TEAM NOTES

- No. 16/19 Oklahoma fell 103-64 to No. 2/3 Baylor on Monday in the final regular season game of the year inside Lloyd Noble Center. The Sooners dropped to 22-8 overall and 13-5 in Big 12 play, while Baylor improved to 28-2 and 17-1 against league foes. The loss snapped OU's 10-game winning streak at home.
- The Sooners finished the regular season with a 14-2 record at home and an 8-1 mark against league foes at Lloyd Noble Center. OU's 14 home wins are tied for the second-most in the Sherri Coale era.
- OU started its five seniors (Gioya Carter, T'ona Edwards, Shaya Kellogg, Peyton Little and Derica Wyatt) on Monday night against Baylor. The start was Wyatt's first of the season, while Shaya Kellogg made her first career start.
- Six different Sooners hit at least one 3-pointer in the game as OU made eight treys in the game. OU's 194 3-pointers this year ranks as the ninth-most by a team in single-season history.
- Gioya Carter and Maddie Manning led the Sooners with 11 points apiece. Manning has scored in double figures 18 times this season, while Carter now has 10 double-digit scoring games this year.
- T'ona Edwards set a career high with six steals and added in nine points. Making her first start since Dec. 21, Edwards played 24 minutes and collected four rebounds.
- Shaya Kellogg set career highs with eight points and knocked down two 3-pointers. The senior made her first career start in Monday night's game versus Baylor.
- Derica Wyatt recorded a season high with a pair of 3-pointers and had a season-best seven points versus Baylor.
- Peyton Little moved into 28th place on OU's all-time scoring list and has scored 1,150 points during her career as a Sooner.
- OU head coach Sherri Coale is 464-225 in her 21 seasons at Oklahoma and is 225-113 against Big 12 foes during the regular season.
- Oklahoma will be the No. 3 seed in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championships and take on No. 6 seed West Virginia on Saturday at 8:30 p.m. CT inside Chesapeake Energy Arena in Oklahoma City, Okla.
