## KANSAS 73, OKLAHOMA 63 FEB. 27, 2017 • POSTGAME NOTES

---

- Oklahoma (10-19, 4-13 Big 12) fell to No. 1/1 Kansas (27-3, 15-2 Big 12) on Monday, 73-63, at Allen Fieldhouse. The Sooners led for over 25 minutes of the night, but a late push by the top-ranked Jayhawks halted OU's upset effort.

- The two teams entered halftime tied at 28. The Jayhawks have been held to 28 points or less in the first half just three times this season, including twice against the Sooners. Oklahoma held the Jayhawks to a season-low 27 points in the first half of the previous meeting on Jan. 10 in Norman.

- The Sooners forced 12 Jayhawk turnovers in the first half – the most by a Sooner opponent in an opening period this season. Kansas turned the ball over a total of 19 times in the game, which is the highest number of miscues by a Big 12 opponent. OU totaled 10 steals - including four from Kameron McGusty.

- Oklahoma was led by a combined 26 points from the freshman duo of guard Kameron McGusty and forward Kristian Doolittle. McGusty paced the Sooners with 14 points, two rebounds and four steals. The freshman has scored at least 10 points in 16 of his last 17 contests. Doolittle produced 12 points and five rebounds.

- Coming off his second double-double of the season on Saturday, junior forward Khadeem Lattin tallied 12 points on 4-of-7 shooting with six boards and a pair of blocks.

- Oklahoma pulled down 13 offensive boards and converted 15 second chance points.

- The Sooners close out the 2016-17 regular season at home against TCU on Saturday, March 4 at 2 p.m. CT on ESPNEWS. The final home game will also be senior night - honoring OU seniors C.J. Cole, Daniel Harper and Jordan Woodard. Tickets start at just \$10 for adults and \$5 for youth.

- Oklahoma owns an 18-3 all-time record against the Horned Frogs and has won 10 of the last 12 meetings. The Sooners are 7-2 against TCU since the Frogs joined the Big 12 in 2012-13. OU has never lost to the Horned Frogs in Norman, boasting a perfect 9-0 record.

- The Horned Frogs snapped a six-game losing streak in the all-time series by winning the first matchup of the season, 60-57, in Fort Worth on Jan. 3. The Sooners led for over 35 minutes in their second true road game of the year, but the Horned Frogs used a 12-0 run late in the contest to come back and win.
