IOWA STATE 92, OKLAHOMA 87 (DOUBLE OVERTIME) JANUARY 21, 2017 • POSTGAME NOTES

- Oklahoma (8-10, 2-5 Big 12) fell in double overtime to Iowa State (12-6, 4-3 Big 12), 92-87, on Saturday at Lloyd Noble Center. The Sooners, who defeated No. 7 West Virginia in overtime on Wednesday, played back-to-back overtime games for the first time since 1978.
 - Senior guard **Jordan Woodard** scored all 21 of his points after halftime, adding seven rebounds, five assists and three steals in 43 minutes of action. Woodard has scored 18 or more points after halftime in three consecutive games and combined for 39 points after halftime in OU's two games this week. Woodard has scored at least 20 points in each of his last five starts and is averaging 22.7 points since returning to OU's starting lineup on Jan. 14 vs. Texas Tech.
 - Woodard continued his climb up the program's all-time career scoring list, passing both Harvey Grant (1,391) and Steven Pledger (1,392). With 1,399 career points, Woodard ranks 14th in Oklahoma history and is 248 points shy from finishing his career in the top 10. The senior also surpassed Hollis Price on OU's career assists standings, moving into sixth with 464 career dimes.
 - Freshman forward **Kristian Doolittle** totaled 15 points and a career-high 15 rebounds for the first double-double of his collegiate career. He is the first Sooner to record 15 points and 15 boards since Ryan Spangler had 15 and 17 against Oklahoma State in 2014.
 - Fellow freshman **Kameron McGusty** finished his night one point shy of a career high with 19 points in a career-high 44 minutes. The guard has scored in double figures in six straight games and is averaging 14.1 points in Big 12 play.
 - Sophomore forward **Dante Buford** tied his season high of 10 points in 14 minutes. Sophomore guard **Rashard Odomes** totaled nine points, five boards and four assists and junior forward **Khadeem Lattin** added eight points, four rebounds and a pair of blocks.
 - The Sooners have a quick turnaround, hitting the floor again on Monday, Jan. 23 against Texas in Austin. The 8 p.m. CT contest will air on ESPN's Big Monday. Oklahoma owns an all-time record of 53-36 against the Longhorns while Texas holds a 21-17 advantage in games in Austin. OU is 6-4 against Texas under Lon Kruger and has won six of the last eight meetings. OU is 2-3 in Austin during the Kruger era.
