley first arrived on campus in 1997 with the daunting task of rebuilding a program that had posted 26 consecutive losing seasons. While Riley did not produce a winning campaign his first two years, he set the foundation for a program that Dennis Erickson guided to the Fiesta, Oahu and Insight bowls. Riley nearly pushed the Beavers over the top in 1998, as the team lost three late season games by a combined nine points.

Riley left Oregon State after the 1998 season to pursue a unique opportunity to become the head coach of the National Football League's San Diego Chargers. He spent four years in the NFL, returning to Oregon State after a one-year stint as an assistant with the New Orleans Saints.

The 54-year-old coach calls Corvallis his hometown, although he was born in Wallace, Idaho. He grew up watching Beaver football, as his father Bud was an assistant coach for the program from 1965-72. Mike was a standout quarterback at Corvallis High School, leading the Spartans to the 1970 state title. Riley played college football in front of relatives at the University of Alabama and for coach Bear Bryant.
