TEAM NOTES

- No. 19/20 Oklahoma rallied from a double-digit deficit for the second consecutive contest to defeat Texas Tech, 64-56, Saturday night inside United Supermarkets Arena. Down 11 at halftime, the Sooners rallied by outscoring Texas Tech, 42-23, in the second half. Oklahoma improved to 20-6 overall and 11-3 in Big 12 play, while Texas Tech fell to 11-13 and 3-10 against conference opponents. The win gave the Sooners their fourth straight victory.
- The victory gave Oklahoma its 13th straight win over Texas Tech and its 24th win in the last 25 meetings against the Lady Raiders. The 13 consecutive wins over Tech ranks as OU's longest active winning streak against a Division I opponent. OU is 34-22 all-time against Texas Tech and 14-13 in games played in Lubbock. The Sooners have won 10 out of the last 11 meetings against Texas Tech in Lubbock.
- OU now has won 20 games for the 15th time under head coach Sherri Coale. The Sooners have recorded 11 20-win seasons in the last 12 years.
- Four Sooners scored in double figures for the 11th time this season: Chelsea Dungee (18), Gabbi Ortiz (18), Gioya Carter (12) and Vionise Pierre-Louis (10). OU is 8-3 this season when at least four players scored 10-plus points in a single game.
- The Sooners improved to 13-0 this season and have earned 30 straight victories when they win both the rebounding and turnover battle against their competition. OU outrebounded the Lady Raiders, 46-45, and won the turnover battle by forcing 19 Tech turnovers. Oklahoma finished with a season-low seven turnovers.
- Oklahoma also improved to 17-0 this season when limiting opponents to 70 points or fewer.
- The Sooners finished with a .307 (23-of-75) field goal percentage, but hit eight 3-pointers and finished 10-for-11 (.909) at the free throw line. The Sooners forced 13 Texas Tech turnovers in the second half, while OU recorded just one miscue in the game's final 20 minutes.
- OU finished with free throw percentage above 80 percent for the seventh time in the last eight games. Gabbi Ortiz finished 6-of-6 at the free throw line against the Lady Raiders to lead the Sooners. OU is shooting .731 from the free throw line this year, which currently ranks seventh in OU single-season history.
- Oklahoma head coach Sherri Coale is now 462-223 in her 21 seasons with the Sooners. She is 223-121 against Big 12 teams during the regular season at OU. Coale is 29-12 against Texas Tech during her career with the Sooners.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

GIOYA CARTER

- Scored 12 points on 5-of-11 shooting from the floor and 2-of-4 from 3-point range. Carter has scored in double figures back-to-back games for the Sooners.
- Gave Oklahoma the lead for good with 7:18 to go in the fourth quarter by knocking down her second trey of the game.
- Has recorded eight double-digit scoring performances this season and the Sooners are 7-1 this year when the senior scores at least 10 points.

CHELSEA DUNGEE

- Scored a career high 18 points on 7-of-16 shooting from the field and 3-of-7 shooting from 3-point range in 37 minutes of action. Dungee has nine double-digit scoring games this season (OU is 6-3 in such games this season).
- Scored 16 of her 18 points in the second half to fuel OU's comeback bid. The freshman scored OU's first eight points in the third quarter and finished with 11 points in the frame.
- Gave OU its first lead of the game with a 3-pointer at the 1:59 mark in the third quarter. Dungee has also made a 3-pointer in three straight games.
- Finished with a season-best nine rebounds in 37 minutes of action for a near double-double. Dungee's three 3-pointers and seven made field goals also set career highs.
- Tied for the team lead with a career-high three steals.

GABBI ORTIZ

- Recorded a season-high 18 points and led the Sooners with three assists in 40 minutes of action. Ortiz's 18 points against Texas Tech are the second-most points she has scored in a single game during her OU career.
- Has nine double-digit scoring performances in 14 Big 12 games this season. The junior has scored 10-plus points 22 times during her OU career.
- Added seven rebounds and recorded three steals against Texas Tech. Ortiz' three steals Saturday night are the most swipes by the junior against a Big 12 foe this season.
- Led the Sooner in assists for the 14th time this season and for the 31st time during her OU career. The Sooners are 10-4 this year when Ortiz leads the team in assists.
- Is shooting .885 (23-of-26) from the free throw line over the last three games. During that stretch, Ortiz is averaging 14.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game.

VIONISE PIERRE-LOUIS

- Picked up her second straight double-double with 10 points and a team-high 14 rebounds in 31 minutes of action. Pierre-Louis leads the Sooners with eight double-doubles this season.
- Recorded 14 rebounds, her second-highest total against a Big 12 opponent this season. The junior has led the Sooners in rebounding 16 times this year (OU is 13-3 in such games).
- Added one block against Texas Tech and now has 119 rejections during her OU career. Pierre-Louis needs four more blocks to pass former Sooner Ashley Paris (122, 2006-09) for fourth place in school history.

DERICA WYATT

- Hit a 3-pointer for the second straight game with triple off the bench at the 3:12 mark in the first quarter. Wyatt has 103 career 3-pointers a Sooner.
