TEAM NOTES

- No. 19/20 Oklahoma rolled past UT Rio Grande Valley, 92-59, on Thursday night at Lloyd Noble Center. The Sooners improved to 6-2 this season, while UTRGV fell to 5-4. OU has won all five meetings against the Vaqueros in series history. Thursday's meeting was the first between the two teams since Nov. 26, 2010.
- Junior center Vionise Pierre-Louis picked up her fifth career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Sooners. Freshman guard Chelsea Dungee finished in double figures for the fourth straight game, recording 13 points on an efficient 5-of-8 shooting.
- The Sooners outscored UTRGV, 51-25, in the second half to pull away for the victory. Freshman center Nancy Mulkey sparked a 10-0 third-quarter run by scoring eight of her 11 career-best points in the frame. OU's 51 second-half points were the most by the Sooners since scoring 54 in final 20 minutes against Quinnipiac on March 21, 2015 in the NCAA Tournament.
- OU turned in its best offensive performance of the season scoring 92 points with a .545 (36-of-66) shooting percentage. OU's 92 points were the most by the Sooners against a non-conference opponent at home since defeating Bradley, 104-55, on Nov. 21, 2014.
- The Sooners recorded a season-high 12 fast break points, 28 points off of turnovers and 48 bench points.
- T'ona Edwards finished with a career-best 12 points and also set a career high with two made 3-pointers. The senior led OU in assists with six as the Sooners finished with a season-high 20 in the win.
- OU's starting lineup vs. UTRGV -- T'ona Edwards (G), Gioya Carter (G), Peyton Little (G), Chelsea Dungee (G), Vionise Pierre-Louis (C).
- Oklahoma head coach Sherri Coale is now 448-219 in her 21 seasons with the Sooners.

CHELSEA DUNGEE

- Finished with a career-high 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. The five field goals made were also a career high for the freshman.
- Has scored in doubles figures in each of the last four games, averaging 11.5 points per contest with a .500 shooting percentage (16-of-32).

T'ONA EDWARDS

- Recorded career highs in points scored (12) and made 3-pointers (2). Finished 4-of-5 from the field and 2-for-3 from beyond the arc.
- Tied a season-high with six assists and three steals against UT Rio Grande Valley.

MADDIE MANNING

- Finished with 12 points, five rebounds, three steals and two assists in the victory over UTRGV. Manning's 12-point performance marked her 26th double-figure scoring game as a Sooner (OU is 20-6 in such games).

NANCY MULKEY

- Earned first career double-figure scoring game with 11 points on 4-of-5 shooting in seven minutes of action. Mulkey scored eight of her 11 points in the third quarter to key a 10-0 OU run. The freshman added in two blocks and finished with one rebound.
- Finished with career highs in field goals made (4), field goal attempts (5) along with free throws made (3) and free throw attempts (4).

IJEOMA ODIMGBE

- Scored a career-high eight points, shooting 2-for-3 from the field and 4-of-4 from the free throw line. Odimgbe's four made free throws also tied a career high.

VIONISE PIERRE-LOUIS

- Recorded her fourth double-double of the season, finishing with 13 points and a team-high 10 rebounds.
- Moved into seventh place all-time at OU with 87 career blocks. The junior needs 13 more blocks to pass Angi Guffy (99, 1992-95) for sixth place on OU's blocked shots chart.
