- Penn State transfer Geno Thorpe is expected to be a big defensive presence at guard.
- The Bulls add two talented freshmen in Michael Bibby and Malik Fitts.

GRAY TO JERSEY

Last season, a lot of attention was given to the handful of USF players at the end of the bench wearing gray warm-ups. Coaches Larry Brown (SMU), Mick Cronin (Cincinnati) and Kelvin Sampson (Houston) each made reference to them in postgame press conference or to Orlando Antigua in passing. "After the game, I shook hands with more (USF) guys in gray warmups instead of green-and-white uniforms than I can remember," Brown said on Feb. 7. Those individuals that move from the bench to the court next season are freshman forward Tulio Da Silva, a four-star recruit who was a non-qualifier last season, sophomore guard Troy Holston Jr. who suffered a torn ACL in July 2015, junior forward Isiah Manderson, a transfer from Texas Tech after the 2015 fall semester and Geno Thorpe, a Penn State transfer.

TOUGH SCHEDULE LAST SEASON

USF played the toughest nonconference schedule of any team in the American Athletic Conference during the 2015-16 season with a ranking of 60. USF's overall strength of schedule was 59, second to UConn (36) in the conference. USF's schedule included nine teams with an RPI of 59 or better. The Bulls played five teams ranked in the top 40 RPI; No. 10 Kentucky, No. 14 SMU, No. 23 Seton Hall, No. 33 UConn and No. 36 George Washington.

RETURNING

USF returns six players who started at least eight games last season. The Bulls also get Troy Holston back after the sharp-shooter suffered a torn ACL in July of 2015 and missed all of last season. USF returns 56 percent of its 3-point field goals from last season. Jahmal McMurray's USF freshman record 73 led USF last season. The only other Bull to return with a 3-pointer made from last season is Bo Zeigler with one. USF will have to replace 60 percent of its scoring and 68 percent of its rebounding from last season.

ORLANDO ANTIGUA PERSONAL STORY

- The oldest of three children to Damaris Antigua, Orlando grew up in a Bronx apartment with no record of a father at home. His father, also named Orlando, popped in every few years.
- Orlando, just three years older than brother Oliver, was the father figure in the three bedroom apartment. He would discipline, cook and protect at the age of 10 in a house of four.
- On Halloween night in 1988, an argument broke out between some men in his neighborhood outside an electronics store and one of them pulled a gun. A .22 caliber bullet hit Orlando, an innocent bystander, near his left eye. Oliver took the call from the hospital. Due to the bullet's location (it never penetrated the skull), doctors deemed it safer to not to remove the bullet. He was back playing basketball two weeks after the incident. It was extracted during his junior year at Pitt. He still has the bullet and keeps it next to his championship rings.
